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

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

THE JOYS OF SPRING

Hopefully not too optimistic a title, but the weather three weeks ago helped to bring the winter break in motor racing to a welcome end in the best possible manner. Dry track and sunshine to make even the most hungover marshal smile and the sixteenth season at Ingliston was well under way. With a bit of luck we'll have blue skies again for this "extra" April meeting, but if you're reading this under an umbrella then don't forget that racing in the wet can be interesting to say the least.

After their chance at the last outing to try out the new line at the hairpin, the new one-way system in the paddock (a challenge in itself) and of course newly prepared cars, today's Adam Wylie Trophy Race Meeting gives the competitors the opportunity to add to points scored in the various Championships or to make their first claim to places in the Tables and in general to embark on serious competition.

Serious competition is certainly to be found in the first race of the day, the Ingliston "Cheaper Racing" Challenge Race. For any spectator who thinks that racing at Ingliston is noisy, or uses up too much petrol, or is governed by too many safety regulations, this is the race to dumbfound all the critics (not to mention the marshals and even competitors). Twenty-teams of intrepid drivers and their mechanics will take to the track for a bicycle relay race. This will include a Le Mans start by the drivers in front of the main grandstand who will then complete one lap of the full circuit (hopefully before nightfall) before handing over the controls of their highly tuned machines to their mechanics to complete the final lap. As all the bicycles should be of similar specification, subject always to last minute modifications, some nailbiting handlebar to handlebar racing is in prospect. Scotcircuits Chairman Graham Hamilton, however, is confident that he has finally devised a race which he can win, but who knows. . . .

After the bike race the drivers return to the Paddock and back to more familiar Ingliston racing. Event 2 is the Laidlaw Trophy Formula Ford 1600 Race which as always looks like providing close entertaining sport with the now familiar incentive of places in Event 6, the Shell Championship Race, for the first four cars to finish, where they will join the fastest 12 competitors from practice. This means that a competitor who fails to make the grid for Event 6

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

As well as the Shell Scottish Formula Ford Championship, today's race counts towards the Laidlaw Formula Ford North British Championship and to add spice to the pot, the leader of that championship at the date of closing entries, Eric Horsfield (59) makes the trip over the Border to enter the fray.

After the first Formula Ford Race come the two heats in the Grand Touring Class. The first of these features the heavy machinery in the two classes over 1000 c.c. Following the somewhat experimental coupling of the over 1500s with the fastest up to 1000s on April 6th, the entry list at this meeting has enabled the more traditional pairing of classes today with the 1001-1500 c.c. cars running along with the over 1500 c.c. models. Dougal Niven (101) in the monster Beetle had things all his own way on the last occasion but watch out this time for Laurence Jacobsen (104) with his two-litre Imp which should be making its Ingliston race debut. Laurence will no doubt be hoping to set the heather on fire this time (as opposed to setting the car on fire as happened on its previous outing!). Steve Buxton's immaculate new Porsche 934 will also be there and this looks likely to be very rapid indeed, particularly once Steve becomes fully accustomed to it. Further Chevvy power will be in evidence in the form of Geoff Todd's Corvette (124) and the Escort of Murray Burgess (107), although unfortunately Walter Robertson and his D.F. VW are unlikely to be present, as even the "new" 55-foot wide hairpin proved to narrow for him in practice on April 6th and the car has not yet been fully restored to its original shape.

The under 1500 c.c. section of this race also looks interesting with Jimmy Pinkerton's Mini (128) coming up against (not literally we hopel) the Colvend Imp of Eric Paterson (126), Adrian Hamilton's Fiat Coupe (125) and a group of rapid Davrians in the hands of Brian Stevenson (144), Angus Young (145) and Ian Forrest (146). Ian Forrest appears again in Event 4, the up to 1000 c.c. class, this time in the Drambuie Scirocco (156). For those of you who think that this is





a misprint, we can assure you that that is what lan has entered and it will be interesting to see whether this will be the start of a new shape for Ingliston up to 1000 c.c. saloons. Determined to prove that it won't, will be Jim McGaughay (154), Bob Leckie (151), Ricky Gauld (162) and a host of others all with Imps, together with last meeting's class winner George Coghill (174) whose Davrian appears to be almost indecently quick and who was in overall second place in the Final. The fastest finishers from Events 3 and 4 go forward to Event 7, the Charlie Parker Trophy Race over 15 laps. We are delighted to welcome as sponsors to Ingliston Charlie Parker's, well-known purveyors of exotic cocktails in their luxurious bar and restaurant in George Street — if you have never paid it a visit then you now know where to go next evening out! As usual this season, his race counts in the McLaren of Broxburn/BL Cars Grand Touring Car Championship.

Event 5, the Adam Wylie Memorial Trophy Race for Clubmans Sports Cars, follows the two GT car heats and is the second round of the Lowland Tyres Championship for Clubmans Cars as well as being a counter towards the North British Clubmans Series. This race looks like an example of "Small is Beautiful" as, although the grid lacks large numbers, the quality of the entry is as high as ever. In Class A, battle will again be joined by Sandy Smith (24) and Kenny Allen (31), showing that sponsorship by the same company does not make the drivers any more considerate towards each other, with John Fyda (26) and John Mackie (30) in close attendance. In the smaller capacity Class B cars, Kevin McCormick and Jim Sword wil be trying hard to break the stranglehold of Clive Reeves (38).

The final race of the afternoon is the **Glasgow Herald Race** for Libre cars, a 15-lap event with last meeting's winner David Leslie and other top Formula Atlantic competitors Andy Barton and Bernie Hunter away south pursuing Hitachi Championship glory, the battle for Ingliston honours is likely to be between the March of Stu Lawson (14) and David Duffield's Ralt (20) with George McMillan (17) on their heels in a similar car to that of Stu Lawson. Graham Hamilton's Formula 1 Surtees TS20 will also be there (1) and it will be interesting to see whether he can pedal it as quickly as his bicycle in Event 1. In any event, the absence of Messrs Leslie, Barton and Hunter offers the others a great opportunity to gain polints in both the **Lothian Chemical Company Limited Series** and the North British Championship.


There is also the incentive for all drivers to have a go at the new lap records which have been created by the alteration in the nature of the circuit caused by the differences in width at the hairpin and the change of line into it. The surface at the hairpin caused a few problems at the last meeting, particularly for Dougal Niven whose Beetle sucked up a stone which actually cracked and made a hole in one of his pistons, but further resurfacing work has now been completed which should hold together.



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
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
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Andy Smith "flashes" in front of Mr. Demon Tweek himself, John Fyda.

Finally, a few words to wet your appetite for the next meeting on May 11th. This event should sound like a thunderstorm with some of the heaviest machinery in Britain already provisionally entered for a £1500 budget "Supercars" race. Quite apart from the prospect of our regular barnstormers, Doug Niven (5-litre VW Beetle), Walter Robertson (3-litre D.F. VW), Jain McLaren (3.4-litre Skoda Coupé) and Laurence Jacobsen (2-litre Imp) making certain not only that they'll be there (with that lucre at stake can you blame 'em) but also up in the crinklies , we have also stimulated one or two of the heavy brigade into making a final spurt to have their new monsters ready for action. Both George "Welly" Potter (7.2-litre Lotus Esprit) and Doug Emms (6.1-litre VW Fastback) have promised that, if they can finish the beasts off in time (and they're pulling out all the stops to do so) they'll be there, while Mick Hill has provisionally entered his now well sorted 7-litre Skoda. Although only 2 litres in capacity, Tony Sugden's Skoda can give them all a hard time on a circuit like Ingliston, and if our arithmetic's correct that's only half a grid and already it weighs in at nigh on 34 litres! Seems like a good excuse for buying a set of earplugs and heading for Ingliston on 11th May (also the day when the Northern Saloons head to Ingliston for a round of their North of England Series).

As always we are still looking for marshals to assist in running the meetings. Marshals in all departments would be welcomed and anyone interested in being more closely involved in the sport in this way should drop the Scottish Motor Racing Club a note at P.O. 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


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
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
