





A new slant on John Absalom at the August Race Meeting.

FOR YOUR DAYS ENJOYMENT

Following all the excitement with the Super Saloons in July and the Castrol Touring cars in August, Ingliston "relapses" back into the good old clubbie spirit for this afternoon's Race Meeting (forbye returning to the normal "cheaper" admission and grandstand charges!). That is not to say that this afternoon's racing will be in any way inferior to the racing seen at previous Race Meetings — indeed, today's Meeting should be on a par with those already held this year in April and May. The new format of running "club race meetings", as standard with the occasional "special event", seems to be meeting with the public's approval and, since we cannot run a special event every day, we have to have the odd Club Meeting like todays. However, today's is slightly more out of the ordinary in that it counts towards the Scottish National Speed Championship (a Championship which covers not only motor racing in Scotland but also all other forms of motor sports in the Country). Accordingly, many new faces will be seen at the circuit, these being competitors from Hillclimbs, Autocrosses etc. etc. keen to score as many points as possible in the national Championship.

The first race of the day is for modified sports cars and, as always, the out and out favourite must be Northumberland driver John Absalom (55) with his Ginetta G4. Although John has dominated the modified sports car scene at Ingliston this season, one "new" face (although, a well kent one to competitors and motor enthusiasts alike dating back to the old Charterhall days) is Eric Liddell (58) who will be racing one of the Jenscot Jensen Healeys. Although never before raced at Ingliston, it will be interesting to see how the 2 litre Jensen copes with the 1800cc Ginetta! In the small capacity class of the modsports race, Ken Allen is entered with the (we've said it before and we'll say it again) unbelievable Clan Crusader. At the last Ingliston Meeting in August Ken, who has been demolishing the class lap record all season, again knocked this sideways with a fantastic lap of 54.2 secs., a whole second quicker than his previous lap record. Unfortunately, however, the Crusader suffered a monumental smash at Croft on August Bank Holiday and it is to be hoped that Ken will be able to have the car rebuilt in time for today's Meeting.

The second race of the day, the first heat of the Jock McBain Memorial Trophy Race for Special Saloons, also sees the aftermath of the said August Bank Holiday Race Meeting at Croft! Both of the special saloon "front runners", Bill Dryden (89) and

Dougal Niven (90), were involved in the entertainments at Croft that day. Apparently, although 25 of the 26 starters in the special saloon car event blasted off from the grid in dry conditions (and most were on slicks), on lap 5, as Bill Dryden put it, "everything just went black". The black clouds which had rolled in during the race promptly proceeded to pelt the track with a deluge of water, throwing in hailstones and lightning for good measure. So sudden and fierce was the freak storm that the race organisers at Croft immediately put out the red flag to stop the race but, for 23 of the 25 starters (poor old John Calvert, the 26th was pushed off the line even before the flag fell or, not so poor, is you consider what happened later) "immediately" was several seconds too late. With Niven and Dryden fighting for the lead they were totally unprepared for the sudden downpour and both cars shot from the dry track straight onto a vast inch deep puddle of water at Barcroft. Both cars promptly aquaplaned, Niver (leading at the time) going straight over the bank and destroying the front end of the Border Reivers' 6 litre Escort. Dryden hit the bank at the same place an instant later and ricochetted off twisting the body shell and damaging all four wheels. Although neither driver was, fortunately, injured, both cars were extensively damaged.

The incident at Croft has, therefore, "put the cat amongst the pigeons" for today's Special Saloon car race. Although S.M.T. have been working like slaves and are hopeful of fielding the 2.3 litre Firenza today, the car will have been almost completely rebuilt and could well be subject to teething troubles. On the other hand, bearing in mind their past history, S.M.T. are past masters at rebuilding to win and the Firenza must start today's race as favourite. (Surely a couple of Irishisms if ever there have been!). Dougal Niven, on the other hand, is almost certain not to have the Border Reivers' Escort ready and he has accordingly gone back to his Scottish Championship days by borrowing Colin Simpson's Twin-Cam Escort to race. Although a reliable car, this is considerably down on power on the leaders and, unless something happens to both Dryden and John Calvert (94), all that Dougal can hope for is to finish with at least some points in the Championship! The man who stands to gain from the Croft incident is, however, the man who was "unfortunate" enough to be pushed off the start of that grid — none other than John Calvert with his BDA powered Ford Escort, Should S.M.T. have any trouble with their rebuilding exercise, John is the man who must benefit and, with 13 points to his credit in the Scottish Championship today (including one win in May), another win today could put him up amongst the leaders. One of the joint leaders of the Championship, however, and one of the two men now "tipped for the top" of the Lombard North Central Scottish Saloon Car Championship is Carlisle's Eric Smith (104) who has now caught up with the original leader, Jirn Dryden (101) on points. Not only has Eric three class wins to his credit, however, but he has also been demolishing the class lap record during the season, reducing this in August to 53.6 secs., a searing 69.18 m.p.h. for a 1300cc Mini.

One of the other men jointly "tipped for the top" in the Scottish Championship is Sedric Bell (111) who is also jointly in the lead of the Championship at the present time with 29 points and who has made the 1000cc saloon car class at Ingliston his personal domain this year. The small saloon car race follows the bigger capacity event and once again sees Sedric leading a fine list of entries. As the season has progressed Dundee's John Fyda (122) has been giving Sedric more than just a run for his money although John's Agra Imp has not been as reliable as he might have wished! One newcomer to Ingliston, who may well prove an interesting entrant, is Gerry Taylor (131) with his 997cc BDA powered Ford Anglia. Gerry, a "Fish'N Chin" man from Lichfield City, has already clocked up class lap records at Mallory Park, Silverstone and Longridge and it could be that the Ingliston circuit might be well suited to a BDA-powered 1 litre Anglia! As the man says, we can but wait and see. Also expected to be giving the front runners a good run for their money are Ian Forrest (112) and Peter Pitman (114) while one of the biggest surprises of the August Meeting returns in the form of Duncan Fisher (119). Duncan completely astounded everyone by leading Sedric for three laps in August until the effort proved too great for him and he came off at the hairpin! Should he settle down today, Duncan could prove to be one of the biggest surprises of the season and he will certainly be worth watching in this event.

The next race of the day is for Sports and Special GT cars and, need we say it, the favourite must be Tony Charnell (62) with his Lola T212 FVA. Tony has already dominated the Hartley Whyte Championship for Sports and Special GT cars this year; indeed, he is almost unbeatable in this Championship now. However, as the season has been progressing, so too has the latest brainchild from the drawing-board of Edinburgh's Jack Fisher, the new 1570cc powered Fisher Spyder (66) driven by Ed. Labinjoh. Edward has done just about everything with this car bar win a race so far this year — he has achieved fastest lap in practice, he has led the race for several laps, but, unfortunately, he has not been able to maintain the pressure on the car. Indeed, Tony Charnell re-emphasised his dominance in August by thundering round in 49.8 secs., an average lap speed of 74.31 m.p.h. and equal to his existing lap record. Be that as it may, once the Fisher Spyder is finally sorted out, it will certainly be a force to be reckoned with and this afternoon could just be the Day. Also to be watched for are Les Aylott's BDA-powered Ardua Mk.4 (70) as also the amazing Ginetta of John Absalom (55). Indeed, these

two drivers enjoyed a first class dice in August, Less Aylott managing to avoid the, as he puts it, "infamous lavatory" by about 1'6"! (The lavatory in question is situated on the back straight just past Southstand and is fast becoming an Ingliston landmark!).

Following the GT event is the race for Production Saloon cars, a class which has suddenly come to the fore this year at Ingliston, producing some of the finest racing seen at the circuit. Nor was August an exception, the Production Saloon car race being one of the "races of the day" with Ed. Labinjoh (148) trying everything he knew in the Fisher's Garage (Edinburgh) Ltd. Alfa Romeo 2000 GTV to pass the flying Hunter of Bernard Unett (147). Behind these two came the dice of the meeting between husband and wife duet, Graham and Jenny Birrell, Graham (144) just pipping his wife (143) at the post. Indeed, this afternoon we can expect to see further excitements between the Alfa Romeo of Ed. Labinjoh and Jenny Birrell's Vauxhall Magnum while the rest of the pack slithers around behind! Certainly, 1974 has proved that Production Saloon cars can produce all the sideways and "all arms and elbows" racing that any spectator could wish to see. One newcomer who might perhaps merit a mention is Keith (Kipper) Wilson from Moffat (147) who fields for the first time ever a Ford Escort Mexico — although never having raced before, Keith has already made a name for himself in Karting, being both the West of Scotland and Border Kart. Champion.

With the possibility of something rather excisting for Libre cars in October, the local drivers will be out to notch as many points as possible in the BP Super Visco Scottish Libre Championship this afternoon and all the leading contenders are here, led ably by Irishman Tommy Reid (7) with his Brabham BT38/40. In August Tommy made no mistake about the Libre race, dominating this from beginning to end, his nearest rival Tony Charnell (2) finishing approximately 7 secs. behind him in the ex-Graham Hill Brabham Ford. Not having as happy a day in August as he had in July was Broxburn driver, Iain McLaren (1) with his recently rebuilt Rondel Motul M1 but both the Scottish drivers will be determined to keep the flying Irishman behind them this afternoon, the Scottish Championship still being wide open at the top end and any of these three drivers could still win the overall crown. Although today's race will, therefore, be extremely important, the main Libre race of the year (even forgetting about any question of a special Libre event) is scheduled

for October, the round of the Scottish Championship in October scoring "double points" and accordingly being the crucial one to win! Be that as it may, the Formula 2 single seaters of the three Championship front runners will doubtless be harried this afternoon by Andy Barton's Lotus 69 (now converted to Atlantic trim) and the GRD Atlantic of Glasgow's Doug. Thomson. All in all, all the ingredients for yet another Libre thrash to rival some of the fine racing seen from

this class so far this year.


The title race of the day, The Jock McBain Memorial Trophy Race for special saloon cars, is scheduled for 4.50 p.m. and this is, of course, the final of the two special saloon car heats earlier this afternoon. The fastest five cars from each of the three classes represented in those two heats go forward to this final along with the next fastest car irrespective of class. In case any of you are "wondering why" should a car appear on the grid which did not in fact complete its heat, there is power in the Regulations to allow such a competitor to take part in the final providing no other qualifiers are available but, in such circumstances, the "nonheat-finisher" is not classified in the results, does not receive prize money and does not gain championship points. For all that, he still gets his race and this is, after all, what it's all about! Having said that, the action up front will almost certainly be between Bill Dryden's Firenza (89) and John Calvert's Escort (94) while, should anything at all happen to these cars (bearing in mind our earlier comments) we can expect to see a second group harrying the leaders mercilessly in the shape of Eric Smith (104), Sedric Bell (111) and, if he can get his Twin-Cam Escort motoring sufficiently sideways, Doug Niven (90). In a way, it is almost a shame that the Border Reivers are unable to field their 6 litre Escort this afternoon, especially having in mind the association between the late Jock McBain and the original Border Reivers' racing team (which started lim Clark on his road to fame).

Following the presentation of the Jock McBain Memorial Trophy is the final race of the day for Formula Ford cars and this sees yet another mamoth entry led by a man who is now beginning to look like "Mr. F.F." at Ingliston, South African Kenny Gray with his Van Diemen Scholar (23). Kenny did not have everything his own way in August, however, since he found himself under intense pressure from Norman Dickson (22) and Graham Hamilton (49) at the last Ingliston Meeting, so much so that he spun away his chances of a win to allow the Perth based driver to score a fine win in the Meeting sponsored by his own sponsors

(Dickson's of Perth). The Formula Ford races have, in fact, become quite a "dog fight" up at the front end of the field and we can look for some exciting racing between Kenny Gray (23), Norman Dickson (22), Stu Lawson (25), Graham Hamilton (49) and Andrew Jeffrey (30). One man who has suddenly "rocketed" out of obscurity is Number 32, Duncan Hall from Edinburgh with his Hawke DL11 Scholar. A new engine fitted before the August Race Meeting suddenly saw him coming home in sixth place and Duncan could well be one of the "dark horses" to look out for this afternoon.

That's it then, the end of the second last motor race meeting in Scotland this year. Don't forget that the last race meeting to be held north of the Border is scheduled for 13th October when (providing sponsorship negotiations in course at the time of going to press are successfully concluded) something really special will be ahappening! Quite apart from anything on the "great" scale, October sees the Scottish round of the Scottish/Irish Production Saloon Car Challenge series and, if there is room on the "card", the traditional historic car thrash. Looking forward to seeing you all again then.
