





For your Day's Enjoyment ...

It scarcely seems credible to the band of enthusiasts who dreamed up the Idea of building a motor racing circuit in the grounds of the Royal Highland Showground that today should see the start of the fourth season at Ingliston. Throughout the past three years they have striven to make this little circuit more enjoyable to both spectators and competitors alike and that they appear to have succeeded is reflected in attendances which have risen steadily and in an ever-improving standard of entries. This is the first occasion on which a meeting at Ingliston has coincided with an English Bank Holiday week-end and as this is the only race meeting in the U.K. today we find a large number of English competitors whose names are almost household words among racegoers South of the Border. This does not mean that we have disappointed the home drivers, and especially in the single-seater races we have over the years found an ever-increasing percentage of home based Scotsmen. There are no less than seven Scottish formula-libre cars, any one of which could cross the line first and it seems quite likely that all will give the English visitors a close run for their money.

THE DRIVERS

Today we have one of the finest entries for a club meeting seen at this circuit and it is interesting to note the number of new faces in new cars. On the single-seater front we have received a top class entry with no less than four of the new Chevron Formula 3 cars in the hands of the top Chevron drivers, Alan Rollinson, Chris Williams, Dave Berry and Digby Martland. All have raced at Ingliston before, with Rollinson and Williams being particularly successful—the former in fact our Ingliston Champion in 1966; all are obviously going out to get the new Formula Libre Championship, the Callands Trophy, for the 1968 series.

The new Chevrons, though all 1000cc Formula 3 cars, have already shown their potential and with their superb handling and power-to-weight ratio they should readily challenge the larger-engined Brabhams. Again, 1967 Formula Libre Champion Andrew Fletcher is runing his twin-cam Brabham-Cosworth and over the winter has shuttled back and forth between Alva and Brabhams getting his car sorted out. However, two more Scottish drivers have bought Brabham twin-cams. One, finished in blue with a white arrowhead on the nose, will be driven by Bill Dryden and the other is the very latest BT21C model which has been bought by John Millar from Bridge-of-Weir. Between them the three Scots Brabhams should give the English Chevrons a run for their money.

John Romanes has his Lotus-Martin 35 on the grid again and is hoping for a more successful season, as is Willie Forbes with his B.M.W.-powered Lotus 35. Jock Russell had his Russell-Ford burned out during the winter, apparently by intruders, in his garage workshop, and has replaced the car with another single-seater into which he hopes to fit the salvaged engine 4.7 Vee-8 fuel-injected Ford from his old car. Ecurie Ecosse are running their two Ecosse-Imps again this year, with Bill Stein and Graham Birrell. Bill still holds the outright lap record set up in October 1965 in the Ecosse-Climax and this will be an important day for him as it marks his come-back to racing after a serious accident at Brands Hatch in 1966. Amongst the other single-seater drivers are up-and-coming Tony Charnell with his Lola Type 55, Tim Barchou from Sussex entered by the late Ian Raby's widow in yet another twin-cam Brabham and high-powered company for Jock Russell in far-travelled Chris Cox from Newton Abbot, driving a sister-model of Fletcher's car powered by a Buick Vee-8. Aberdonian Richard Scott takes to single-seaters with his Lotus 41 and lan Cochrane, who, like Scott, has been a familiar figure in the past in two-seater cars at Ingliston, is running an F3 Merlyn.

In the G.T. Race the Chevrons are again well to the fore with no less than three B.M.W.-powered cars for Alan Rollinson, Digby Martland and Nigel Morrison. Nigel is Ronnie Morrison's younger brother and has graduated from his familiar ex-Jimmy Mackay Lotus XIGT. John Nicholson is using his Lotus-23-based Jaynick G.T., now fitted with a new Lotus twin-cam engine and Darlington driver Stuart Robinson who went indecently fast last year in an Austin-Healey 3000 is bringing up a 4.7-litre Ginetta G10.

Saloons as usual are popular with all at Ingliston and we have our old friends Ronnie Morrison and Jim Dryden doing battle in their Mini-Coopers (the latter now fuel-injected) with the similar car of Bill Borrowman entered by the new Moir & Baxter/Sportstune team. Ronnie McCutcheon is making a come-back in this class with a Lotus Cortina but all eyes will be on Graham Birrell's Perdal Escort which will be making its first appearancpe. Brother Gerry Birrell's ultra-successful Shannon-Chamois has had its engine enlarged even further to 1300cc and will be out to defend the Hartley Whyte Championship which he won in 1967, along with the B.M.R.C. Trophy Club Members' Championship and the Scottish National Speed Championship. Andy Barrett is a promising newcomer worth watching although obviously outclassed with his bored-out 1100cc Mini. Fred Mills will be keeping Tom Sleigh company in his Jaguar, Mills' car having been the car successfully raced by Sir Gawaine Bailey in former years.

Among the smaller saloon classes last year's Chamois maestros, Tony Charnell and Logan Morrison, look like finding stiff opposition in the form of George Douglas, who proved indecently fast in the Club Members' Sprint a fortnight ago at Ingliston in his Hillman Imp. Bob Haining has also switched to an Imp this year (formerly Alistair Robertson's familiar yellow car), but it seems unlikely that Andy Barton will be content to let the Chimps have it all their own way. On test at Ingliston recently he found a new way into the Pits—sideways! Old faithful Jimmy Fewell and the legendary A. N. Other entered by Moir & Baxter/Sportstune make up the fastest of those cars in the second of the two races for smaller saloons and Ken Allen and Andrew Bonar in Mini-Cooper and Austin A40 look like renewing old battles in the slower race with dark horse Eric Howden a very likely challenger for the lead with his smaller-engined Imp.

Finally we also bid welcome to the first Formula Ford race in Scotland and there are ten cars entered. Man to watch is **Bob Ellice** with his Lotus 51 but Sportstune's **Ted Clark** and neighbour **Tom Walkinshaw** will be worth watching. Young **Bernard Hunter** in his first race will be finding his feet but has been consistently neat on Club Practice Days. **Mick Walker** could be the dark horse although it will be interesting to compare the Lotus cars with **Phil Kimberley's** Russell-Alexis. **Mike Peel** and **Gerry Birrell** are both well-known Ingliston regulars trying their hand in this class.

THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Today sees the first round of the various Ingliston Championships and also the first race for Formula Ford cars in Scotland. The Scotlish Motor Racing Club have always been lucky in having sponsors for a series of Championships covering most of the races run for the different classes. Heading the list in 1968 is **The Callands Trophy** Championship for Formula Libre Cars, with points gained in the principal races at each meeting. The best four results during the season are counted and, in company with all the other championships, the first six to finish in each qualifying race gain respectively 9, 6, 4, 3, 2 and 1 point. Prize money, which has been donated by a most generous

individual whose wish it is to remain anonymous, but who has probably done more than any other person to encourage motor sport in Scotland over the years, is for the first six places respectively £250, £150, £100, £50, £30 and £20. Today, the two races for the Edinburgh Students' Charities Cup are aggregated for the purpose of determining points for the Callands Trophy Championship.

The other single-seater class at Ingliston is for the comparatively new Formula Ford—cars powered by Ford Cortina engines on which only a limited amount of tuning is allowed and which must not cost complete more than £1,000. The Championship for this class will be known as the **Kings Cup** Championship. The Kings in question are that well-known firm of civil enginering contractors, Messrs. Kings & Co. Ltd., amongst whose directors is Nicoll Cuthbert, who has for the past three years provided mounts for Bill Dryden and Eric Liddell, and whose familiar red cars have become well-known at International circuits as practically the only Scottish team racing abroad regularly. Prize money for this championship—donated by Kings—is, respectively for the first four places £100, £50, £30, £20.

One of the best-known Ingliston championships has always been the **Hartley Whyte Trophy** Championship. At each of the Ingliston meetings the fastest 6 saloon cars up to 1000cc and over 1000cc are invited to take part in a final and points are gained in these races for the championship. Some of Ingliston's most exciting racing has been seen in these races as drivers challenge each other for points for this coveted award.

The Whytes, husband and wife, are both keen motor racing enthusiasts and Mrs. Whyte also presents the "Sheila Whyte Tankard" for the winner of the G.T. Car Championship. Hartley Whyte is a director of the famous Whyte and Mackay whisky firm — and has scarcely missed a meeting at Ingliston since its inception.

So much for the various classes, but members of the Scottish Motor Racing Club also have their own Championship, the winner of which wins the "B.M.R.C. Trophy" annually. There is quite an interesting story about this trophy, which was presented to the Border Motor Racing Club before it became the present S.M.R.C., by the secretary, lan Scott Watson. He in turn had purchased it from winnings in his first ever race, in 1953 at Charterhall, and those winnings were put up by the same donor whose generosity has provided the "Callands Trophy" and Formula Libre Championship prize money this year.

Throughout each of the past ten years in Scotland there has been a **Scottish National Speed Championship.** Points for this are gained in a number of race meetings, sprints and hill climbs throughout the year. The scoring is on a rather different basis, as it frequently happens that classes in Sprints are poorly supported and it was considered unfair to award someone the same number of points for finishing second in a class of 3 as for finishing second in a class of 20 or more. The scoring is complicated, but roughly the winner gets a number of points equal to the number of cars he beats, up to a maximum of 11, and each succeeding place finisher gets one less and so on down to 1 point for all remaining finishers.

Finally, today's race counts for the Lotus Formula Ford Champion-ship among a list of some 30 meetings throughout Britain. Furthermore, Lotus 51 Formula Ford car drivers will receive additional prize money amounting to £25, £15 and £7 10/- respectively for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place overall in the race.

Here you can find snacks served throughout the day but if you wish a full meal this is available to the general public in the Herdsman's Restaurant, to officials in a hurry in the Eglinton Restaurant, adjoining the Marketing Board Stands at the East End of the Grandstand, and to members of the Scottish Motor Racing Club in the beautiful MacRobert Pavilion in the central enclosure. Members should remember that the Club has also a Licensed Bar open during normal opening hours (Scottish licensing hours prohibit special licences on Sundays!) from 12.30 to 2.30 and from 6.30 to 9.30. High teas are served from 5.30 p.m. Lunches cost about 8/6d. in the Herdsman's and 10/- in the MacRobert. Finally, the Scottish Milk Marketing Board sell milk drinks of all types in their Milk Bar at the East end of the Grandstand.

MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION OF BRITISH TRAVEL AGENTS

Quite a lot of activity happens throughout the day and some of this may seem strange to the newcomer. All motor sport in Britain is strictly controlled by the Motor Sport Division of the R.A.C. and the controls are aimed at making the sport just as safe as is possible. Responsible for making sure that the meeting runs to schedule and runs according to the regulations is the Clerk of Course, whom you will see driving round the circuit between races in a car carrying a white flag, checking that everything is in order for the next event.. His "nerve-centre" is the Race Control Building in the Central Enclosure (the rather splendid glass box below the clock-mast), where he keeps in touch by telephone throughout the day with all the points around the circuit. The track is divided into sectors, each under the control of an Observer, and each equipped with a telephone. The observer has with him a number of different marshals; some of these are responsible for keeping the track clear for racing and for undertaking rescue operations in the event of an accident, others for signalling to drivers by means of recognised flags to warn them of dangers or let them know that a car behind wishes to overtake. The Yellow Flag is used as a warning in the event of an incident ahead; the yellow and red striped flag indicates the presence of oil on the circuit's surface; the blue flag is used to indicate—when held stationary—the presence of a car close behind, and when waved the fact that a car is attempting to overtake. If you are in the main grandstand you may also see a black flag displayed with a number on a board; this is a signal to the car bearing that number that he must return to the pits on his next lap and it usually indicates either a fault in the car which is visible to the observers but perhaps not apparent to the driver or that the driver has committed some infringement of regulations.

Starting procedure is designed to be as fair as possible to everyone. With highly-tuned cars, it is very difficult to keep the engines running indefinitely without trouble so a system which is universally used throughout the country is operated. Three minutes before the start of a race a siren is sounded and the cars then make a warming-up lap and form up on a "dummy" grid at Merchants' Turn. All except single-seaters must then switch off their engines and are checked for oil leaks. At the one-minute signal, engines are started and cars driven forward onto the starting grid. This means that anyone unable to start can be pushed off the circuit without holding up proceedings on the main grid. 30 secs. before the "off," the starter walks across the circuit, mounts his rostrum and drops the Saltire Flag. The end-of the race is indicated by displaying the Chequered Flag to the winner and holding it out for all others to see; drivers then proceed at reduced speed into the Pits at Merchants' Turn.



You may wonder where to get grandstand seats. These are available—or at least all those which have not been sold in advance—from a kiosk immediately behind the Crossing Point to the Central Enclosure in the centre of the main grandstand, with the exception of those for the Shepherds' Grandstand, which are available from a kiosk in the East Gate Courtyard. Prices for all tickets are 10/-, except for those in the East Wing of the Highland Stand which are 5/-.




