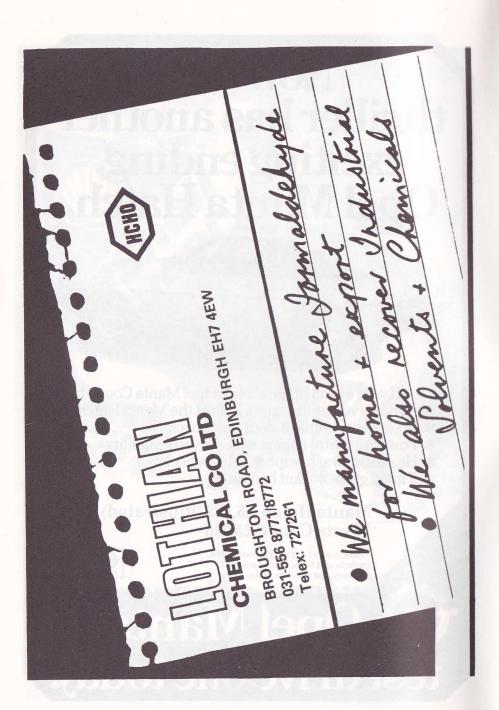

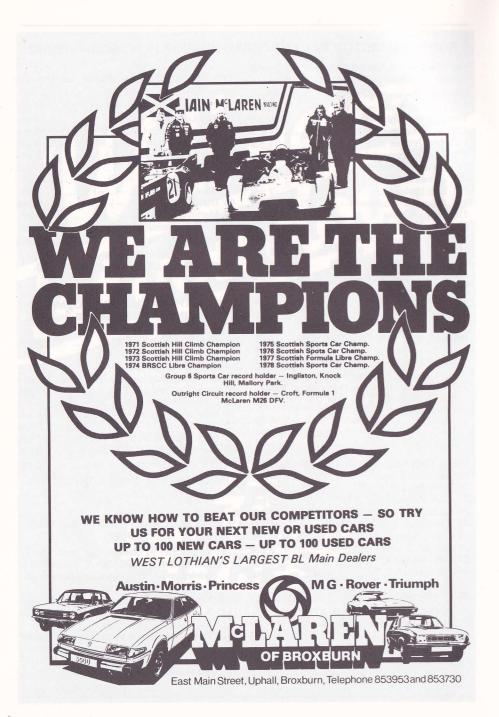

#### Support Scottish Steel — Buy a Barrier for Ingliston

Don't be at all surprised if you hear these words stattered at you in a broken sob-wracked voice by Scotcircuits Chairman, Graham Hamilton, tonight. After all, with 13 identially prepared 2.3 litre BMW 323i Sports Saloons, each delivering 170 bhp, roaring around the track at the hands of 13 of the country's top drivers (both 4 and 2 wheels!), and with a needle match between the country's top superloons Doug Niven (5 litre Beetle) and Mick Hill (7 litre Phoenix) scheduled later in the day, today's race meeting has all the hallmarks of a barrier bending bonanza! Pride of place, however, must go to the big BMs, this being the day the BMW County Championship Charity Race Series comes to Ingliston. The idea is a splendid one, with 13 race tuned BMW 323i sports saloons (all identically prepared by Tom Walkinshaw Racing) competing in a 12-round Championship, today's race being the eighth in the series. Each car is sponsored by a BMW dealer and bears the name and colours of the county which the dealership represents. A total prize purse of £6,000 for the series has been allocated by BMW (GB) Ltd., with each race worth £250, £150, and £100 for the first three cars. All prize money is donated by the sponsoring dealers to local charities of their choice, so that today's race is worth £500 to three of the charities listed on the entry list. In addition, the charities undoubtedly also benefit from "fringe benefits" - for example, it has become almost traditional for a group of boys from the nearby Dr. Barnardo's Home to attend each round, and today is no exception with 10 boys from the local home here with us today at Ingliston. To date, the leading "counties" in the series are: Norfolk (102 points), Avon (86), Gloucestershire (85), Sussex (73) and Nottinghamshire (57).

Drivers in the BMWs are, of course, interchangeable, although it is a prerequisite that any driver must be a racer of note and experience — in short, the top of his particular three. And you can't really get much higher than World Motor Cycling Champion Barry Sheene, which is one very good reason for giving him his big chance on 4 wheels in the Grampian car (much more in this vein and we'll be talking him into F1I) Last time a World Champion actually competed at Ingliston (there have been several demonstrations by World Champions) was when Jim Clark took part in the milk float race at our inaugural meeting, so it is probably fair to say that this will be the first time we have really seen a Champion in competitive action at Scotland's premier circuit. A warm welcone to Barry, who we hope will enjoy his visit to Ingliston both on and off the track.

The remaining 12 BMW drivers read like a "Who's Who" of club motor racing. F1, F2, F3 and Can-Am driver Patrick Neve runs the leading Norfolk car, while former Super 'V' Champion John Morrison is in the Wiltshire BMW. For Notts we have Sports 2000 Champion Frank Sytner (and while on the subject of Sports 2000, now that we have a Sports 2000 manufacturer in Scotland, Ingliston will be organising a Scotlish Sports 2000 Championship for 1981, which

lain McLaren's rebuilt 3.5 Skoda just hangs on ahead of Tony Sugden's 2-litre version.

gives all of you ample warning to rush out and get your motors now!). From the world of saloon car racing come Scottish Saloon Car Champion Doug Niven (driving the Surrey car), exsuperloon ace Nick Whiting (Kent), former Group 2 star Andy Rouse (of Broadspeed fame) and production saloon car maestro Alan Minshaw, while one of the most successful Clubmans drivers of all time, Geoff Friswell, pilots the Herts BMW. Space does not permit us to give detailed biographical details of all 13 drivers, but suffice it to say that all are top exponents of the art of flinging mechanically propelled machines around at the fastest possible speed. And judging by previous rounds in the BMW County Championship, that is what has been done to the 323i's by their pilots, this class having established itself as a classic for doorhandle to doorhandle racing.

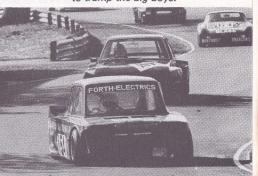
With BMW sponsoring today's race meeting saloons have to be the talking point, and if we stretch the definition a bit into Grand Touring cars we've arrived at the other main attraction, a round in the Motoring News Donington Grand Touring Championships. Pride of place in Gts always goes to the hairy monsters, and you aren't going to find anything hairier or more monstrous than Mick Hill . . . . 's 7-litre Phoenix (124)! Currently lexding the Donington Championship overall by a mere 1 point from the exceptionally fast 2-litre Skoda Coupe of -Derek Walker (114), Mick is going to have his hands full on this his first trip away from "home" this year, since second in class to him in the Donington series is our own Walter Robertson (105) whose Formula 1 powered D.F. VW is the onlt Gt car yet to have circulated in under 49 seconds in a race at Ingliston. Having said that, however, don't forget that Dougal Niven (101) has not been following the Donington Championship this season (that honour has gone to mechanic Jeff Wilson who has only just had the effrontery to better Dougal's Croft lap record in the Beetle) but that, since today's Caledon Coal Co. Trophy Race counts also towards the McLaren of Broxburn BL Cars Championship, Dougal will be out there in the cockpit seeking to keep himself firmly at the top of the Scottish series. Confrontations between Dougal and Mick Hill tend to be pretty explosive affairs and, having in mind the incredible 48.4 second lap turned in by Dougal in practice at Ingliston on 11th May, this one could be no exception. Forget not. either, that Laurence Jacobsen has been poking his immaculately cheeky 2-litre Imp (104) right up Dougal's exhaust all season and this car just seems to get faster and faster and more and more reliable. Since it already shares the GT lap record with Dougal, a continuation of the trend can only mean trouble for the heavier machinery!

While, at Ingliston, we run only one class for Gt cars over 1500 c.c. (the nature of the circuit is such that a smaller lighter car does not have the disadvantage it would have on a

longer track with room for the bigger engined cars to wind themselves up), the Donington Championship provides for an additional class "break" at 2500 c.c. Leading this 1501-2500 c.c. class in that Championship at present is Derek Walker (114), and his Skoda (possibly the) fastest in the country) could prove to be a hard car to beat on the tight Ingliston track. During the early part of this season, however, even the might of Mick Hill's 7-litre Phoenix was being left standing on the straight at Donington by the diminutive 2-litre Elan of Nicky Ellis (115), one of Derek Walker's main rivals in the 2½ litre Class, and many commentators felt that Nicky might well be unbeatable in this car at Ingliston. Today will be the test of that.

And if power to weight ratio is what it's all about at Ingliston, just get out your calculators and tot up the potential of Jim Evans' turbocharged Lotus Esprit (120). Jim's reputation as both a car builder and turbocharger is second to none, and pretty nearly everything he has turned out has been an instant success at Ingliston (with him behind the wheel). In theory, the Esprit should be no exception, and it completes one of the most

intriguing GT line-ups we've seen yet at Ingliston.

The Crawford's Catering Trophy Race for 1500 c.c. GT Cars welcomes David Auger's very potent Skoda 130RS (130): David, who is joint leader of the 1500 c.c. class in the donington Championship with Peter Baldwin, takes on Eric Paterson's very fast Robinson Imp (126) and Gus Young's Agra Davrian (145). Regular 1100 c.c. Davrian pilot Brian Stevenson (144) is having to make do today with a 998 c,c, engine, putting him into the fray with no fewer than 29 cars entered for the Luckpenny Restaurant Trophy Race. (Indeed, so many 1-litre cars are there that only the fastest 16 will be able to compete for Championship points, the faster unqualifying cars being allowed a consolation run on the back of the grid for event 5.) At the start of the year it looked as if the Davrians (and particularly those of George Coghill (174) and Kenny Coleman (172)) were going to have the edge on the Imps, but some sterling drives by Bob Leckie (151), Jim McGaughay (154) and Ricky Gauld (162) have caused us to reconsider. Class lap record now rests with Bob Leckie at 53.2 secs, although Ricky Gauld did turn in a 53.0 second lap in May's Supercar race, while in the same event Jim McGaughay astonished everyone with a brilliant 4th place, way ahead of the nearest Davrians. All good reasons for suspecting that the Davrians spell of success could be past. Particularly to with the appearance of Donington 1 litre front runner Dick Wallinger, with his Imp (164).

Ingliston's Formula Atlantic racing has been excellent this year (don't foget that we host a round of the Hitachi National Atlantic Championship on 17th August) and accordingly today's Glasgow Herald race is marred only by the knowledge of Andy Barton's recent road accident. While Andy will be out of racing for quite a spell, we feel sure all competitors, officials and

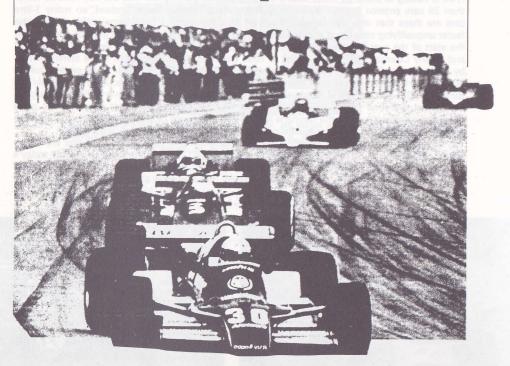

However, on 11th May at the Lowland Tyres Championship round at Croft, Kevin McCormick (41) showed his mettle by heading Clive by 1½ seconds, while at Ingliston on 27th April Graham Sword (39) underlined the fact that Clive cannot any longer reckon on an easy race, when Graham took the new class lap record away from Clive. All in all, a portent of more exciting Class B days to come! And joining the Clubmans today, just to vary the medicine a bit, are a handful of FF2000 cars, competing in the North British FF2000 series.

Last, but not least (more like most in fact), is the biggest ever FF1600 entry at Ingliston. Originally we were only going to run one FF1600 race today, but so many cars entered that we had little choice but to squeeze in an unscheduled non-Championship Laidlaw Trophy Race at the end of the day. The fastest 16 formula Fords, however, go forward to the Shell Championship Race at 3.35 p.m., a Championship in which Tom Brown (48) is establishing the sort of lead we came to expect from his FF predecessor. Stu Lawson.

Today's racing thus seems a pretty varied day's sport, which is what you can expect when we welcome you back to Ingliston on 17th August. #### **100 INGLISTON FACTS**

(Further haphazard research by Ranald Bruce and accurate as at 10th May, 1980)

For anyone who didn't buy a programme at the Centenary Meeting this is Part 2 of an article which was written for that occasion, but in which the author was so verbose that it was impossible to fit it all into the one programme!

In trying to discover who has been the most successful driver at Ingliston, it was found that no one has yet achieved 50 wins at the circuit. (In counting wins, two-part races and races of heat and final have all been treated as separate events. One perhaps slightly unfair aspect of these statistics is that, due to the way in which earlier results were printed, it has been impossible to determine class wins and accordingly only overall race wins are referred to here. Had this not been the case, it is quite probable that Sedric Bell or Jimmy Dryden would have figured high on the tables, due to their sometimes astonishing feats in saloon car finals.) On the information as it stands, however, Bill Dryden is clearly in the lead with 44 wins to his credit from Dougal Niven's 36. "Twiggy" Dryden's career shows a remarkable consistency of first places from the earliest days right up until the end of last season. To begin with, many of his victories were in single seaters and of course latterly he was best known for regularly coming home first in the SMT Firenza. In between these two periods, he kept things going in the final part of the sixties in the remarkable little H. & G. Robinson entered Honda S800. This competed in the long-defunct Marque car class and, although usually about half the engine capacity of its rivals, proved invincible on almost every outing in Bill's hands. Graham Birrell, in a variety of special and production saloon cars, not to mention the occasional single seater, chalked up 28 wins over all, Willie Forbes achieved 22 and Andy Barton and the late Gerry Birrell have each managed 20.

With regard to individual events Ingliston has during its history seen all types of motor car races, together with motor cycle races, kart races, a traction engine demonstration which developed into a race, serious (and not so serious) cycle races and even a milk float race whose competitors included the late Jim Clark. Perhaps the most enduring championship races have been in the special saloon classes, Formula Libre, Formula Fords and modified sports cars. In special saloons, Dougal Niven just manages to edge Bill Dryden into second place with 34 wins as opposed to Bill's 33, but this takes into account Dougal's saloon outings in the new grand touring class this season. Graham Birrell won on 20 occasins, Sedric Bell on 16 and other prolific winners include Jimmy Dryden, Eric Smith, Andy Barton and Bill Borrowman, formerly a familiar sight in the Sportstune "box" Mini.

Although it is many years since he last competed at Ingliston, Willie Forbes from Aberdeen still leads the field in Formula Libre with 19 wins from Norman Dickson's 11, with Andy Barton again featuring along with Tommy Reid with 8 wins and Ian McLaren 7. Undisputed king of Formula ford racing was Stuart Lawson, who, like Willie Forbes in the Libre Class, chalked up 19 wins to his credit which is far ahead of any of his rivals, the closest being Neil Ginn with 5. Considering the number of Formula Ford races which have taken place and the number of drivers who have won races (including Scotcircuits Chairman Graham Hamilton), this really serves to show how close Formula Ford racing has always been.

In the modsport classes, John Fyda's amazing feats with the Agra Elan over the last three seasons have ensured him the top of the table with 15 wins from John Absolom with 12. The Agra Elan's remarkable record makes it the most consistently successful car in any event during the period it was racing, having won almost every race it entered at Ingliston. Kenny Allen's remarkable little Clan Crusader and John Kirk's Davrian also deserves mention in this section. The former GT Sports classes were dominated over the years by Tony Charnell and Ian McLaren and also the amazing smaller capacity class Fisher Spyder driven to success on numerous occasions by Eddie Labinjoh. He also, along with Jenny Birrell, achieved a considerable number of wins in production saloon classes.

Outright lap record holder for the original 0.76 mile circuit is Peter Gethin, who achieved 37.0 seconds (73.9 m.p.h.) in a Formula 2 Chevron. After the circuit had been extended to a length of 1.03 miles, thus taking on its present shape, the first meeting was held on 8th September 1968. Fastest laps on that day were, in the Libre class, Willie Forbes (Lola) 49.8 seconds (74.46 m.p.h.) and in the saloon classes, Graham Birrell (Escort) in 57.0 seconds (65.05 m.p.h.) and

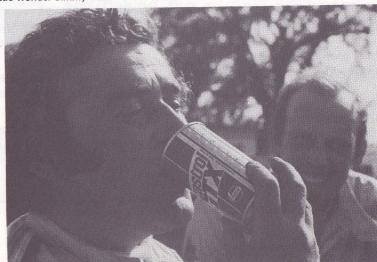

Bill Borrowman's Mini in the small class in 58.9 seconds (62.95 m.p.h.). Several long-standing lap records were then established, the most remarkable of which was Sedric Bell's small saloon record, set in his Ford Engined Mini in September 1974. His time was 54.1 seconds, a speed of 68.54 m.p.h., and this remained unbeaten for almost 4 years until it finally fell to John Kirk's Imp (52.6 seconds, 70.49 m.p.h.) on 20th August, 1978. The first man to crack the 80 m.p.h. barrier was Tommy Reid in a Brabham on 13/5/73 when he lapped at 80.43 m.p.h. and this held for over three years until being beaten by Richard Scott in a Modus on 25/7/76. Due to changes in the line-up at the hairpin before the start of this season, a new series of lap records are in the process of being established. The outright lap record for the extended circuit in its initial form is therefore held by Norman Dickson (March 792) in 44.4 seconds, 83.51 m.p.h. The only man ever to have broken the 49 second saloon barrier in a race is Walter Robertson (D.F. VE) who set a time of 48.8 seconds (75.98 m.p.h.) on 19/8/79. To date the fastest lap on the newly altered circuit is 44.7 seconds (82.95 m.p.h.), set by David Leslie at the meeting on 11th May. There are also a number of interesting personality details concerning racing at Ingliston. Although perhaps considered out on a limb by some of the drivers from the south, it has yet managed to attract a number of competitors who have figured in Grand Prix racing. There are obvious associations with Jim Clark and in particular S.M.R.C. Club President Jackie Stewart, and in addition to these, peter Gethin figured in several Grand Prix events and indeed won an Italian GP for McLaren. |A| fairly regular winner at one time at Ingliston was John Miles, who also figured in Formula 1 racing and is now the chief tester for Auto Car magazine. His father, incidentally, is the well known actor Bernard Miles. Other "firsts" also deserve some mention, and in fact Ingliston can boast some athletic achievements of near olympic proportions. In this, the "long jump" champion must be Jimmy Veitch, who succeeded in flying his Mini from the banking just after the left-hander almost to Clock without rolling in 1973. The altitude or "high jump" record holder must certainly be Dougal Niven who almost managed to clear a lavatory block on the back straight in April 1975 in his Boss Escort. Immediately afterwards, he built the engine into a Boss Capri and it was feared that his purpose in doing so was to attempt to jump the race control building but fortunately this proved unfounded. Longest short-cut on the course and runner-up in the long jump stakes must be Norman Hodgson who on one occasion left the circuit at the left-hander and was only prevented from rejoining it at the Esses by the somewhat unsporting intervention of the MacRobert Pavilion. Jock Russell, that well known buccaneer of the early single seater days, has the distinction of having been the only man to crash on a lap of honour for winning part one of a two-part race, and if a special award were created for piggy-back racing, it would surely be won by Ed Cheever and Patsy McGarrity for an amazing finish when Cheever crossed the line with McGarrity's car straddled across the back of

With all that variety of entertainment in the first 100 meetings, who is to say what will happen in Ingliston's next century?

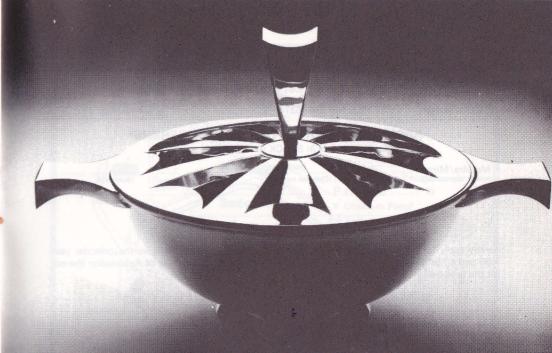

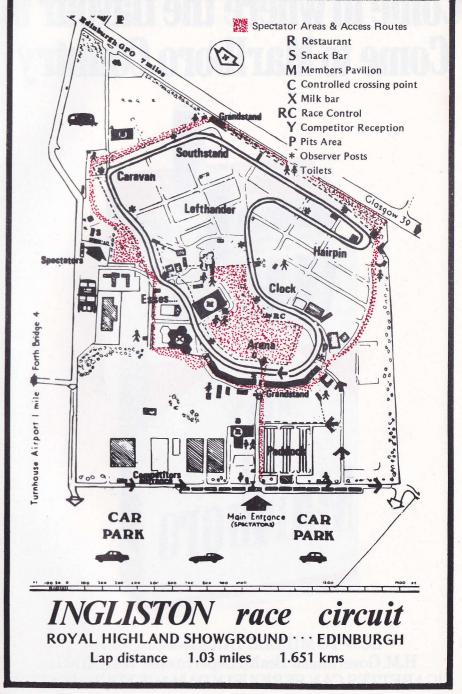
