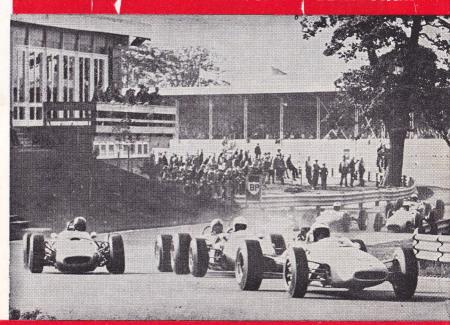

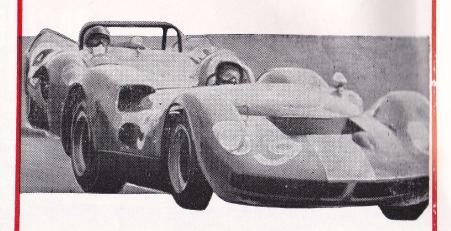

## For your Day's Enjoyment ...

To-day's meeting will be the third "S.M.T. Trophy" National British Race Meeting to be held at Ingliston, and this July date has become the best-attended meeting of the year. Last year saw the first appearance in Scotland of the fabulous Red Arrows Aerobatic Team of the R.A.F., and it is with particular pleasure that we welcome them back for one of their spectacular displays—with two extra aircraft to make an even more exciting spectacle.



To match this, another new venture is being launched for the first time, and this is the practice of running the main race as two heats and a final. Racing Cars under 1000cc will run in Event 1 and those over 1000cc will run in Event 3. This will give any unfortunate enough to need repairs to have their cars ready for the main event of the day—the 25-lap final for the "S.M.T. Trophy."

Two of Britain's leading Formula 3 exponents will be returning from a Continental series of meetings especially for this meeting and they are the works-sponsored Red Rose Motors team of Chevrons, driven by *Chris Williams* and *Alan Rollinson*. Both are old hands at the circuit, Rollinson having been champion in 1966. Chris Williams was acknowleged in 1967 as one of the five leading F3 drivers and—until May of this year—came nearest to beating Bill Stein's outright lap record at Ingliston.

The Frank Lythgoe Racing organisation has sold its Chevrons, and Dave Berry now has a new Brabham F3 car. Berry has been at both the previous meetings this year, finishing third in May but being eliminated in a race incident in April. David Porter is a newcomer to Ingliston with his T83 Cooper but should provide additional challenge to the F3 field. Porter works for Mike Spence Ltd. at Maidenhead, the successful firm founded by the late Mike Spence to market the Lotus-B.R.M. Elan cars.

Another newcomer to Ingliston is *Barry Maskell* from Leeds with a 21B Brabham. Scots honours in this class will be defended by Aberdonian *Richard Scott*, who has proved very fast in his ex-Lucas Lotus 41, *Ronnie McKay* from Thurso with his Shannon-entered Brabham (ex-John Millar) and *Graham Birrell* with the Ecosse-Imp, not entered by Ecurie Ecosse on this occasion.



There is a sextet of formidable Scots entries in the over-1000cc Formula Libre class. Most successful to date this year has been Aberdeen-based Willy Forbes with his B.M.W.-engined Lotus 35. Regulars at Ingliston must be particularly pleased to see Forbes doing so well this year, for he has been competing regularly at the circuit since its inception and until this year has been dogged by consistent bad luck.

Last year's Champion, Andrew Fletcher, is obviously not going to be content to let Forbes build up an unassailable lead in this year's Callands Trophy Championship and will be making a special effort to retrieve points lost largely due to troubles in obtaining a more competitive engine for 1968. Bill Dryden, whose father is Managing Director of S.M.T. Sales & Service Ltd., who are sponsoring the race today, has proved no sluggard in his BT21A Brabham and finished fifth in May despite the absence of a clutch.

The other three members of the Scottish sextet are *Tony Charnell*, whose T55 Lola has not proved so competitive this year, and *John Millar*, who had not had an opportunity to develop the B.M.W.-engined Brabham BT21B he entered in May. This should be rectified by today's meeting and he could equally well be in the running.

Probably the most exciting car on the track will be the sixth Scots entry, that of the stalwart *Jock Russell*. Jock's old car was burnt out in his garage during the winter but he salvaged the engine and has inserted it in one of the ex-Team Lotus Fl 43's. This is in fact, the car which was designed for the abortive flat-16 Coventry-Climax engine promised for the last year of the 1½-litre formula. Everyone will be pleased to see Jock in a really competitive car, for few drivers can try harder than he.

However, most interesting and potenially fastest in the over-1000cc class are Robs Lamplough with his 4A McLaren FVA-powered F2 car and Chris Lambert in a new BT23C Brabham. Londoners Lamplough and Lambert were both up at the Lombank Trophy meeting in 1967 and should have the advantage of knowing the circuit—particularly if it rains! Another Londoner is Alistair Walker with one of the ex-Team Surtees F2 Lolas. We are always glad to welcome Tommy Reid, the Ulsterman who used to be such a consistent supporter of racing at Charterhall in past years, and with his brand-new BT23 Brabham he should equally prove stiff competition to the Scots entrants.



Today certainly sees the most exciting entry in a GT race we have ever seen, headed by *Trevor Taylor* in the Gold Leaf Team Lotus. "Europa." Trevor, who used to be a team-mate of the late Jim Clark in 1962/64, gave up F1 racing but has lost none of his old fire and has been consistently successful in the Team Elite "Europa 47" in major G.T. races in Europe and the U.K. Team Elite are also entering their 47, driven by *David Preston*, whom some may remember driving the Brabham which Andrew Fletcher piloted to victory in last year's championship. *Johnny Blades* will certainly provide stiff opposition in his Chevron GT, and he again has been impressively successful in Europe. *John Hine* has returned with the Chris Barber Europa which finished second in the GT race to Taylor in October last year.

A new Scots GT car should provide interesting speculation and that is the Chevron-BMW GT of *Nigel Morrison*. A similar car has been entered by *John Lepp*, and doubtless there should be a dice here. There are two other GT conversions of the Lotus 23 among the large-engined cars in this class which could put the cat among the pigeons, and these are entered by *David Porter* and *John Nicholson*. Similar cars, but with smaller engines running in the same race, are those of *John Corfield* and *George Silverwood*, and further down the field there should be a dice between Dubliner *Arnie Poole* and Glaswegian *John Milne* in their MG Midgets.



Formula Ford has received very good support since its introduction earlier this year, and again we have a full field of these Cortina-powered racing cars. Harry Gilbert has been the most successful driver to date, with Mike Peel and Brian Squires close runners. Ted Clark and Bernard Hunter have proved fast and should bear close scrutiny, and by this time Gerry Birrell should have the Centro-Scot going well. Two works Russell-Alexis cars have been entered by David Walker and John MacDonald.

Saloons once again should provide much of the interest today, and one of the principal teatures in the first saloon race should be the battle between the *Birrell* brothers, *Graham* in the Wylies-entered Escort and *Gerry* in the Claud Hamilton-entered Chamois. However, still opposition from England comes in the form of Mini-specialist *John Handley* in a Cooper S entered by Don Moore, who used to be chief mechanic for Lister, whose Jaguar-engined car did so well in the hands of the late Jim Clark, entered by the Border Reivers.

Another quick Sassenach is *Mike Harding*, but at Ingliston knowledge of the circuit is a great help and *Davey Muter's* entry should not be overlooked. *Ronnie McCutcheon* has just re-entered the Mini field with a new 1293cc car and will renew his long-lasting battles with *Bill Borrowman* in the Moir & Baxter/Sportstune Team entry.

#### \* \* \*

Outstanding among the smaller saloons this year has been *Logan Morrison*, currently leading the Hartley Wnyte Championship with his Singer Chamois prepared by Alan Fraser. Two otner rapid Imps which snould renew battles left our wnen they both crasned at Snepnerds last meeting will be the cars of *Bob Haining* and *George Douglas*. *Anay Barton* was incredibly quick last May in his Mini-Cooper, coming right up through the field after a bad start. Visitor from the far South in this race is *Nick Waternouse*, back again with his Minnow-Mini.

#### \* \* \*

All in all, today's racing looks as promising as ever and should continue the tradition of providing some of the most exciting racing seen in Europe, viewed from some of the best facilities available.

A very welcome visitor to Ingliston today is the Rt. Hon The Lord Chesham P.C. We feel very honoured that Lord Chesham should be with us today, for he is Executive Vice-Chairman of the Royal Automobile Club and as such largely involved with the control of motorsport in the United Kingdom. Lord Chesham is also Chairman of the controversial Road Safety Advisory Committee to the Ministry of Transport and, we understand, is much concerned with the embryo Jim Clark Foundation. In his spare time he still manages to be Hon. Secertay of the House of Lords Motoring Club and we feel sure he will find much of interest on his first to Ingliston.

### \* \* \*

If you are a newcomer to Ingliston, you should first look at the map on page 18. Doubtless you will feel in need of some refreshment during the day, and there are snack bars in the Herdsman's Restaurant to the North of the main grandstand, on the ground floor of the MacRobert Pavilion in the Central Enclosure, in the East Gate Courtyard and in the area between Gardeners' and Shepherds' Corners. Here you can find snacks served throughout the day but if you wish a full meal this is available to the general public in the Herdsman's Restaurant, to officials in a hurry in the hut behind the MacRobert Pavilian, and to members of the Scottish Motor Racing Club in the beautiful MacRobert Pavilion in the central enclosure. Members should remember that the Club has also a Licensed Bar open during normal opening hours (Scottish licensing hours prohibit special licences on Sundays!) from 12.30 to 2.30 and from 6.30 to 9.30. High teas are served from 5.30 p.m. Lunches cost about 8/6 in the Herdman's and 10/- in the MacRobert, Finally, the Scottish Milk Marketing Board sell milk drinks of all types in their Milk Bar at the East end of the Grandstand.

There is always a fascination for motor accessories and a demand for the necessities of racing — goggles, racing overalls, stopwatches, etc. These can be obtained from Graham Birrell's mobile shop just opposite the Forester-Smith shop behind the grandstand.

\* \* \*

Quite a lot of activity happens throughout the day and some of this may seem strange to the newcomer. All motor sport in Britain is strictly controlled by the Motor Sport Division of the R.A.C. and the controls are aimed at making the sport just as safe as is possible. Responsible for making sure that the meeting runs to schedule and runs according to the regulations is the Clerk of Course, whom you will see driving round the circuit between races in a car carrying a white flag, checking that everything is in order for the next event. His "nerve-centre" is the Race Control Building in the Central Enclosure (the rather splendid glass box below the clock-mast), where he keeps

in touch by telephone throughout the day with all the points around the circuit. The track is divided into sectors, each under the control of an Observer, and each equipped with a telephone. The observer has with him a number of different marshals; some of these are responsible for keeping the track clear for racing and for undertaking rescue operations in the event of an accident, others for signalling to drivers by means of recognised flags to warn them of dangers or let them know that a car behind wishes to overtake. The Yellow Flag is used as a warning in the event of an incident ahead; the yellow and red striped flag indicates the presence of oil on the circuit's surface: the blue flag is used to indicate-when held stationary-the presence of a car close behind, and when waved the fact that a car is attempting to overtake. If you are in the main grandstand you may also see a black flag displayed with a number on a board; this is a signal to the car bearing that number that he must return to the pits on his next lap and it usually indicates either a fault in the car which is visible to the observers but perhaps not apparent to the driver or that the driver has committed some infringement of regulations.



You may wonder where to get grandstand seats. These are available—or at least all those which have not been sold in advance—from a klosk immediately behind the Crossing Point to the Central Enclosure in the centre of the main grandstand, with the exception of those for the Shepherds' Grandstand, which are available from a klosk in the East Gate Courtyard. Prices for all tickets are 10/-, except for those in the East Wing of the Highland Stand which are 5/-.

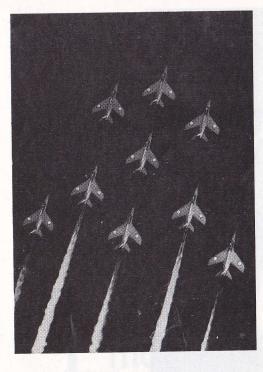

### The return of the Red Arrows

Certainly rivalling the motor racing in excitement today will be the return of the "Red Arrows," that incredible team of scarlet Hawker-Siddeley Gnat Mk. 1's which so thrilled the crowds at last year's "S.M.T. Trophy" race meeting at Ingliston.

This year the team have collected two extra planes and there are quite a number of new faces among the pilots. Squadron-Leader Raynham Hanna, A.F.C., 39-year-old New Zealander, is still the leader (as he has been since 1966) with Flt.-Lt. Derek Bell as his Deputy. Derek, who is 35, was educated at Coatbridge High School and subsequently Glasgow University and has been a member of the team since 1966.

Flying No. 3 is newcomer Flt.-Lt. Douglas Smith, who prior to joining the team was an instructor at Acklington in Northumberland. No. 4, Flt.-Lt. Peter Evans, has been with the Arrows since 1966 and has been in several R.A.F. Aerobatic Teams. No. 5 is another "old hand" with the team, Flt.-Lt. Francis Hoare, from London, who came to the team from flying Jet Provosts with the Syerston team.

First of the two "solo" flyers is Flt.-Lt. Roy Booth, 30-year-old from Hull, who learned to fly in Canada. As No. 6 along with No. 7, Flt.-Lt. Terry Kingsley, Nottingham-born newcomer to the team, Roy will excite us with those breathtaking opposite passes at low level over the arena at about 330 m.p.h.

Nos. 8 and 9 are both newcomers and likewise, at 25, the youngest members of the team. Respectively Flt.-Lt. Ian Hamilton Dick, a fellow countryman of Ray Hanna, who joined the R.A.F. in 1960, and Ft.-Lt. Brian Duckett, hailing from Dorset, who flew Lightnings with the R.A.F. in Germany before joining the Red Arrows in January of this year.

We mustn't forget to mention team manager Flt.-Lt. Lew Wilcox, who will be giving us a blow-by-blow commentary over the public address and has been looking after the boys since March 1967. But there are a huge team of engineers, led by Flying Officer Denis Whitby, who fly up in the team's transporter to keep the Gnats in the perfect trim that is so absolutely vital to the success of the show.

This is the 50th Anniversary of the Royal Air Force, and The Red Arrows are particularly proud that they have been honoured as premier aerobatic team. We have a sneaking suspicion that their near-perfect display at the Paris Air Show last year, when they undoubtedly stole all the honours (even if the Italian Fiats did look a little more exciting they broke so many regulations in so doing that they have been banned for future shows at Le Bourget), had much to do with their selection.

When they have completed their show today we hope to welcome them to watch the racing at Ingliston and give everyone a chance of showing their appreciation for such wonderful entertainment.

# Flying at Farnborough with The Red Arrows

By ROBERT R. RODWELL OF "FLIGHT"

Even the start-up was a carefully timed co-ordinated drill and the two-by-two taxying a choreographer's delight. Then we had the runway before us—leader Squ. Ldr. Raynham Hanna heading the forward vic of five, my pilot in No. 6 leading 7, 8 and 9 in a finger four to rear. "Reds, rolling—go," the leader said. And so, with 95 per cent. power, we went.

Once airborne we joined up into Diamond Nine formation and held height for a short while, awaiting the moment for the opening low-run in from behind the crowd. "Let's go down and see what the bumps are like." A wingover to port to kill some of the remaining time; "Run in in one minute," from the tower; then "All Clear."

"We're going to make this a hard pull initially," the leader said; and instants later we were flashing over the candy-stripe tents at 330kt. "The wind is about the same as yesterday." It seemed almost too casual. The heavy hand of g came on and we were going into a loop. "Back five, smoke—go," the g came off; all of Farnborough was 4,000 ft. above, or below, our heads, depending on one's viewpoints, and we were diving on it, into already shredding rags of smoke We had begun in delta and we emerged in diamond nine, bending away from the crowd at 280kt for a wingover to starboard. Then we were rolling ,still in diamond nine, the front five smoking, travelling fast towards Laffan's Plain. Another starboard wingover followed, with 200kt at the top.

"Draken—go," and outboard partners disappeared. We were heading at 45 degrees toward the crowd, pulling up into a Draken loop, using coloured smoke—red to port, blue to starboard. At the top of the loop yet another formation change, to Cutlass. We were bending past the crowd again, still in Cutlass, trailing back-end smoke, through 360 degrees—a long hard grind for the wingmen. Hanna's quiet call again—"Tightening." A small cluster of shadows chased us some way across the grass around the turn, and we were pulling up into a loop on a 45-degree line away from the crowd. We hit 4g on this one and the formation changed at the top back into diamond nine. For a second or so Hanna's aircraft hung, apparently motionless, a few feet ahead before Farnborough rushed at us. Recovery, out on the same line, and into a starboard wingover, and "Arrow—go" half-way through.

The wingmen provided colour and we in 6 turned on the white. Entering the roll at 280kt we topped it at 200kt. Low-g periods now seemed to be sweet relief, so much so that while enjoying an apparently weightless spell I was surprised to see the g meter registering nearly plus 2.

A big wingover follows. Two formation changes are made within in its quite short span. First big nine, with 8 and 9 right out to the wings. "Tightening," followed by "Vixen—go." We move sideways,

past the deputy leader at 3 to tuck in tight behind 5; No. 7 moves to starboard, thus forming the Vixen's other "boom" and being seen by us for the first time. We are heading for the president's tent (ground datum) and pulling into a loop again.

This is the split loop, completed by a box five with 6 and 8 and 7 and 9 shearing off in pairs. We climb and enjoy a pleasant spell of minus  $\frac{1}{2}g$  as we round out and dive to twinkle-roll as a pair in opposition to 7 and 9. This is the beginning of the "synchro stuff"—we close with the other pair at about 800kt as they hurtle up from Laffan's Plain. A blur of aircraft and crowd, tents and, at datum, a snap roll at about 400kt as we pass each other. It's a short-lived manoeuvre with a roll rate approaching 400 degrees/sec. Somebody says "Very nice," and we are hauling around Laffan's Plain, hitting five g again, while the front five roll in cross formation from the crowd's left to right. We are pulling round in a very tight and rather bumpy turn. It seems horribly close to the ground even if it is above the Farnborough minimum height limit of 100 ft.

We run in from Laffan's Plain at about 330kt for a four-point hesitation roll in opposition to No. 7. On these passes No. 6 sets up the datum and it's 7's job to avoid collision. A momentary thought that it is a strange thing to hang inverted not far above what is, after all, a trade fair, travelling at over 300kt the while—and we are rolling out, 7's smoke trail passing sideways over the canopy.

We exited the stage in a wide turn which gave us a distant sight of the front five in a line-abreast loop and going into vic formation while diving. Somewhere we had acquired 8 again and 7, too, has been joined by 9. In pairs we ran in over the north-west side, pulled up into opposing loops, half-rolled through 90 degrees at the top.

For the front five these are crowded seconds. Following a wide wingover to port in "exploded arrow" they are running from crowd left to right at 400kt for the celebrated twinkle roll. They open the formation slightly for this manoeuvre, having about two seconds to stabilise their speeds and position before the twinkle, running off the trim and ensuring that they are pulling no g before they roll, which would cause them to barrel. It's a particularly hardworking moment for the wing men. This time an added complication, with Hanna calling "Anyone get a bird strike?" as they hit a flock before the decision point. No affirmative, so—twinkle.

We are running in over from behind the crowd with 7 tucked in close astern; pull up, split left and right and once again 5g comes on as we cleave around the bend beyond the black sheds to make the Roulette pass, pull up to roll left and loiter behind the crowd. Over the airfield now are innumerable shreds of smoke and we see more added as the front five fly at the crowd in "leader's benefit"—line abreast save for Hanna, a pace or two in front, and all pulling into a loop. Over the top and down for a bomb-burst, all smoking, and we lose sight of most. All the Gnats are now behind the crowd and we are descending, in a gentle dive, from 4,000 ft., grunting as we hit the bumps. Left and right, very loose, other Gnats diving. "How's it looking?" the leader calls. "Bit open" is the reply; and then we're over the exhibition and pulling upward.

This is perhaps the visual climax of the Show, with the tricky join-up loop. We close again with Hanna's jetpipe—a shade too closely for a heart-stopping second or so as we approach the top. We are on our backs, Farnborough 4,000 ft. below, cemented back into that old diamond nine again. Out of the loop Hanna calls "Bending" on the recovery, for a wide formation turn to the north, for the final pass in "big 9" broad arrow. Up to the final loop, over the top, bomb-burst and landing.

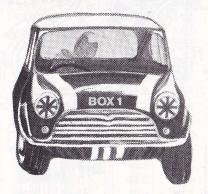
