

# THE JIM CLARK FOUNDATION

The Jim Clark Foundation was set up as a significant and lasting memorial to Jim Clark OBE, twice World Champion Motor Racing Driver, who was killed in a race at Hockenheim, West Germany in April 1968. The object of the Foundation, an international charitable trust fund, is to promote and assist research into motoring safety, both on the road and the racing track. Although based in Britain, the Foundation operates on a world-wide basis and its 26 distinguished Patrons are drawn from seven European countries and the United States.

Among major projects carried out by the Foundation have been a full-scale investigation into the effects of aerofoils when fitted to racing cars; the fire-resistant qualities of clothing worn by Grand Prix drivers; safety aspects of motor cycle design; and a study of the causes of all Formula One accidents during a seven year period.

In recent years the Foundation has been devoting much attention to motoring affairs north of the border. Last year the Jim Clark Foundation-Award for Services to Motoring in Scotland was inaugurated. This award is to be made annually, on the recommendation of the Scottish Motoring Writers, to the individual or organisation judged to have made the greatest contribution to motoring in Scotland.

The 1976 Award, presented in Edinburgh in February, went to the Scottish Motor Trade Association for its Used Car Consumer Protection Scheme.



#### FOR YOUR DAY'S ENJOYMENT

While there is further information about the Jim Clark Foundation earlier in this Programme, it is with considerable pleasure that Scotcircuits Ltd have named this race meeting The Jim Clark Foundation Race Meeting, both in memory of one of the greatest racing drivers the world has ever seen, and as an opportunity of furthering the international work being carried on by that Foundation. Jim was of course one of the founder directors of Scotcircuits and was no stranger to the Scottish circuit (although, curiously, the only time he raced here was in a milk float!). Accordingly, anything which will further the work of the Charitable Trust set up following Jim's death to honour his name is certain to receive Scotcircuits' fullest backing, and a substantial portion of today's "gate" will go to the Foundation. It is to be hoped, too, that the Foundation's renewed interest in motor sport North of the Border will again rekindle the great affection and respect held for Jim Clark, not only amongst racing addicts but also by Scots from all walks of life.

It is at this stage that we must acknowledge the debt owed to the Ford Motor Company in connection with today's proceedings. Not only has that company been instrumental in arranging for the presence of the Shellsport Escorts here today, their generosity has made it possible for a financial arrangement to be made with the Jim Clark Foundation, an arrangement which would not have been so fully possible otherwise. For many years one of Jim's foremost supporters, Ford, have since his death, continued to honour his name in many unspoken ways, and today's backing of The Jim Clark Foundation Race Meeting is yet another instance of this continuing obligation which Ford feel towards one of the most famous men who drove their machinery.

Our thanks must also go to Shellsport, sponsors of the now legendary "Shellsport Escorts" (again owned by the Ford Motor Company). These cars, which are theoretically prepared to an identical state of raceworthiness (although, naturally, there are bound to be minor variations between cars) provide perhaps the closest thing to "match" racing as is possible and, today, we will be seeing 12 of them contesting a 12 lap invitation race. In an effort to maintain equality throughout the drivers will choose their cars at random on race day morning, before practice, by "dipping" for the keys and, although they will practice and race the same car, the grid positions for the race itself will again

be chosen by lot. The draw for grid positions will in fact take place immediately before the "Shellsport" Challenge Race, in front of the main grandstand, so be sure to be on hand to witness the scenes of doggedly determined skullduggery almost certain to ensue as the 12 contestants elbow each other aside in the bitter struggle for the front of the grid.

Forgive us if we seem to spend a disproportionate amount of space talking about the "Shellsport" Challenge Race, but this is after all the first time such an event has been seen in Scotland. (It's likely to be the last time, too, if we send 12 banana shaped Escorts back down South, so would the drivers please bear that in mind and try not to become too enthusiastic!). The idea is to match 6 top Ingliston drivers against top UK rally and other drivers and one look at the entry list will immediately disclose the delights in store for you. Heading the list is the fastest Scotswoman on 4 wheels, Jenny Birrell. Although there has been a fair amount of Press coverage since the last Ingliston Race Meeting suggesting a "vendetta" against Jennifer, now that the "heat" has cooled somewhat, it is clear that this is not the case and that April 10th was just one of those unfortunate days when a series of misfortunes coincided. In such circumstances, it is not surprising that the rumours circulated freely although perhaps the most interesting such rumour to come out of the whole affair was that one extremely well known Scottish ex-Le Mans Racing Driver was reputed to have stated that, in his opinion, lenny could take on and beat any male racing driver given a comparable car. With 6 of the 12 Shellsport Escorts at their disposal, that was a statement that Scotcircuits just had to take up, and accordingly today lenny has the chance to prove the point today.

And who will she be driving against? On the racing side, Bill Dryden and Doug Niven just had to be given the opportunity both to "have a go" at each other in identical cars, and to renew a track acquaintanceship with Jenny (dating back to the days when she drove the Wyllie's Escort). Having in mind the Jim Clark connection to this Meeting, Dougal was an obvious choice in any event, being a cousin of the late Jim Clark, and it is hoped that he will fulfill yet another "family" duty earlier in the afternoon by demonstrating one of the prototype Lotus Cortinas raced and owned by Jim. It is the intention that Dougal, or another of Jim's cousins, will do a couple of timed laps in the Cortina before racing starts, to give spectators an idea of how racing speeds have escalated over the past decade. But back to the Shellsport Escorts—another eagerly awaited confrontation in identical cars will be that between the two most popular libre figures at Ingliston in recent years, Iain McLaren and Andy Barton. Although it is generally reckoned in such invitation events that the experience of the saloon car drivers gives them a definite advantage over the single seater drivers (and the last time lain McLaren sat in a racing saloon was in the '60s), don't forget that Andy Barton was

Powered by the most powerful F2 engine available, Norman will undoubtedly also have his eyes set on the £1000 challenge by Midlothian Insurance Brokers (for the first 85 mph average lap at Ingliston). Following a 140 mph accident at Croft on Easter Monday, Andy Barton's participation is perhaps somewhat uncertain, but even if he can't repair his car in time, a host of F2, F Atlantic, 2-litre sports cars and 'A' class Clubmans Cars will ensure a superb race.

Formula 2000/Sports Cars—Remembering the late Jim Clark's love of farming and agriculture, it is appropriate too that we welcome the RHAS back as sponsors of this race. We did say over the winter that we thought that 2-litre sports cars, FF2000 cars and Class 'A' Clubmans would be competitive together at Ingliston, and the last race meeting proved us right. Keep an eye open, therefore, for Ken Allen's extremely fast Mallock (43), Stu Lawson's impressive Hawke FF2000 (25), Dave Philp in the DB Racing Chevron (30) and Tony Charnell's Lola T212 (32).

Formula Ford 1600—With so much Ford backing about it's good to see Alexanders of Edinburgh back as sponsors to a race likely to give reigning FF Champion Stu Lawson (74) a hard 10½ minutes! Beaten into second place in April by George Franchitti (71), Stu also has an added challenge from Irishmen Gary Gibson (83), Ken Acheson (80) and Tony Templeton (82), all in brand new Crossle 32Fs. As with all the other events, as a rough "rule of thumb" to spectators who want to know who to keep an eye on, a quick glance at the Championship Tables will disclose the past form (always bearing in mind that, in some cases, class differentials have to be considered).

Production Saloons—Of the three fastest cars about in April, two return to do battle (Andrew Small not having submitted an entry for this race meeting). Look out, therefore, for Jenny Birrell (148) and Hugh Chalmers (142) renewing their April battle, a confror tation which Hugh had to relinquish at the last gasp only as his Capri "brewed up". Watch out, too, for one of the fastest of the under 2-litre cars, Ralph Halley's Opel Kadett (157), while a touch of variety is added by Ray Moore's very fleet Opel Commodore (149).

Modified Sports Cars—A chance for John Fyda (173) and John Kirk (179) to repeat their April dice, although at the time of going to Press, there was also a suggestion that Ken Allen might put in a last minute entry for his as-yet-unsold Clan Crusader. Interesting!

a saloon car "ace" himself for most of his racing career. Watch out too for the "diminutive" Kenny Allen, who could well shock the others this afternoon.

As for the non-racing drivers, Ford (who arranged them) have come up trumps yet again. Although at the time of going to Press Roger Clark was the only "probable" (all the rest. are "definites"!), the probability was pretty strong and there is every hope of seeing one of Britain's most successful international rally drivers here this afternoon. Nor need we say too much about Borderer, Andrew Cowan, who has delighted Ingliston audiences in the past with his spirited style of driving. Indeed, Bill Dryden (a director of SMT), has been heard to bemoan the fact that SMT only have 1 production saloon car since. with two such cars, they could field both Jenny and Andrew in a mindbending combination! Another well kent name in Scottish rallying, Donald Heggie, takes another of the Escorts as do the current leader in the Scottish Rally Championship, Drew Gallagher, and the man who won that Championship two years ago, Charlie Samson. Which leaves one car left over for Livingston "hot rod" ace, Kenny Ireland, giving hot rod fans a chance to see him in action against the best of Scottish race and rally stars. All in all, an unforgettable line-up and to the winner of each section ("racing" and "non racing") will go a well deserved (and needy) bottle of Glayva liqueur (supplied by Ronald Morrison & Co whose involvement with motor sport extends from the highly successful Glayva Trophy Race Meeting last year, to their sponsorship of the Scottish Rally Championship this year). All of which really leaves us very little room at all for the rest of the day's sport!

Special Saloons—The Jim Clark connection continues with Border Ford Main Dealers, John McBain & Son Ltd, sponsoring the special saloons today. As backers of the original Border Reivers (in which team Jim drove during his early career) and of the reformed Border Reivers (for which Doug Niven (101) drives), McBains will be anxious to see their team scoring a victory this afternoon, but Dougal (who clocks up his 150th race today in an 8 year racing career) which includes 54 wins, 29 second places and 16 lap records) has stiff opposition from Bill Dryden's Firenza Ecosse (100) and the devastating 2-litre sports car based Skoda of Jim Evans (103). Watch out too for Walter Robertson's Escort (105), Jimmy Robertson's turbocharged Escort (108) and the advent of Jim Dryden (107) in a "big banger". To the winner of the main race goes the Jock McBain Memorial Trophy and, although one may feel that the troubles of Ireland are far removed from Ingliston, it is worth remembering that, at the time of going to Press, this Trophy is still undergoing repair work following a bomb attack on the present holder of the trophy, Patsy McGarrity!

Libre—At last, the F2 confrontation eagerly awaited over the winter months, when Iain McLaren (2) and Andy Barton (3) pit their identical F2 Chevrons both against each other and against reigning Scottish Libre Champion, Norman Dickson's March 772 BMW (1).






