





We are proud and privileged to be honoured today with the pomp and panoply of a state occasion. Most happily for us the State Visit of His Majesty Hussein I, King of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, and her Royal Highness the Princess Muna al Hussein includes, as one of many formal engagements, their attendance at our first National Race Meeting.

We bid a respectful and very warm welcome to our Royal guests and to the distinguished members of the Jordanian and British suites in attendance and to the guests of Her Majesty's Lieutenant for the County of Midlothian and Lady Inglis of Glencorse. Ltd., the sponsors of today's meeting, Mr. William Merrilees, the Chief Constable of the Lothians and Peebles, and some of the senior officials of the meeting.

Racing will then resume and at about 4.30 p.m. the entourage will adjourn by way of the circuit to the MacRobert Pavilion, returning after the second part of the S.M.T. Trophy Race to make the presentation of the trophies.

We think that all motor racing enthusiasts probably know that His Majesty is at heart one of them. This is, however, a State Visit and you will search for his name in the list of entries in this programme in vain. On the other hand it will be appearing in our programmes annually hereafter, but not in the list of entries, for His Majesty has very graciously gifted as a perpetual challenge trophy The King Hussein Trophy, a magnificent addition to Ingliston's fine collection and one that will remind us all of the honour we are being accorded today.

The presentation of The King Hussein Trophy will be made to the winner of the Formula 3 race by His Majesty following the return from the MacRobert Pavilion and Her Royal Highness the Princess Muna will present the S.M.T. Trophy to the winner on aggregate of the Formula Libre events.

We understand that the Princess Muna is very keen on horses too (the four-legged ones, not the ones under the bonnets) and if our information is correct then she will have lots to talk about with ten-year-old Mary Lyon who has left Noddy at home today so that she may present a bouquet to Her Royal Highness.



We are, of course, delighted that a Scottish firm should have been so early to see the value of publicity in sponsoring a principal race at Ingliston and we wish Bill Dryden, their Managing Director's son, who is racing today in Nick Cuthbert's Elan, the best of luck, for there could be no nicer reward to Mr. George Dryden, whose enthusiasm persuaded his fellow-Directors help us make this a memorable meeting.

Today, our first Scottish National Race Meeting since a Summer's Day in August 1955 at Charterhall, brings to Ingliston many of Britain's best National drivers. The entry for the main race of the day, the "S.M.T. Trophy" Race for Formula Libre Cars, in two 25-lap parts with prize money totalling £400, has almost the look of a Scotland v England needle-match with our two Scottish stars Bill Stein in the Ecurie Ecosse single-seater and Willie Forbes, the brilliant young Aberdeen driver in his own Lotus-B.M.W., coming face-to-face with the full might of the Ron Harris Team Lotus works Formula Two cars—usually driven by our President, Jim Clark and his team-mate Peter Arundell, but today driven we believe, by John Cardwell and another driver to be nominated.

We welcome back Jim Moore in his new F2 Cooper; many Ingliston regulars may remember his incredibly bad luck on his visit last year when he blew up his engine literally on the last corner and failed to finish as he free-wheeled into the Pits unaware that had he coasted round Merchants and over the line he would have won. Equally exciting, however, will be the Battle of the Giants, for we have no less than four American V8-engined cars. From Leicester Chris Summers has brought his 5.3-litre Lotus-Chevrolet; from Wrexham in Wales comes Robin Darlington, who has sprung into the limelight this year at the wheel of the Irish-built Kingcraft; from London comes John Macartney-Filgate in his Cooper-Chevrolet. But all three will find that we in Scotland have an equally-powerful contender to defend our native honour in the person of Jock Russell in the Russell-Ford—a Lotus 21 chassis powered by the V8 extracted frrom the wreckage of the prototype Lotus 30 sports car two years ago. A newcomer to Ingliston is E. A. Powrie's brand new Brabham-Climax and we are pleased to welcome back Dave Preston's Brabham from Nottingham, fully repaired after its contretemps with the barrier at Bankers last meeting.

The "King Hussein Trophy" race for single-seaters up to 1200cc has all the makings of a first-class race well worthy of the Royal patronage it has. Best-known of the English drivers is **Peter Gethin** in Rodney Bloor's F3 Brabham, entered by Sports Motors (Manchester) Ltd., but he will be meeting stiff native opposition in the person of **Andrew Fletcher** the Fifer who is currently second in the "Scotsman Trophy" single-seater championship for formula libre cars—no mean feat in an F3 car! **John Calvert** has been making quite a name for himself this year in **his** Brabham F3 and by now **Mike Gill** should have all the bugs ironed out of Ken Gregory's Brabham.

At the two meetings earlier this year at Ingliston, John Millar, the Bridge-of-Weir driver, has shown neat consistency of the type that should eventually be rewarded by the chequered flag. Chris Moore in the ex-Jim Sullivan Brabham, has been chalking up good placings at Brands Hatch, Snetterton and elsewhere down South, and we are delighted to welcome Londoner Mike Knight with yet another product of the Australian former World Champion. Knight has already won the

Japanese Grand Prix in this car this year and has a string of other successes to his name. **Ken Costello's** Brabham is the ex-Roy Pike car and should be very competitive. Two interesting cars in this race are **John Greenwood's** B.M.C.-engined special, and the brand-new Ecurie Ecosse-built Imp-engined car to be driven by **Bill Stein**. Greenwood is a development engineer with B.M.C. and he built this car last year. The Ecosse-Imp is an all-Scottish car, powered as it is by the Linwood-built Hillman Imp engine and it will be particularly interesting to see how it fares. Finally, the interesting monocoque F3 Ginetta will be in the hands of **Fred Wilson**. These two single-seater races promise some of the best racing ever at Ingliston.

Among the supporting races are two for Special G.T. Races, both of which are qualifying rounds for the "Sheila Whyte Trophy" Championship. John Corfield is returning to the fray once again from Peterborough with his Diva GT and John Milne will be out to uphold his reputation for being the first past the chequered flag in his races at Ingliston. Geoff Crossley hasn't missed a meeting in his Lotus XI since we started at Ingliston last year, and has put a roof on to comply with the G.T. regulations for this meeting. However, Nigel Morrison has just purchased the ex-Jimmy Mackay car which should be difficult to catch. Donald Carmichael has recently purchased the Alan Daykin Sprite to replace the M.G. Midget with which he has invariably been "in the hunt" at Ingliston. Most interesting entries, however, are in the over 1200cc event and these are headed by the incredibly-quick Jack Oliver in a brand-new Ford Mustang. This will be really interesting but we are not so sure that he will find **Bill Dryden's** Lotus Elan all that easy to beat. Richard Joseph, in another Diva, is, incidentally an ex-schoolmate of King Hussein. However, the three Ginettas are likely to be even more of a threat-Johnny Blades with plenty of past experience around Ingliston's tricky curves, Chris Meek with his G12 model having all the advantages of a Works car and John Burton with a V8 Martin engine under the bonnet giving about twice as much power as its stablemates! Jimmy Veitch doesn't let the grass grow under his Diva's wheels and could be up among the leaders as well.

For pure entertainment there is nothing quite like the saloon car races at Ingliston. Minis and Anglias which, though they may look like those you see in your mirror on the A8, certainly aren't likely to remain behind you for long; Chamois and Imps that go quite indecently fast; a battered Morris Minor 1000 that is always up among the leaders and an Austin A40 that goes as no other A40 ever did! Perdal Developments have been building up quite a name for high performance conversions, and there is no doubt that Graham Birrell should be favourite to win again today, but Sandy McCracken has rescued the engine and gearbox from his crashed racing Elan and has fitted them into an Anglia which should be poking out around 150 b.h.p.! Tom Christie, the reigning Scottish Speed Champion, has an indecently-fast Mini-Cooper 1275S and, despite spinning twice at the last meeting, managed to go on to consolidate the lead he built up in the "Hartley Whyte Trophy" Saloon Car Championship when he beat Harry Ratcliffe and Phil de Banks at the opening meeting.

Logan Morrison has the advantages of being an ex-works B.M.C. Rally driver in securing goodies for his Mini and his namesake Ronnie Morrison bought the very fast Bob Smith Mini last year and has been getting consistently faster as he gets more used to driving a Mini in place of his E-Type Jaguar! Ken Costello, Bill Heaney and Dick Grace—the two latter from Eire—won't remain content to let the Scottish drivers get all their own way. Heaney's car is a Downton Engineering works entry. Among the smaller-engined cars, Jack Oliver may well start favourite with Bill Borrowman and Ronnie McCutcheon renewing old battles and both with plenty of past Ingliston experience but he may not be the fastest Mini. There are three rapid 1-litre Anglias from Denis

Race-going and cameras go together. Members of the Scottish Motor Racing Club—the organising Club with a four-figure membership under its President, World Champion Jim Clark—have additional benefits this year, among them free access to the Paddock, barred to the general public. Membership Cards must be produced for entry to this and the MacRobert Pavilion.

Members are reminded that access is on production of their current Membership Card which will admit the holder, his or her children, and one other adult. The Club rooms are licensed and the bar will be open at lunch-time and from 6.30 p.m.

Members are also reminded that Dinner is available to them and their guests if tickets are bought at the MacRobert not later than 6.0 p.m. Dinner is served from 7.0 p.m.

Newcomers to Motor Racing may well be puzzled by some of the activities going on during the afternoon. Between every race the Course Car will be driven round by the Clerk of the Course or Chief Marshal, making an inspection of the condition of the surface and safety precautions. You will always know this car by the white flag it carries. Starting procedure has to be absolutely cut and dried, for it is not easy to keep a car running on the "grid"—as the starting line is called—without "creeping" forward, or without overheating the engine. Three minutes before the start a siren will be sounded and the cars will then move onto the track and complete a warming-up lap, forming up on a dummy grid at Merchants' Turn. The siren will again be sounded at 1 minute when the cars move forward onto the grid, and with 30 seconds to go the starter will walk to his rostrum. With 5 seconds to go he will slowly raise the saltire and drop it smartly for the "off."



At various points around the circuit there are teams of marshals whose duties are to signal by means of flags various information to the drivers. A blue flag held stationary means "there is a car close behind"; blue flag waved means "the car behind wishes to overtake." Yellow flag held stationary means "caution"; waved vigorously means "extreme danger, be prepared to stop." A yellow flag with red stripes signifies oil on the track, and a white flag means that there is a service vehicle (ambulance, fire engine, etc.) on the circuit. You may see an official at the finishing line holding a black flag together with a black-board on which will be chalked a number. This means that the competitor whose number is on the board must immediately slow and drive gently to the pits. It may be that observers have reported some parts of his car loose or it may be that in the opinion of the Clerk of the Course he is driving in such a way as to cause danger to others.


