Once again Scotcircuits Ltd and the Scottish Motor Racing Club Limited, as promoters and organisers respectively of motor racing at Ingliston, are delighted that Lombard North Central, with whom they have both enjoyed an association that reaches back to the very start of motor racing at Ingliston, have re-affirmed their faith in Scottish motor sport by sponsoring the circuit's premier championship. As in 1973, 1974 and 1975 the major Trophy of the year will go to the class which has perhaps captured the public's imagination more than any other—the Special Saloons—and it is to the leading saloon car driver of the year that the coveted Lombard Challenge Cup will be presented. Without doubt, this emphasis on saloon cars at the Ingliston circuit meets with the whole-hearted approval of Lombard whose Scottish director, Gordon Skilton (a name well kent to all those interested in Scottish motor sport), has for many years had an intimate involvement with rally saloons in the Border Rally, yet another example of Lombard's expanding interest in the sport.

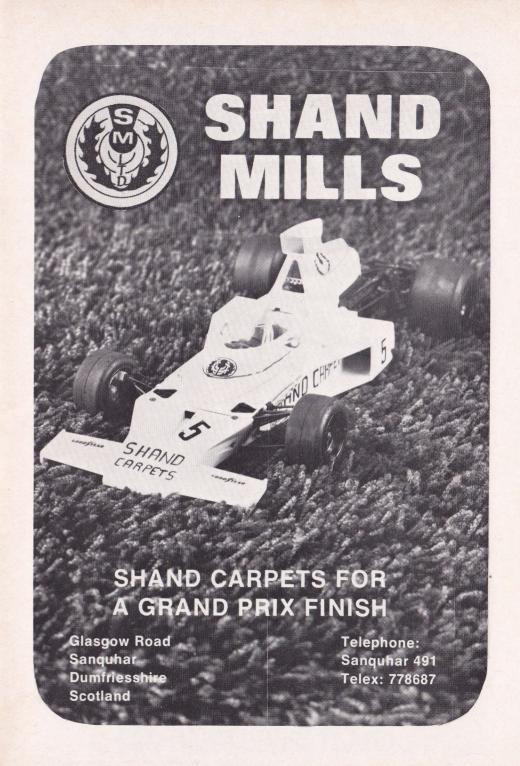
For 1976 the Saloon Car Championship retains the original "heats and final" appearance, it being contemplated that heats will be run during each Ingliston Race Meeting for all the classes in the championship (up to 1000 cc, 1001-1300 cc and over 1300 cc), the fastest five from each class (plus the next fastest car regardless of class) going forward to the final at each Meeting. The system of scoring, pioneered in 1972, gives competitors in each of these classes an equal chance of reaping the rich pickings for 1976 (overall 1st - £300; 2nd - £200; 3rd - £100; 4th - £60; 5th - £40 and to the winner in each class, a bonus of £50). Add to that magnificent championship prize fund a further £1350 (the estimated race prize money payable to special saloons in 1976) and it will easily be seen just why 1976 is likely to be one of the richest saloon years ever! On these figures, it is estimated that special saloon car racing is worth a cool £10.50 per lap in 1976! Scoring will be 7-5-3-2-1 in each class in the finals plus 1 for finishing each of the heat and final. As a tie-breaker (and to ensure that the rewards go to the most meritorious saloon car driver of the year) a further point will be awarded to any driver breaking the class lap record existing at the commencement of any race in which all 3 classes of eligible cars are competing simultaneously. Always premier in banking, Lombard North Central's continued involvement with the Special Saloon Car Championship at Ingliston sees them as one of the premier saloon car championship sponsors in the UK with a prize fund second to none.

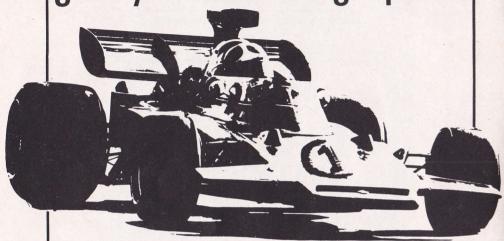

FOR YOUR DAY'S ENJOYMENT

Welcome back to Ingliston for the Heron Rossleigh Trophy Race Meeting, the first of the twelfth season of racing at the circuit voted by "Motoring News" to be the only 5-star rated circuit in the UK. That survey, based on spectator facilities etc, confirmed what we have been telling you for years—where else can you get such superb motoring racing value for money in Scotland, or GB!?! "Nowhere else", we hear you exclaim, and nowhere is exactly where we're going to get if we don't move straight on to a brief roundup of today's action.

Special Saloons—always the favourite at Ingliston, and certain to be no exception today with a host of heavy machinery competing for the Heron Rossleigh Trophy. Giving the new SMT Vauxhall Firenza Ecosse a preliminary airing is ex-Scottish Saloon Car Champion, Bill Dryden (100) while, with a newly reconstructed and lighter car. is Doug "Nibby" Niven in the Border Reivers Escort (101). This is the ex-Nick Whiting Escort which has been re-united with the original 1970 cc BDA which astounded the spectators on its first appearance in the super saloon car race here 2 years ago. Weighing in at 14 cwts and producing 275 bhp this car could be the ultimate weapon at Ingliston. Watch out, though, for Jim Evans 2 litre turbocharged Escort (103), which was second in last years super saloon race here and has received substantial modification since, and Graeme Walker's ex-Alec Poole Skoda S110R (104), perhaps the most impressive of last years super saloons. In the smaller capacity cars don't forget Iim Dryden (114) who has been experimenting all winter with 1300 cc Ford mills in his Mini, and the Forrest (129)/Chalmers (130)/Fyda (143) 1000 cc challenge. And, for a dark horse, what about Laurence Jacobsen (132) - if you're wondering why, if we tell you he's got Alex Clacher's old Imp will that make a difference? As is traditional, the special saloon car race takes the form of 2 heats and a final, the fastest 5 from each of the 3 classes in the heats (+1) qualifying for the final in event 8.

Libre—Last year's libre champion, Andy Barton (1) returns with his March 75B for (he hopes) a repeat performance this year but, this time, with considerable competition from the new Dicksons of Perth team who field one of the strongest

International challenges to come from Scotland for many years with Norman Dickson (707) and Dick Scott (1.11) piloting their two split new and highly impressive Modus Formula Atlantics. From "over the water" comes a long time Irish friend, Patsy McGarrity, with his Chevron B29 (3) who, despite winning last years Irish Championship, still came in for a bomb attack in Belfast recently—our sympathies to Patsy, a first class character who most certainly doesn't deserve that sort of bad luck! And to give the single seater boys a hard time of it, Iain McLaren will be chasing them all the way in his Chevron B31 1-litre sports car (2).

Sports & Special GT— Almost certainly, the action here will be between Iain McLaren's Championship winning Chevron B31 (2) and Tony Charnell's similar car (65) — Tony's is, in fact, one of the 2 cars brought to Ingliston last year by Ian Grob and it should provide healthy opposition to Iain "Steve McQueen" McLaren. Keep an eye open, however, for the sudden upsurge in Clubmans cars in Scotland since one or two of these cars could go indecently fast!

Modified Sports Cars—Let's just tip Ken Allen (85) and John Kirk (90) as likely favourites along with the Jenscot Jensen Healey (68) (driver to be nominated—what odds Campbell Graham?)

Formula Fords— As always at the first race meeting of the season there is a considerable surfeit of Fords! The whole entry is listed under event 3 but expect to see only the fastest 16 of these from practice competing in that race. Tipped to be in those 16 are last years Scottish Champion Stu Lawson (25), runner up in the 1975 Irish FF Championship Gary Gibson (24), Scottish runner-up John MacGilvray (27) and some pretty hot machinery from George Franchitti (28), Colin MacLean (32), Duncan Hall (44) and George Mundell (46). For those unlucky drivers who fail to qualify for event 3 (the only FF Championship-counting event), there will be a consolation FF race after the presentation of trophies, providing there are sufficient numbers to make up a grid (and, accordingly, if the numbers are not available, event 9 may have to be cancelled—if so, an announcement will be made as soon as possible to keep members of the public informed).

Production Saloons— the closest thing to the saloon cars which you drove to the circuit today are the production saloon cars, a class which has provided some of the most exciting (and sideways/backwards) racing over the past couple of years. With nothing but new cars here today we wouldn't even like to guess at the form but perhaps an eye on (no hands please) Jenny Birrell (156) in the Magnum Coupe wouldn't go amiss. Even if the car doesn't go (and it always has to date!), Jenny is generally accepted to be more pleasing on the eye than, say, Chris Jones, so you can't go wrong. And, if we had it, we might even be tempted to wager 5p each way on any of Doug Baillie (160), Andrew Jeffrey (162), "Plum" Tyndall (163) and, perhaps, Nial Mulloy (158). Which is more than we'd do for

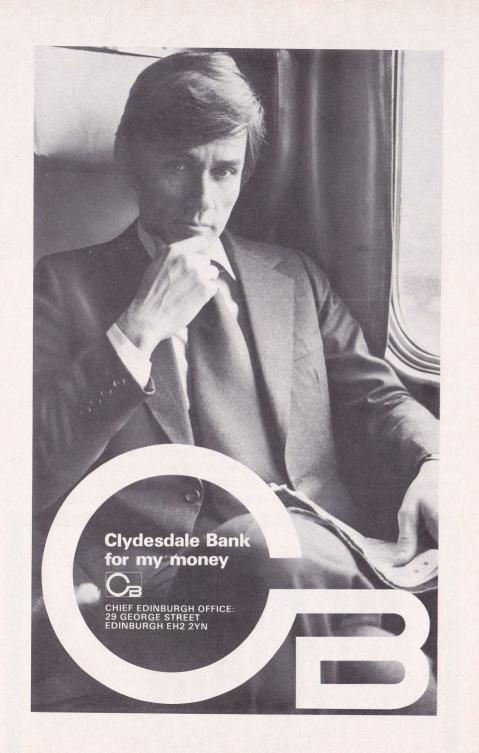

any of the "we're motoring backwards to Christmas" Mazda brigade!

Quite apart from the racing there will be displays by the Heron Rossleigh Fire Engine and a demonstration run of Barry Sheene's Suzuki! For the gourmets amongst you, good news! D S Crawford are back at the helm catering-wise with an entirely new style of appetising meal which not only tastes good but can also be obtained quickly and without (we hope) the need for extensive queueing! And for the rich amongst you (and don't say you left it all at the Gate), Edinburgh Students Charities campaigners will be endeavouring to part you from what you have—please give generously, it's all in a good and charitable cause. After all, by 9th May you should have earned enough to refill your pockets to return to Ingliston to see Noel Edmunds first Scottish racing appearance of the year!

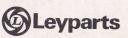

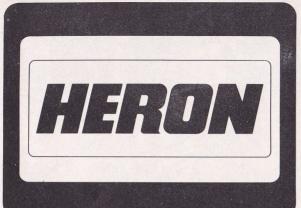

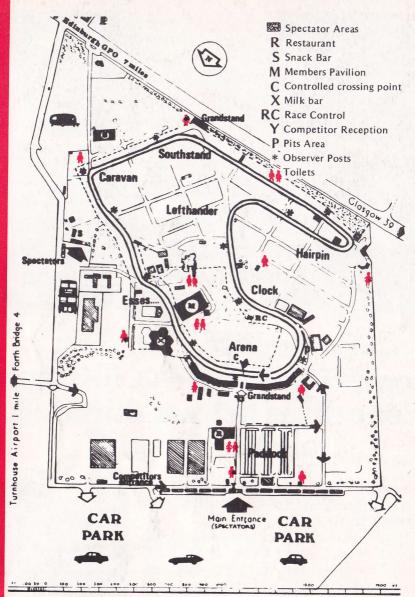
