## TODAY'S MEETING

The Carmichael Motor Group are no strangers to Ingliston, your friendly Edinburgh Jaguar and Rolls-Royce dealers, having sponsored events and races in recent years. Today, however, is something different and we feel sure that this will be the biggest and best Ingliston meeting for ten years.

The main Championship races are taking place today as usual but in addition we have the first Scottish Historic Grand Prix race sponsored by McLaren Building and Property Development Group in Glasgow. Added to this we have what promises to be an exciting Formula Libre race sponsored by Mountleigh Homes and featuring the Ecurie Ecosse Group C2 racing in Scotland for the first time.

So where do we start?

Well, there is the usual Formula Ford action with Tom Brown out to stamp his authority further on the FF scene in Scotland and go for a record breaking four successive Scottish Championships. Though it may have been a foregone conclusion last year, Tom is really having to sweat a bit this year with his Scottish Road Services Van Diemen. Willie Rose from the north has now got used to his Reynard 84 and Harvey Gillanders has the latest RP33 Royale and Colin Birbeck the latest Van Diemen. All of them are likely to show up better in this second half of the season but they have a long way to catch up with Brown. We also welcome back an old friend from Ireland — Tony Reid, the former Irish lap record holder.

In the GT races today Ian Forrest has shown a marked return to form now that he is back in an Imp and he will keep the Davrians on their toes.

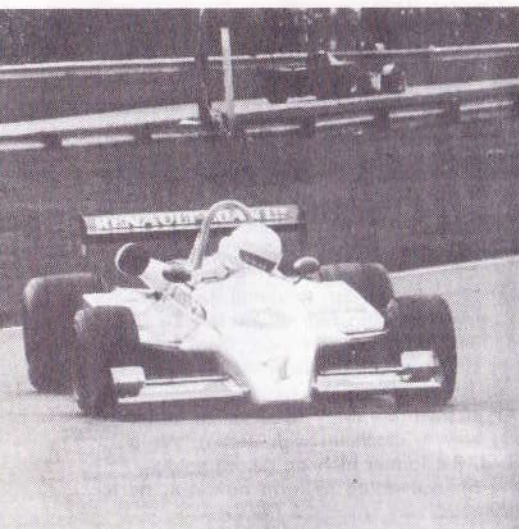
In the bigger GT class, Jim McGaughay is likely to chalk up another maximum set of points with his FES Lancia-Toleman but in the race itself he is likely to be faced by Mike Wilds in the Ecurie Ecosse car which ran at Monza, Silverstone and Le Mans. Wilds, one of Britain's best sports car drivers, is looking forward to racing at Ingliston and he is sure to give McGaughay a run for his money. As Wilds is not registered for the Scottish GT Championship it will not affect the points of the registered drivers but it is likely to make a good race of it.

In the Road Car classes for both sports cars and saloons there is likely to be a good battle between a number of drivers and at this meeting it is expected that one or two new names will appear.

Reigning Formula Libre Champion George McMillan will be hard put to it today as he has strong opposition from Russell Spence with his Mountleigh Homes Fittipaldi F1 car.

The Formula Libre race will have its own thrills for apart from Mike Wilds out again in the Ecosse we will have a welcome visitor in Russel Spence who is currently lying in second in the British Formula 3 Championship to Johnny Dumfries. Russell is no stranger to Ingliston as he demolished the Ford 2000 lap record the last time he was here three years ago, a record which stood for some time. This time he will have a real handful as he has rented a Fittipaldi F8 Grand Prix car raced by Chico Serra in 1982, fitted with a 3.3 litre Ford Cosworth DFL engine producing over 500 b.h.p. This is the most modern ground effects grand prix car ever to have raced at Ingliston. Meanwhile, amongst all this, we have Jim Stevenson and George McMillan with their Ralts trying to settle the Formula Libre Championship for this year.

Moving on to the Clubmans/Sports 2000 class there is added spice here in both sections as Kenny Allan is making a welcome return to racing after his horrendous accident in a hill climb earlier in the season. Ken has made a remarkable recovery and will be running his new V84A Vision Clubmans car. This is a change for Ken as he has been a Mallock enthusiast for a long time and it will be interesting to see how he goes against his old rival John Fyda. In the B sport class another Scottish owned Vision will be taking part as Andy Smith from Ayr is making a return to Scotland with his new car.

Meanwhile there will be some competition in the Sports 2000 class as Russell Spence has rented a Royale which should be very quick and he will be up against all the local heroes including Laurence Jacobsen's Chevron plus the Ecurie Ecosse Chevron which this time will be driven by the Australian Tony Green who was responsible for the building and preparation of the Ecurie Ecosse Le Mans car and is Chief Mechanic in the Ecosse team. Tony originally came from Australia to "... become the new Australian World Champion" but drifted into car preparation. As a gesture towards his assistance with Ecurie Ecosse he will race the team's Chevron for the first time.

Then, finally, the Historic Grand Prix cars, the biggest race of its type ever held in Scotland and also the most expensive. **The McLaren Building and Property Development Group** are the major sponsors of the race and it has brought together some of the leading historic racers in Britain. Leading the field is Bruce Halford with his Lotus 16. Bruce is unique

in having owned a Lotus 16 grand prix car and raced it in the late 1950s, and is still racing one today. This model looks similar to the Vanwall Grand Prix car of the period and has proved very successful in Historic racing. Then there is the Honourable Amschel Rothschild with his Maserati 250F1. This is one of the classic post-war Grand Prix cars and certainly on of the most beautiful. John Harper's Lister-Jaguar is unique in that it was built by Ecurie Ecosse here in Edinburgh to compete in the second USA v. Europe races at Monza when the USAC drivers came over with their Indianapolis cars to race in the 1950s. Initially Ecurie Ecosse were the only team to race against them and for the second race a special single seater was built. It is now run by John Harper and will be raced for the first time in its native Scotland.

Gerry Walton with his Connaught has raced at Ingliston before as have both the Cooper-Bristol drivers Roddy MacPherson and Oliver Robinson. The odds are on MacPherson in this race.

In the pre-war section there are even more mouth-watering cars with Gunnar Elmgren's 6CM Maserati, a 1936 Grand Prix car and Rodney Felton's 4CL which was built just prior to the war and raced here last October for the first time. The Alfa Romeo Grand Prix car of 1934, the type B was a classic of its day and Bill Black has been very successful with his one so far this year. Then come the ERA's and with four entered for the race and one reserve it is the largest number to be entered for an historic event in Scotland. Martin Morris won the all-ERA race at Silverstone recently and also has been to the circuit before with his B-type. We also welcome Donald Day, Peter Mann and Patrick Marsh with their cars. The reserve is Bruce Spollon with another B-type. Then there are the Bugattis led by Lord Raglan's type 51 and E. M. Dean's type 59. Reserve is Geoffrey St John's Bugatti. The two post-war reserves are the Connaughts of John Charles and Stephen Langton. It looks like being a good race and a good meeting.
