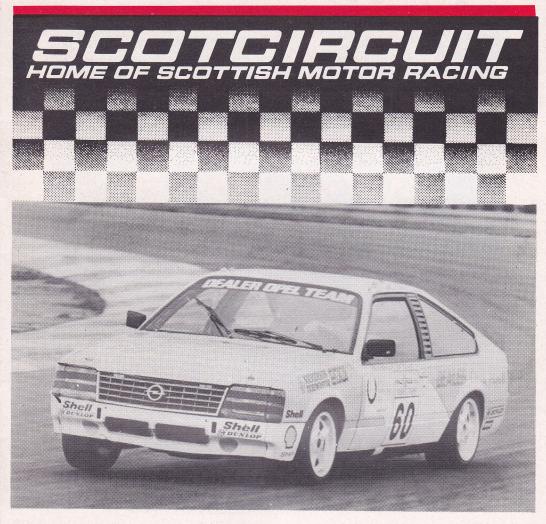

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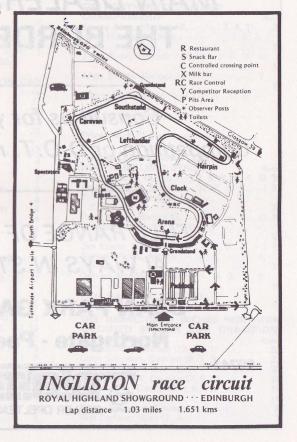

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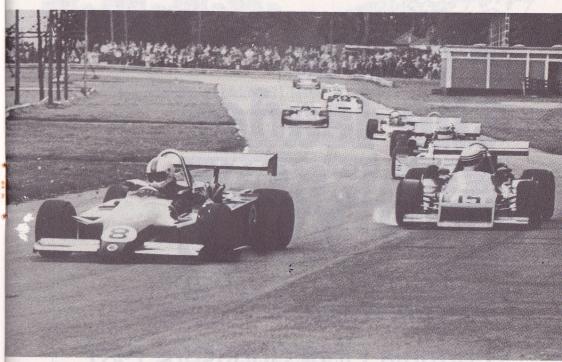
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David Leslie heads off lan Flux, Andy Barton and the rest at the start of last year's Atlantic Challenge.

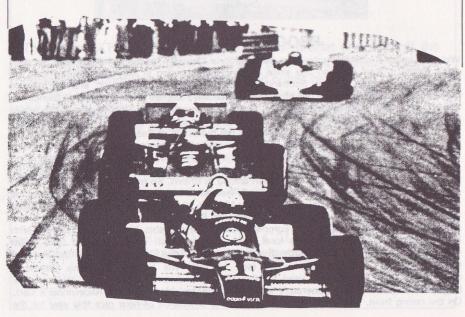
PROGRAMME NOTES

Welcome back to Ingliston today after our traditional "lay-off" for the Royal Highland Show in June. While it does seem an age since our last race meeting in May rest assured that the organisation of motor racing in Scotland has not been asleep in the interim, and the fruits of those endeavours are apparent this afternoon. On display, too, are our long-standing friends the Opel Dealers, who have chosen today to mount their fourth annual Opel invasion. The whole concept of banding together as many Opel Dealers as possible to provide both worthwhile sponsorship and a massive Opel "presence" is the brainchild of Peebles garage proprietor, Bill Cleland, and great credit is due to Bill for the immense effort he puts into the organisation. Not surprisingly Bill's interest does not rest simply with the promotional side of things - a lifelong motor sport enthusiast, Bill has done much behind the scenes over the past 5 years to bring the Opel marque to the forefront of competition driving in Britain. So much so that, at the present moment in time, the Dealer Opel team currently lead all three major British Rally Championships - the RAC Open Rally Championship (Jimmy McRae), the Irish Tarmac (Jimmy McRae) and the Autosport National Rally Championship (Malcolm Patrick). Scotland's Jimmy McRae is also currently lying third overall in the European Rally Championship in this, his first year with British-based D.O.T., while on the local front Douglas Riach (Inverness) and Gael Pollitt (Edinburgh) have already clinched the Scottish Group 1 Rally Championship in their ex-John Cleland Ascona. John Cleland himself (son of Bill!) will be out later this afternoon demonstrating the Opel Monza used for the TT and endurance races (a car simlar to the beautifully prepared Monza generously supplied by General Motors as our Racewinner's Car). On the racing front, the Opel Commodores won the Snetteron 24-hour race this year for the

second year in succession. And if you think we're trying to get the message across that Opel know their competition oats, we've succeeded!

Today, however, it's not the production saloons you've come to see (more's the pity, do we hear you say) but rather the Atlantics, battling for points in the British Atlantic Championship. Last August, when we had our first Formula Atlantic race, Scotland was at the forefront of the class, with David Leslie well on his way to victory in the 1980 National Championship. Indeed, in that race, the first five places went to Scots— David Leslie, Cameron Binnie, David Duffield, Bernie Hunter and Andrew Jeffrey (in that order). Sadly, today only David Duffield remains as Scotland's lone representative, David Leslie now|having moved on to Formula 3 (and, incidentally, congratulations to David for being one of the three winners of the "Drivers for Britain" Award — we all suspect that you, the Ingliston spectators, had not a little to do with that splendid result!) while Cameron Finnie finds the financial equation required this year to "rent-a-ride" just a bit too much to be realistic. So, for 1981, Scotland's honour rests squarely with Linlithgow's David Duffield (20), and a worthy incumbent he should be. One of his principal rivals, however, is likely to be one of last year's "fast" men, lan Flux, in the Ehrlich (15), with other leading Atlantic protagonists Alo Lawler (1), Carlos Ulibarri (19), Kim Mather (21) and 1979 and 1980 Sports 2000 Champion lan Taylor (3) mixing it in there as well!

All in all, the Atlantics can be counted on to provide a pretty interesting 50 laps, but the astute amongst you will have observed that today's **Akai Atlantic Challenge** race contains other than Formula Atlantic cars! In May we bemoaned the fact that, even for National Championship points, Ithelproduction saloon car brigade found the trip to Scotland to be a more

daunting prospect than popping across to the European circuits. Despite there being only half as many F. Atlantics as there are Production Saloons, many more Atlantic competitors have braved the wilds of Caledonia today although even they have failed to turn out in sufficient force to justify a full Atlantic race. Sadly, and particularly in today's economic climate, the costs of travelling from the South of England, and providing the necessary accommodation, act as a powerful deterrent to all but those anxious to improve their Championship position. Thus, the Atlantic race was in imminent danger of being cancelled. However, several libre competitors were keen to have a race today (even though no Scottish or Northern Championship event was scheduled) and sufficient libre entries were received to allow us to contemplate running both races together, in a "Superlibre Challenge". Please remember, however, that the two races are indeed that — two races running on the track at the same time — and that, while undoubtedly the competitors will enjoy a dice between the classes, the main portion of the race is the battle between the Atlantics for Championship points.

Joining regular Scottish libre competitors Stu Lawson (7), George McMillan (17) and Martin Dunn (18) in this 50-lap spectacular is Newmains mechanical maestro Robin Smith (12), today piloting the Formula 1 Surtees in the past driven with energy and verve (can I have a rise please) by Scotcircuits Chairman, Graham Hamilton. One of Robin's main reasons for taking to the tarmac today (other than because we pleaded with him, that is!) is to give newcomer Val Musetti in the Formula 1 Fittipaldi (10) a whirl. Val, a team-mate of Walter Robertson in the Colin Bennett Racing Stable, has already notched up wins in the Northern Libre Championship events at Oulton and Mallory recently, and today's outing could be said to be a recce for the Championship counting races later in the season. Successful as he may have been in the libre racing, however, Val's motor sport is very much a tame sideline to his professional life as a movie stand-in. Those of you who have recently trundled along to "Superman II" at the ABC will be unaware that the man you saw "doubling" for Christopher Neave in the stunt scenes, was in fact Val Musetti, and recalling what he was called upon to do in that film, racing must seem a pretty pedantic pastime to him!

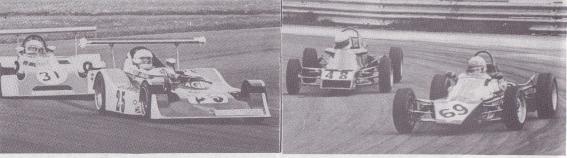
But enough of single seaters — what of the other races today? In Formula Fords (no prizes for spotting the deliberate mistake) we can expect a renewal of the season-long needle-match between East and West, Linlithgow's Roy Low (69) and Cambuslang's Tom Brown (48). Unfortunately, a needle-match is what it is becoming, and we can all only hope that both undoubteldy talented drivers resolve the battle for the **Shell Super Motor Oil Championship** in

a spirit of friendly rivalry hereafter. The preliminary FF race today is sponsored by your local friendly **Skipton Building Society**, followed closely by the first heat of the **Opel Dealers' Trophy Race** for GT cars.

In May you could have covered the leading three GT cars with a handkerchief as they crossed the line in the David Essex Race, but the drama preceding that race was intense and highlighted the hidden problems faced by drivers even in Club events. In the GT heat in May, for coming adrift and pivoting around in the Renault, making it extremely difficult for him to brake, etc., while slow puncture made the steering on Doug Niven's Beetle so heavy (particularly on right-handers — and there is only one left-hander at Ingliston!) that he was only just able to stand the strain long enough to finish the heat.

Both cars were fighting fit for the final, however, and today we this expect a repeat of the nose to tail battle between Jim and Walter Robertson's Skoda (105) in the **Opel Dealers' Trophy Race**. Look out too for fireworks in the 1-litre heat, where the Davrian battle between Harry Simpson (194), lan Forrest (190), George Coghill (180) and new Modsport class lap record holder Ken Murray (181) is hotting up. One of the most intersting developments though is Ricky Gauld's switch back into saloons, he fielding a Stiletto (170) again after a brief flirtation with the Davrians. Remembering that it was an Imp which ultimately triumphed in Jim McGaughay's hands over the Davrians last year could this be significant? Certainly, for Dave Ogilvy (130) and Bill Donald (129), the move is one guaranteed to present them with even fiercer competition.

One competitor sadly missed this year has been Clubmans ace Andy Smith, although his presence has nevertheless been felt indirectly through his sponsorship of Kenny Allen's 'A' class Mallock (31), and his ownership of the all-conquering 'B' class car driven this year by John Mackie (46). It is thus with pleasure that we welcome his company, **A. Smith Metals**, as sponsors of today's sports car race. Andy will doubtless be hoping that Kenny will be able to recoup part of the sponsorship fee in the form of prize money, while a former rival of Andy's, John Fyda (25), will be determined to deny him that saving. Throw in three Sports 2000 cars and a healthy 'B' class entry, and you have the makings of a splendid sports car thrash.

That's it then, the halfway mark in the 1981 Scottish motor racing season (to be exact, the half-way stage was about half-way trhough the seventh lap of the Superlibre Challenge!). From now on the tension mounts in the Scottish and Northern Championships as each series reaches its climax, and the beginning of that final "dash for the post" will be at our next race meeting on **16th August**.
