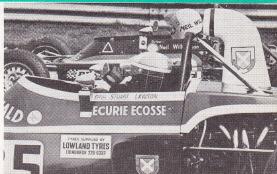

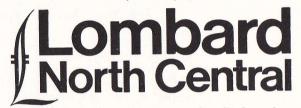

Breakfast will also be available in the Herdsman's Restaurant from 9.30 am. SMRC members have the facilities of the MacRobert Pavilion first floor where three-course meals will be available between 12 noon and 9.30 pm and where the Club Bar is open from 12.30 to 2.30 pm and from 6.30 to 9.30 pm.

Grandstand Tickets are on sale as follows: for the Highland Grandstand from the kiosk immediately behind the crossing point to the Central Enclosure in the centre of that stand; for the South Grandstand at the approach to that stand. Tickets will not be on sale before 10.30 am on race days.

### FOR YOUR DAY'S ENJOYMENT

For those of you who are wondering why today's Meeting is called "The Adam Wyllie Memorial Trophy Race Meeting" it is perhaps an opportune moment to cast our thoughts back to one of the leading names in Scottish motor sport in the last decade. Adam, a quiet and unassuming driver very much in the accepted Scottish racing driver mould, was for many years a well kent figure on the track, first with a Formula Junior Lotus and thereafter with a Formula 1 Lotus in which he did a season or two on the major circuits. Later in his career he teamed with Allan Rollinson under the banner of the Frank Lythgow Racing Team and, mounted on Lotus and Cooper F2 cars in 1964, both drivers did a full season. In the spring of 1965 they each took delivery of new F2 Brabhams and under Adam's management the team had numerous successes at the beginning of that year, amongst which was the winning of the first "Guards Trophy" race at Ingliston in May. In July of that year Adam was killed in an accident in practice for the Leimster Trophy Race at the Dunboyne circuit in Ireland. Scotland and motor sport in general thereby lost a first class driver and team manager. Since his death in 1965, Scotcircuits and the Scottish Motor Racing Club have endeavoured to keep his name alive and accordingly today's Race Meeting will be held in memory of Adam who was, after all, almost a founder member of the Border Motor Racing Club from which stemmed the Club organising today's Meeting.

And talking about organisation, may we please apologise most sincerely to the stomachs of all spectators and marshals (as also competitors) who braved the weather to attend the first Race Meeting of 1975 in April - regrettably all that can be said is that the catering at that meeting was little short of diabolical! The caterers have of course put forward their apologies and you may rest assured that the matter has been taken up at the very highest levels. Assurances have been received from the

caterers that matters will be greatly improved today and for the future and we sincerely hope that this will be the case. As will be appreciated, unless substantial improvement is evident, further consideration will have to be given by Scotcircuits Ltd to the catering question.

The April Race Meeting at Ingliston also saw the very first accident in the circuit's eleven year history involving spectators and this was, of course, extremely regrettable. It appears from the enquiry held by the organisers and promoters after the Meeting that a throttle spring on Doug Niven's Ford Boss Escort broke and dropped onto the engine where it caught behind the flange of the rockerbox. The coils of the spring then went "rigid" and the whole spring acted as a straight prop against the throttle linkage, jamming the throttle wide open with the result that Doug Niven came off the back straight at Southstand going full out and with no way at all of reducing the speed of the engine. The situation was the sort of which both organisers and drivers have nightmares since there was literally nothing that anyone could do to stop the accident happening. The car struck the barrier between Southstand and the toilet to the west of that Grandstand and, indeed, this barrier may well have saved the driver's life. The force of the impact was then channelled along the barrier before the car came to rest in what was a small spectator enclosure behind the lavatory in question. One of the surprising facts to come to light (as evidenced by photographs of the accident taken by a Press Reporter on the scene) was that two spectators are disclosed as standing in that spectator enclosure with their backs to the direction of the traffic! It is perhaps worth mentioning to spectators that the only safe policy at a motor racing meeting is always to face the direction from which the traffic is coming - that way, you can never be caught out!

However, the aim of the circuit is to so arrange its safety facilities that there is never any necessity for a spectator to be "caught out"! Ingliston has always been reckoned

to be one of the safest motor racing circuits in Britain and, indeed, it received its annual safety check by an RAC Inspector (and passed that check) some ten davs before the last Race Meeting. What happened in April was one of those "one in a million" chances which are completely unforeseeable - indeed, the course followed by the car in question was unbelievable to those who know about such things and more than one senior official at the circuit (all of whom have many years of motor racing experience) would not have believed that a racing car could have arrived at the point at which Doug Niven's car did, had they not seen it with their own eves! The problem immediately facing the organisers was to ensure that such an occurrence could never happen again, albeit that the chances of a repeat are infinitesimal. The first necessity is to ensure that no car can reach that part of the spectating area in any event and, to make certain of this, the barrier presently in front of the South Grandstand is being extended to the west of that Grandstand towards the lavatory, thus channelling any cars which may come down the straight "out of control" away from the grass area in front of the spectator enclosure. While this should be sufficient in itself, as a secondary line of defence the existing barrier between southstand and the lavatory, which is bedded in concrete, (this being the barrier Doug Niven hit) is being extended and repaired. To make assurance doubly sure, the path leading from Southstand to the hairpin is being relocated so that the public will no longer be able to stand at the lavatory and spectate - this path will now become merely an access path to the hairpin from the east of the circuit and, finally, to make absolutely certain, no access to the lavatory will be allowed during races. These measures should make it virtually impossible for a repetition of the Niven accident to occur but, having said that, and bearing in mind the tragic occurrences in Spain recently, it is perhaps a salutory time to remember that "motor racing is dangerous" and that the signs advising the public of this fact are not exhibited around the circuit merely for amusement! While every motor racing circuit in the world endeavours to make the facilities at that circuit as safe as is humanly possible, it is a recognised fact that it is impossible to make any circuit 100% safe and it is well that spectators remember this fact and be on their guard always to react to the unexpected. Although it is hoped that it will never happen, that very awareness may one day mean the difference between a "near miss" and a tragedy.

And now on to brighter things - although much has been seen in the press and on the media for the past couple of years regarding the new Knockhill circuit in Fife, even at the time that the last Ingliston Programme went to press it was still uncertain as to whether there was a racing circuit there or not (!) and, despite the tantalising and exciting prospects of future Formula 1 racing in Scotland put out by Knockhill's PR men, until very recently, there were those who wondered whether even Formula Ford would get off the ground on the Fife circuit. Happily, that is all resolved now and Scotcircuits are delighted to note that not only has Knockhill been granted its Track Licence but also that the circuit is now officially opened and that, following its probationary race meeting under the scrutiny of an RAC Observer, it will be open to provide a second venue for Scottish motor racing fans later this year. In the long term, the circuit's plans for Formula 1 (and possible Grand Prix) racing are perhaps the most exciting to hit Scotland since those of Lord Bruce for Polkemmet and it is sincerely to be hoped that the promoters of racing at Knockhill will be able to raise the somewhat awe inspiring amounts of finance necessary to realise their dreams - whether it will be economically feasible to consider running a Grand Prix (or even a Formula 1 race) in Scotland remains to be seen (especially bearing in mind the shattering costs of promoting such an event nowadays) but, unless one tries, one will never really know and the promoters of Knockhill must be congratulated on their courage in setting themselves such a high goal. In the meantime let us look forward to a healthy and sporting rivalry between the two

Scottish based circuits and express the sincere hope that they will so complement each other that Scotland will never again be in danger of being without motor racing facilities.

Having spent so long rabbiting on about other things, we have left ourselves very little space to talk about today's racing! First race on the card following an aerial "dog-fight" between radio controlled aircraft organised by Dr Ken Muir, is for Modified Sports cars and this should see a resumption of the first class battle for domination of the 1975 Modsport scene at Ingliston between the 2-litre Jensen Healey of Jenscot's Eric Liddell (65) and the diminutive Clan Crusader of Kenny Allen (85). In the damp conditions prevailing in April Ken Allen roared off to an immediate lead in the modsport race and pulled away strongly from the rest of the field. Behind him came a newcomer to racing in Scotland, John Kirk in his 1000 cc Imp-engined Davrian (90) and, once he has found his way around Ingliston, John will be one of the new men to watch. His second place in April was in fact his first ever race in his ex-works car and the potential is shattering. Look out too for Andrew Smith (77) in his Lotus Elan, he having shown a few of the supposedly "faster" competitors the way home in past race meetings (especially in the wet).

Straight on then to the small saloon car race and the first heat of the Adam

Wyllie Memorial Trophy Race. With no Sedric Bell to bother about this year, the up to 1000 cc saloon car competitors reckoned they were going to have it all their own way in April — they forgot about John Fyda, however. John has had appalling luck over the past few years with his Imp and, although he has shown himself to be one of the fastest small saloons in the country, he has never managed to keep it going long enough to amass a sufficient number of points to show well in the Championship table. April proved to be the exception and he romped away to an easy 15 sec win from Ian Forrest. Providing John's Imp (143) holds together this season he will almost certainly prove to be the man to beat but watch out too for Ian Forrest's Imp (129) as also that of Bill Donald (126). The next race on the card is the Royal Highland & Agricultural Society Trophy Race for Formula Ford cars and, once again, the April Meeting saw an enormous entry raring to do battle in the first round of the 1975 Scottish Formula Ford Championship. One of the happiest

sights of that meeting, however, was Ecurie Ecosse firmly established at the front of a Scottish race, with Stu Lawson (25) taking a runaway 10 sec victory from George Franchitti (28) in a similar Hawke DL12. The battle for second place was fierce, George fighting it out with Jedburgh's Neil Williamson (38) and north of Scotland driver Colin MacLean (32). All the principal contenders are back today for a repeat performance, as is John MacGilvray (one of last year's leading contenders) with his Crossle (27).

On to the big saloons and the first racing outing of Doug Niven's new mount, the 5.7 litre Ford Capri acquired by him from Colin Hawker. Immediately following his horrifying shunt in April, Dougal determined to get right back into Super Saloon car racing and, with the help of Stuart Turner and Walter Hayes of Ford, he discovered that Colin Hawker was willing to sell his Capri as a rolling chassis. Since all the moving parts of the old Boss Escort were still in working order (engine, gearbox etc) it seemed like a good idea to screw these into Colin's Capri and master mechanic Geoff Wilson has been employed doing just that for the past couple of weeks. The result is expected to be just as quick as the old Boss Escort (although considerably more stable) and it will be interesting to see how the new car takes to the track today. Up against the new Capri will be Graeme Walker in the ex-SMT Vauxhall Firenza (104) Hugh Chalmers in a split new 2.3 litre Avenger (the engine is identical to that in Graeme Walker's car) and Frank Gunn's BDA-powered Ford Escort (102) while, if conditions are at all wet, everyone will have to look out for the flying trio of Jim Dryden (114), Eric Smith (113) and Irishman Jim McClements (118). Then it is time for the first Scottish outing of Iain McLaren's ex-works Chevron B31 2-litre sports car. This is the car recently driven by Jody Schecter and already Iain has shown himself a worthy pilot of the new mount. Opposition to him in the GT race will come from Peter McNaughtan's Chevron B23 FVC (72) while, once again out to show the 2-litre boys that you can get away with murder is a small capacity car, will be Ken Allen in the amazing Clan Crusader (85).

Then it's "on the air" for the Radio Forth Production Saloon Car race with yet another "mixed bag" of Production saloons vying for the 1975 Scottish standard saloon car honours. Production saloons are of course "standard" saloon cars as bought from the showroom (—ask any of the competitors if that's the case and be prepared for a very loud raspberry!). The shock of the April Meeting was Tom Irvine (158) in his Honda Civic. Although in the lowest price class, Tom went charging away in the front runners and, although the power of some of the more expensive cars told later,

he still came in a very creditable 8th. Just how he will do today against the more expensive Alfas, Capris, Firenzas and Mazdas remains to be seen but you can bet your boots that he will be drying everything he knows to repeat last Meeting's performance. The BP Super Visco race for Libre cars follows with favourite almost certainly being Andy Barton (4) in his new March 73/74B Atlantic. Andy won a well deserved race in April, long overdue, tearing away from the rest of the field from the drop of the flag and showing himself to be as much a master of the single seater scene as he was of the 1000 cc Special Saloon car class some years ago. Almost as anticipated, the immediate opposition to him in April was the welcome return of the Irish Brigade (in the form of Patsy McGarrity and Ken Fildes) but, in 4th place was Dalkeith's Andrew Jeffrey (16) with his Chevron B25FVC Formula 2 car. Andrew was taking things easy in his first outing with this car and, bearing in mind that this was the car which gave Iain McLaren his first libre win at Ingliston last year we can expect some fireworks from this quarter some time during the season! Speaking of Iain McLaren yet again, he has entered his 2-litre Chevron in the libre race and reopens the age old Ingliston Formula 2 (or Atlantic?) v. 2-litre sports car question. Iain was just pipped at the post for the Scottish Libre Championship last year, and with the ex-Jody Scheckter car at his fingertips, could 1975 be his year?

Then it's time for the final of the Adam Wyllie Memorial Trophy Race for Special Saloons with the fastest 5 saloons from each of the 3 qualifying classes (up to 1000 ccs, 1001—1300 ccs and over 1300ccs) competing for points in the prestigious Lombard North Central Scottish Saloon Car Championship. Although reserved in the past for a ding-dong battle between Doug Niven and Bill Dryden, it is unlikely that Bill will be present today since his new car still awaits the odd piece here and there before being completed and it could be July before we see the new SMT special saloon on the tracks. Having said that, with Dougal in an untried and untested mount, today's final could see an interesting combination and, if some of the hairier super saloons (which entered the April Special Saloon Car race and registered for the Scottish Saloon Car Championship) pop in the odd "late" entry or two, heaven only knows what the form will be in this event. Always one of the races of the day, today's final will prove a suitable climax to what promises to be a good afternoon's Club Racing.

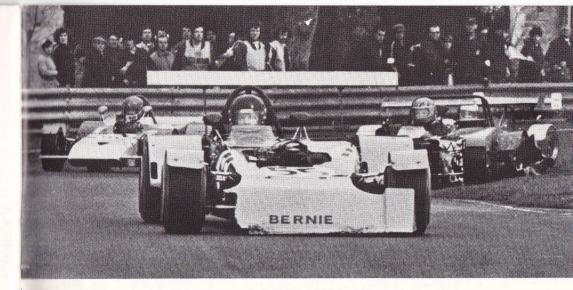

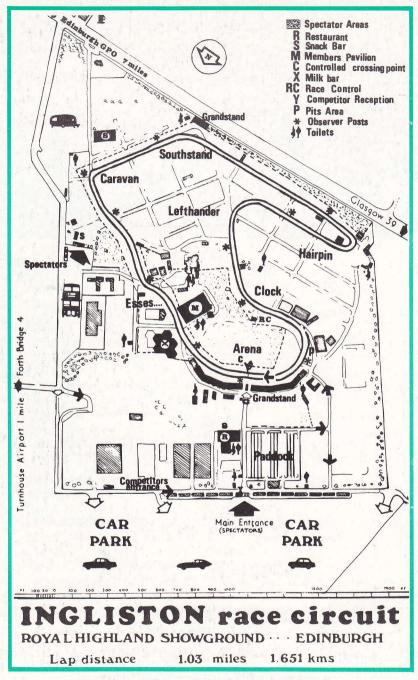
### DON'T MISS INGLISTON SUPERSPORTS DAY
