




#### TODAY'S MEETING


to be made quickly.



racing a few seasons ago, and Aberdeenshire's Harvey Gillanders who has been up near the top of the tree for the past few seasons but has never actually won the championship. His mid-season performance was such that he challenged Binnie closely and they still have it all to win in the next three rounds. In amongst them, however, is a young man who has truly hit motor racing in Britain by storm, seventeen-year-old Alan McNish from Dumfries who came from kart racing, where he was a national champion, into cars this year and has been probably the most successful Scottish driver ever to compete in a National Formula Ford championship. Sadly, as he had not reached his seventeenth birthday until five rounds into the championship had gone, he really had no chance but he has made everyone down south sit up and take notice. It will be interesting to see how he gets on at Ingliston today as this will only be his second race on his home circuit.

In the larger class for the Shell Oils FF2000 cars there is another battle going on between two old rivals, Tom Brown, a former Champion and Stewart Roden, the reigning Champion, both of whom are racing Reynards They will be challenged as usual by Cameron Binnie who is also contesting this championship. But the real threat comes from the Ecurie Ecosse driver David Leslie driving the works Swift and he could hold the trump card if he wins the race and Roden manages to force Brown down to third place; but Brown is a very hard man to beat at Ingliston as his five Formula Ford championships attest.


Today's Meeting — continued


