



FOR YOUR DAY'S ENJOYMENT

With four race meetings under our belt and two to go the positions in the major 1976 Scottish Motor Racing Championships become more and more intriguing, so much so indeed that we're going to devote almost the entire Programme notes today to those Championships. Before getting too carried away, however, news of a major new sponsorship by Midlothian Insurance Brokers Ltd of 104 Raeburn Place Edinburgh-while their first venture into motor sport, M.I.B. have come up with a novel speed challenge inspired by Richard Scott's record shattering drive at Ingliston in July when he (and Norman Dickson) pulverised the former outright lap record which previously stood to Tommy Reid's credit for over 3 years. The new outright lap record at Ingliston of 45.6 seconds, is equivalent to an average lap speed of 81.32 mph and Midlothian Insurance Brokers are already setting the new target lap speed by offering an open challenge to all racing drivers competing at Scotcircuits Ltd promoted race meetings at Ingliston. The new target lap speed-an 85 mph lap (a lap time of 43.6 seconds)-carries with it a £1000 prize for the first driver to achieve that average speed in a race at Ingliston and, while the challenge is initially expressed to be for the rest of the 1976 season only, there is every indication that Midlothian Insurance Brokers will renew the challenge for 1977. A stiff challenge, perhaps, but one which is within the capability of some of the faster libre cars about and it is certain that more than one competitor will be out to relieve M.I.B. of the £1000 prize before they're very much older.

As for the 1976 Championships, there is plenty of stiff opposition there too! One thing to remember about all the Ingliston Championships is that, while they all run over the entire 6-meeting season at Ingliston, only the best 4 scores gained by each competitor count and there is therefore considerable scope for the tactical initiative of both individual racing drivers and the larger teams. Remember, too, that in many of the Championships points are scored not on the overall race results, but rather on placings in each class competing and that, irrespective of who may win a race, it is equally meritorious to be fifth overall but to beat all other comperable competition in your capacity/price class!

The Lombard Scottish Saloon Car Championship (see page 24 for points table)—the premier racing championship at Ingliston corrently led (just, and by virtue of a class lap record which gains an additional Championship point!) by Bill Dryden (100). Even Bill, however, would be the first to admit that he is lucky to be where he is at this stage in the season, his maximum 9 points for the May race meeting having been

scored from last place after completing merely 10 of the total of 15 laps! Bill, however, knows his regulations as well as, if not better than, the next man and, being the only registered competitor in his class (the over 1300 cc class) in the saloon final at that race meeting he knew he only needed to finish to be sure of maximum points. Lying second in the over 1300 cc class, and in 6th place overall, is Border Reiver Dougal Niven (101) who has been slowly creeping upwards in the Championship table. Both Dougal and Bill bettered the existing saloon lap record at the last race meeting, but Dougal's score of 22 points has been gained from 3 meetings only and a win today would give him at least 31 points, an equal score with Bill. Behind Bill, in 2nd place overall, is 1001-1300 cc competitor Dave Farrer (121) whose Escort has revolutionised the 1300 cc class. Although sporting 30 points, however, these have all come from high placings in all 4 race meetings to date and Dave can only improve his score now either by beating the 1300 cc class lap record or by winning his class. Jim Dryden (114), on the other hand is a mere 2 points behind and the bulk of these (27 points in all) come from only 3 race meetings. Jim can therefore afford to drop his May score and a win in class today, or in October, would push him up to a total of at least 36 points. The same logic applies to the 1000 cc class leader, Lawrence Jacobsen (132), who lies in 3rd place overall, a healthy 4 points ahead of his nearest class rival, Ian Forrest (129), despite the close nature of the racing between these two all season. However, at this stage in time, any one of the leading 6 Championship contenders could take the overall Scottish Saloon Car Crown, today's results being of crucial importance.

The Murchies Creameries Formula Libre Championship (for points table see page 23)—almost certain to be a cliffhanger to the very end, this series of racing has produced magnificent sport so far this year. By beating the favoured Dicksons of Perth team last time out the reigning Champion, Andy Barton (1), kept this Championship alive and put himself only 1 point behind the current leader, Ian McLaren (2). The Dicksons of Perth team, on the other hand, have rather split their effort to date between their two drivers, Norman Dickson (707) and Richard Scott (111), the honours going almost evenly between them (apart from an "extra" 4th place to Richard Scott in August, which might prove to be immensely important at the end of the day since, in the event of a tie on points in all the Ingliston Championships, the final position is determined by reference to the highest placings in all 6 rounds). The question today, therefore, will be whether Dicksons allow their drivers to compete as individuals this afternoon, or whether they function

as a team—if the latter is the case, then which driver will they put in as No 1 today. Whatever may be the case, while today's result will almost certainly decide the Dickson's team tactics for October (and it will be remembered that their presence here today was originally unscheduled, Andy Barton's win at the last meeting having forced them to attend to stay in with a chance in the Championship), the Championship itself will only be decided on 17th October.

The Shand Carpets Championship for FF cars (see page 18 for points table)—while Stu Lawson (25) started off the season in grand style, and must remain overall favourite (only one more win would clinch the Championship for him), Irishman Gary Gibson (24) gave himself an outside chance of the top Championship honours by winning the August FF race. And, even if he doesn't make the number 1 spot, Gary can't even count on a comfortable second place with Duncan Hall (44) breathing so hotly down his exhaust pipes that he (Duncan) equalled Graham Cuthbert's long standing class lap record last time out at Ingliston. And today, with the Alexander Motor Group Trophy on offer to the race winner, there's yet another incentive to the top formula ford drivers to put the wellies down even harder.

The Shell Production Saloon Car Championship (see page 15 for points table)—Difficult to say who's where in this at the present time since the Championship results must be counted as provisional subject to an RAC ruling on an Appeal lodged by Roy Knowles against his exclusion on eligibility grounds from the July race meeting. However, a string of class successes has put Tom Meldrum (173) in a marginal lead over the fast improving Andrew Small (157) although, Andrew's second place score deriving from 3 meetings only, he is well placed to overtake Tom's Mazda for the lead. Being in a different class to Tom too, Andrew is unaffected by the RAC appeal, but he is still vulnerable to attack by last year's production champion, Jenny Birrell (156), and by Graham & Morton sponsored Nial Mulloy (158) who, with a couple of class wins, could yet take the Shell Trophy. Watch out too for Ian Stirling (170) in the up to £2000 class!

The "Blue Riband" Championship for Sports & Special GT Cars (see page 20 for points table)—after Tony Charnell's unfortunate "meeting" with John Mackie at the last meeting, Ian McLaren (2) is well placed to take this title but, although the odds are now agin Tony winning the title overall, Tony (65) could yet redeem his self respect

and keep the "Blue Riband" out of Ian's hands by a couple of wins. By doing so he could open the Championship door to third place man, Allan Sharpe (74) whose extremely fast Clubman's drives (in a lower Championship class to McLaren) have passed almost unnoticed in the shadow of the more potent 2-litre cars and which have established him as the 1600 cc force to be reckonned with. As in the British Caledonian Championship, the 1300 cc class is a repeat needle match between Kenny Allen (85) and John Kirk (90) and, although Kenny has the edge points-wise, John Kirk's 5th overall position comes from 2 race meetings only! To say that Ian McLaren has this Championship sewn up would, therefore, be perhaps just a trifle premature!

The British Caledonian Championship for Modified Sports Cars (for points table see page 14)—Again a needle match between reigning Champion Kenny Allen (85) and John Kirk (90) although this time John Kirk has two meetings "in hand". With both leading contenders in the 1300 cc class, both Andrew Smith (77) and Peter Baker (69) have a chance of mounting a last minute assault on the top honours in the higher capacity class. Again we'll have to wait until October for the final verdict.

All of which is an excellent preview for the last Ingliston meeting of the year on 17th October, with pretty well all the Championships unlikely to be determined before then. Add to that a nostalgic whiff of Castrol R and methanol as the historics (ranging in past years from D-types to Bugettis, ERAs to the unbelievable 8-litre Barnatto Hassan Special) take to the track in their annual Scottish racing outing. PLUS a chance to meet the latest Radio 1 personality, ex-Radio Luxembourg DJ Kid Jensen, who takes over the Radio 1 Roscoe Show this month. Shake his hand, get his autograph, hear him commentate—all this and more at Ingliston on 17th October!






