



"For your days enjoyment!?!"—just about the last thing anyone would want to see is jovial Jimmy McInnes diarrhating into a mike. Good to see Doug Niven winning a trophy at Ingliston again, too.

FOR YOUR DAY'S ENJOYMENT

Welcome back, then, to the Lothian Sports Cars Trophy Race Meeting and what promises to be the usual feast of club racing entertainment this afternoon. As always there are a couple of new innovations to add that extra touch of variety, including per example, the first ever production sports car race to be seen in Scotland (at least, under the new regulations!). Another new feature (if it works, that is, which is far from certain the first time we try to stimulate the competitors into doing something different) will be the new "lap of honour" system, where we will try to let you, the public, see each race winner (and other notable personalities, if appropriate) in as near to "close-up" as is possible after each race. However, without races we can't have any winners, so what is on the card for today?

Special Saloons—the premier event at Ingliston, as always, is for special saloon cars and the feature race of the day, The Lothian Sports Cars Trophy Race, sees the traditional format of 2 heats and a final. For those of you who may be unfamiliar with the set-up here, the procedure is quite simple. Points for the Lombard Scottish Saloon Car Championship, the richest Scottish motor racing Championship, are scored from each of the 3 capacity classes in special saloon car races (up to 1000 cc, 1001—1300 cc and over 1300 cc). With so many competitors chasing points in that

Championship, 2 races are inevitable and, accordingly, these form the heats from which the fastest five from each class (together with the next fastest irrespective of class) are drawn to go forward to the main event of the day, the Special Saloon Car Final. With so much at stake (about £2,200 over the season) the action is fast and furious throughout, and none more so than in the enthralling battles we have seen in the 1000 cc class this season between the Imps of Lawrence Jacobsen (132), Ian Forrest (129), Hugh Chalmers (130) and John Fyda (143). To date Lawrence Jacobsen has just managed to establish himself in front on most occasions and nothing the others can do has yet proved effective in finding a way past: indeed, so successful has he been that he is in imminent danger of winning the Lombard Championship (and very worthily too!) but, with little more than a handkerchief covering these 4 cars normally, anything can yet happen, and probably will! In the 1300 cc class, too, no one driver has been able to assert his dominance and, while Big Iim Dryden (114) has taken top Championship points on 2 occasions, notice has been served on him by Dave Farrer (121) that the day of the Mini might now be over in the middle capacity class. As for the hairy heavy brigade, the position is wide open. Jim Evans (103) became the first man to watch when, in April, he "whispered" off into the distance with his incredibly silent turbocharged Escort and only holiday commitments, and the sudden hospitalisation of his wife prevented his re-appearance before today. Recently at Croft, however, Jim found that he had to give second best to Bill Dryden (100) who at long last seems to have mastered the transmission problems on his Firenza. Wins at Croft and "another Northern European circuit" recently will have given Bill his confidence back and, with the Firenza turning in practice lap times of 52.2 secs at the last Ingliston meeting, he must still be reckoned as the most powerful saloon contender at the circuit today. However, having 2 gearboxes fitted to the car can have its problems on a circuit where quick gearchanges are essential and, if you happen to hear Bill muttering to himself, "is it low top, top bottom or middle second I want?", have some sympathy for him! One of the features of saloon racing in Scotland this year, however, has been the return of


competitive 2-litre Escort racing and the leading exponents, Doug Niven (100), Walter Robertson (105) and Rosemary Smith (109), continue to vie with each other to see who can produce the lightest, the fastest, Escort on the track. These cars continue to improve with each outing and the battle between them again today should be another of this afternoon's highlights.

Libre-Yet another superb entry for the Scottish Motor Racing Club Trophy Race, giving yet another example of the material support given to the sport in Scotland by the Club organising today's racing. The obvious favourites must be the two Dickson's of Perth Moduses of Richard Scott (111) and Norman Dickson (707), these being the cars which took Tommy Reid's former outright lap record at Ingliston apart no less than 7 times in July of this year. The new lap record of 45.6 secs, eventually fell to Richard Scott and set the record moving again for the first time in over 3 years. Indeed, it took a mere 4 years for the average speed at Ingliston to rise from under 75 mph to top the 80 mph barrier (46.3 secs) and, until 25th July, that barrier still seemed to be the target to beat. However, now that it is on the move again, how long before we see the 90 mph barrier going (41.2 secs)? After all, it took only 8 years to push the average lap speeds up from 70 mph to 80 mph and, as with Tommy Reid's long standing record (80.43 mph), the early 72 mph record of our present Clark of the Course, Bill Stein, stood for 3 years before it tumbled-and after that early record tumbled, it kept on tumbling with accelerating regularity until it stuck again at 46.1 secs (80.43 mph). Need we take the comparison any further? Obviously not, or there'll be no space left to talk about the drivers! Watch out, therefore, for the Dickson's cars, and keep an eye too on Andy Barton's F2 March (1) and Iain McLaren's 2-litre Chevron B31 (2) in what promises to be a first class confrontation, with Andy and Iain determined to put one over on the Perth-based team.

Formula Ford—Placed, as he is, in an almost unassailable position in the Shand Carpets FF Championship, Stu Lawson (25) again starts as favourite today but watch out for Duncan Hall (44), Gary Gibson (24), George Franchitti (28) and Dave Philp (26), all of whom were motoring indecently fast at the last meeting and turning in sub-54 sec laps.

Sports & GT Cars—as usual, Iain McLaren (2) seems set to dominate event 5 but the ever present Clubman's brigade will doubtless enliven proceedings behind him. In the modified

Tel. 0224-54938/9 sports car class, the traditional battle between John Kirk (90) and Kenny Allen (85) seems to be swinging John Kirk's way for a change and Kenny will be out to make sure the trend is reversed. Keep an eye, too, on Peter Baker (69) who had John Absalom's Ginetta G4 motoring along really well last time out.

Production Saloons—Whatever else you may say about Ingliston, you cannae beat the saloon racing there, a sentiment expressed by most spectators after each production saloon car race this season. Not averse to leaning on each other for support around the bends, and using the back of the car in front in lieu of brakes (all highly dubious manoeuvres) these boys (and girls!) provide highly, and hairy, entertaining racing with each race producing a different skull at the front. (Having in mind the variety of sexes involved, the use of any other anatomical term might be deemed to be indecent.) It was certainly great to see Ed Labinjoh (155) back in there mixing it in July but the shock result of that meeting was the win by a greatly improved Andrew Small (157) in his conflagrating Capri! Only just making it to the line amidst clouds of smoke, Andrew held off the established giants (or midgets, depending on who's talking!) but almost certainly the entire Mazda brigade of Ian Stirling (170), Tom Meldrum (173), Vic Covey (174) and Chris Jones (175) will be out for revenge today, as will be Nial Mulloy in the Toyota Celica (158) and the ever ebullient Jenny Birrell (156).

Production Sports Cars—a new marque to Scotland, this, being the equivalent to modsports as production saloons are to special saloons. As with production saloons, these are the closest thing to road going cars that you will see on the tracks and, one hopes, as with production saloons the action will be fast, furious and, frequently, sideways! currently leading the Euro Burgess Championship (Southern League) for which this race is a counter, is Miss Valli Stack (81), a photographic model from Bradford who, apart from presently holding sundry class lap records throughout Britain, currently intends challenging the World land speed record at Utah later this year. Lock out, too, for Chris Meek's Europa (62) and the possible appearance of one of the works TVR. Apart from that, we'll be able to tell you more about this class of racing after we've seen it, but that goes for all the races, doesn't it! Which is one way of implying that the sooner we shut up, the sooner you'll be able to sit back and enjoy today's sport.




