





LAST RACE MEETING of the year at Ingliston on 16th October sees the final rounds of the Scottish motor racing Championships PLUS our annual trip to nostalgia with the historic car race, always a memorable event. Not a day to be missed if you value your racing memories over the winter months.

Catering at Ingliston is in the hands of D.S. Crawford who will be supplying snacks in both the Herdsman's Restaurant and the MacRobert Pavilion (SMRC Members only), both from 12 noon onwards. Breakfast will be available in the Herdsman's Restaurant from 9.30 am and, throughout the day, all the usual snacks, sandwiches, pies, hot drinks, cakes and the rest will be available from the many Snack Bars and kiosks around the circuit (the major Snack Bars being situated in the Herdsman's Restaurant and on the ground floor of the MacRobert Pavilion). The Club Bar, the licence of which has been extended to include all competitors and their mechanics is open in the MacRobert Pavilion from 12.30 to 9.30 pm continually and it is hoped a Public Bar will be open in the Herdsmans Restaurant between 12.30 to 2.30 pm.

Grandstand Tickets are on sale as follows: for the Highland Grandstand from the kiosk immediately behind the crossing point to the Central Enclosure in the centre of that stand; for the South Grandstand at the approach to that stand. Tickets will not be on sale before 10.30 am on race days.

Racing 'goodies' are on sale by Sports-Tune at a side adjacent to the Highland Grandstand.





FOR YOUR DAY'S ENJOYMENT

Undoubtedly today's highlight must be the Super Saloon Scottish Challenge Race sponsored by our old friends, SMT, in which several of the fastest English special saloons challenge their Scottish counterparts to a 15 lap contest which could see the determination of the U.K. Super Saloon Championship. Over the past few months three Scottish "Superloons" (Bill Dryden (100), Doug Niven (101) and Walter Robertson (105)) have been competing regularly, and with considerable success, in super saloon races South of the Border and, today, their regular adversaries repay the compliment. Indeed the race (an invitation event open to the 16 fastest special saloons at Ingliston today) comes at a particularly opportune time for Scottish motor racing fans since it could provide us with a Scotsman winning the Super Saloon Championship outright on home ground. Already the 2½ litre class winner of the Championship, following his class win in Ireland two weeks ago, Douglas Niven has a chance to take the overall U.K. "Superloon" title this afternoon and, on his recent form, he could just do that. His principal opposition (apart, that is, from S.M.T. is Bill Dryden and Walter Robertson, there being so little between these three now that it is almost impossible to make predictions as to which order they will finish in) must come from the incredible 5 litre V8 Beetle of past Superloon Champion, Mick Hill (93) (the man who held the Ingliston Class lap record for long enough following his last super saloon appearance here 2½ years ago in his Boss Capri) and Colin Hawker's 3 litre VW Coupe (94). To say that the Challenge Race will be a 5-horse affair out front may be something of a premature pronouncement (watch out, for example, for Jim Dryden's Longman Mini (107) if it's wet!). But the editor will eat his hat (thank goodness he. doesn't own one) if the winner doesn't come out of these 5. Likewise we'll be very surprised if more than 2 seconds covers the first 4/5 home, so close do we expect the racing to be!

The Super Saloon Championship itself comprises a series of races being held throughout the U.K. this year, organised by the Super Saloon Drivers Association. Basically, the idea behind the series is that, if several circuits put up specially attractive prize funds for one-off special saloon spectaculars the entries should include the best in British saloon car racing (at least that's the theory!) Each race circuit in Britain has its own

saloon stars (at Ingliston, of course, the indominatable trio of Dryden/Niven/Roberston) and the hope is that this series will allow all of these "stars" to have a go at each other for a change. While the series has been an undoubted success, especially on the Southern circuit rounds, sadly the "outlying circuits" (such as Ingliston) have not seen as full entries as might have been possible since the economic recession, coupled with spiralling travelling costs, are resulting in Southern competitors restricting drastically the travelling which they are willing to undertake. Nevertheless, with two of the fastest non-Scpttish saloons in Britain here today (Mick Hill and Colin Hawker), taking on the 3 fastest Scottish saloons (all of whom are treated with distinct respect on their regular "raids" across the Border) we should see a memorable saloon car battle this afternoon.

Today also sees the penultimate rounds in some of the closest Scottish Motor Racing Championships seen in many a day. Naturally, with so many "furriners" about, the SMT Trophy Challenge Race (Event 7) will not be counting towards the Lombard Scottish Saloon Car Championship, but each of events 1 and 3 will be, so watch out for fireworks as the local saloons "go for broke" in this £2310 series. Presently hanging on to the lead, "by a whisker", is Jimmy Pinkerton (114) but, now that he has to start "dropping scores" (only the best 4 scores of the Season count in the Scottish Championships), he is extremely vulnerable to attack from Bill Dryden (100), Doug Niven (101) and Walter Robertson (105) in the big saloon class, each of whom could still overtake him and, in certain circumstances, win the Championship. In his own 1300 cc class, Jimmy can only be overtaken in the Championship now by Dave Farrer (109) but, on the track, Jim Dryden (107) must be the man to watch for. As for the 1000 cc class, which has seen some stupendous racing this year, the two "danger men" (each of whom could also win the Championship outright yet) are Ian Forrest (129) and Duncan Fisher (123).

In single seaters the position is just as tense, since either Andy Barton (3) or Iain McLaren (2) could yet win the £1600 Heron Libre Championship series while Norman Dickson (1), who treated us to a superlative display of high speed driving in smashing the outright

lap record at the last Ingliston meeting, could yet pull himself into second place. In the "junior single seater league", for Formula Fords, Stu Lawson (77) seems to be well clear of the rest of the field, despite having to give second best to David Leslie (85) last time out, but watch out for George Franchitti (71) and Duncan Hall (76) in the Drakkar Race this afternoon, both of whom have their eyes set on a "win".

Having in mind the unceasing support of the Scottish Motor Racing Club who organise the racing at Ingliston it is particularly gratifying to see this race meeting named after them, and we are delighted too that they are sponsoring the Sports Car race this afternoon, to the winner of which will go the John Nicholson Trophy (an apt choice, having in mind the remarkable sports car achievements of the late John Nicholson). Sadly, the effects of the economic recession are only now being felt in Club motor racing since, as cars break/"bend" during the season, funds are rarely available to rebuild/replace the damaged machinery and this is resulting in gradually diminishing grids as the year progresses. Today, this dilemma sees the sports 2000 class being amalgamated with the modified sports car class, both of which are somewhat depleted, although the amalgamation will in no way diminish the standard of racing (and may indeed enhance it!). Keep your eyes on all 4 of the 2-litre sports cars today (30, 31, 32 & 34) and on the Mallocks of Kenny Allen (43) and Jim Stevenson (46), any of whom could arrive at the chequered flag in front!

All in all, what promises to be 7 action-packed races, all taking the 1977 Scottish Motor Racing Championships one step closer to the final rounds on 16th October, when the whole series will be decided once and for all. And, as if that is not incentive enough to return to Ingliston on the 16th, don't forget we will be staging our annual "historic" thrash then too, when a varied field of historic racing machinery (from E.R.A.s and Maseratis to D-Types and Lotus XIs) will treat spectators to an unforgettable experience of all the senses (sight, sound and smell) as they thunder round the track in what is frequently one of the best races of the year.
