## **THE JOCK McBAIN MEMORIAL TROPHY**

Scotcircuits Ltd., the promoters of today's and every other day's motor racing at Ingliston, were recently delighted when Jim Clark, one of their Directors and the President of the Scottish Motor Racing Club Ltd., revealed that he was anxious to donate a trophy to them for competition at Ingliston which would symbolise for him the debt of gratitude which he felt to the late Jock McBain. Jock it was who founded the club from which the present Scottish Motor Racing Club stemmed and Jock it was who was patron of the team which first gave Jim a fully-competitive car to race.

Not only Jim but all our club members who recall Border Motor Racing Club days and the Border Reivers in the fifties and early sixties recall, too, Jock McBain's drive and enthusiasm and will join in thanking Jim for this wonderful addition to the splendid range of Ingliston trophies.

The trophy is in course of creation by Messrs. Hamilton and Inches of Edinburgh, who have given us this description of it.

The Trophy comprises an exact replica in silver of an authentic sports car steering wheel obliquely mounted on a wooden plinth and carrying an appropriate presentation plaque. The boss of the steering wheel has chased upon it in low relief an accurate portrayal of the Border Reiver motif, the original of which, known as The Spirit of The Border, you may see in Galashiels.

The Jock McBain Memorial Trophy is a perpetual challenge trophy and may be for different events or series of events each year. It has been decided that in its inaugural year the principal race of the Edinburgh Festival Race Meeting is as appropriate an event as any.

We shall be arranging to make the actual presentation to today's winner at the Scottish Motor Racing Club's Annual Dinner Dance held in the McRobert Pavilion at Ingliston in November.

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## **For your Day's Enjoyment ...**

... at the first Edinburgh Festival Race Meeting at Ingliston the entry list promises another day of the wonderfully close racing which is almost becoming synonymous with this friendly little circuit. This is our fourth car race meeting and for the fourth time we have had to turn down entries, so numerous have they been. Two of the classes—the saloon car ones—attracted such a large entry that we will be running two races for each class. There is one subtle change at this meeting; we have discarded the practice of nominating accepted reserves and everyone will have a chance to qualify for the actual races in practice. Only the fastest ten in each class can be accepted, but in an attempt not to disappoint too many competitors there will be two Consolation Races for those who failed to qualify in the sports, grand touring and racing car classes, to be held at the end of the day. Nevertheless, all should be over by 5.30 p.m.

Among the competitors we will be seeing a renewal of the incredibly close battle fought by **BILL FORBES** from Aberdeen in his Elva-B.M.W. and **ALAN ROLLINSON** from Staffordshire in his Formula Two Brabham. Rollinson withdrew from the 2nd Guards Trophy Race in July in deference to the untimely death of his team-mate the preceding week-end in a racing accident in Ireland, but he will now be trying to catch up points for the "LOMBANK TROPHY" Championship for Racing Cars held during the year at Ingliston. To date, the Ecurie Ecosse single-seater, driven by Bill Stein, is leading by two points from Bill Forbes with Rollinson three points behind. However, it is the best four meetings which count and Stein and Rollinson have only scored in two whereas Forbes has picked up points in three. Challenging these three for an outright win will be two very rapid Irishmen, **MALCOLM TEMPLETON** (Brabham) and **TOMMY REID** (Lotus). Both have driven at Ingliston at previous meetings and know the way round. Reid and Templeton have both been having marked success this season in Ireland and, along with **DAVID BRIDGES** from Lancashire in his Brabham, and **JOCK RUSSELL** with the hybrid Russell-Ford (powered by a 4.7-litre Ford V-8 engine salvaged from the wrecked Lotus 30 prototype raced by Jim Clark last year) there is every likelihood that the first **JOCK McBAIN MEMORIAL RACE** will be a truly memorable one. Other runners among the racing cars are **ANDREW FLETCHER** from Surrey and his Texan team-mate, **TOM BIBB**, and ex-R.A.F. Flying Instructor **MIKE GILL**, all in Formula 3 cars. **ANDREW GOOD-FELLOW** from Falkirk will be helping Russell to uphold the Scottish flag with his beautifully-maintained Cooper and New Zealander **ROSS PAYNE** makes this event almost an International meeting. The last five will all be competing for an additional award for the fastest car with an engine under 1000cc, as will newcomer to single-seat racing, **TIM FETHERSTONHAUGH**, who has done so well with his "big" Mini-Cooper this season.

**WILLY FORBES** will also be driving in the big Sports car race, and it looks as if it is odds-on that he should win, particularly as he was the first driver to break the 40-sec. barrier at Ingliston. Among the G.T. cars, **JOHNNY BLADES** from Whitley Bay, with his Ginetta, should find some stiff opposition in **SANDY McCracken** and **BILL DRYDEN** in their two Lotus Elan racing models. If the weather is unkind and the track wet a good start by **ANDREW COWAN** in the Border Reivers-entered standard Elan might prove a surprise, as it did at the opening meeting when it was a close second to Eric Liddell. **JIMMY RAE** with the M.G.B. has proved consistently fast at Ingliston. Among the smaller G.T. cars there are no fewer than thirteen "Spridgets" entered of either the M.G. or Austin-Healey variety. **JOHN**



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ABSALOM, the Northumberland farmer, with his Ginetta could prove a thorn in their flesh, though, and this, too, should be an exciting race. Competing in the larger-engined class, in a Sunbeam Tiger, will be GRAHAM BIRRELL and it should be interesting to see how he handles this potent machine. Graham will also be at the wheel of his incredible 2-litre Perdal Anglia, one of the most exciting cars to watch at Inglis- ton, in the saloon car race BOB BLAYLOCK has his very similar car entered, and both—with their locked diffs.—look (but obviously aren't) almost uncontrollable. RONNIE MORRISON is appearing for the first time at the wheel of the ex-Bob Smith 1275S Mini-Cooper which ran away with its race last meeting. This is a beautifully-prepared car and it will be interesting to watch how Ronnie takes to it after his 4.2-litre E-Type Jaguar. Another interesting vehicle in this race is the BLANCK- LEY Austin A40—hiding under its bonnet an MGB 1800 engine! What's more, it has ZF gearbox and rear axle and must be a really potent bomb.

One of the small saloon car races is almost an all-Scottish event, with no less than seven “Chimps”—Chamois and Imp variety. Claud Hamilton of Glasgow, have entered three of the former, to be driven by the brothers BIRRELL and ERIC LIDDELL, whose Elan will be at Brands Hatch tomorrow. However, it is the CHARNELLS—husband and wife—who will be gunning for them, and TONY is very, very fast. The other race will see a renewal of the battle between RONNIE McCUTCHEON and BILL BORROWMAN with GEORGE KENNEDY happily none-the-worse of his alarming incident at Bankers Bend last meeting, when he so nearly had to rob the bank to get home. ANDY BARTON in his remarkable Morris Minor 1000 can usually be guaran- teed to pull a few surprises from the kitty, and has been consistently successful at Inglis- ton.



Inglis- ton regulars know the “Herdsmen's Restaurant” with its adjoining snack bar, but it seems that not so many know of the extensive snack bar, open to the public, at ground level in the McRobert Pavilion in the Central Enclosure, nor of the smaller snack bar situated in the Courtyard at the East Gate and particularly handy for those using the terracing between Bankers' and Shepherds'.



Members of the Scottish Motor Racing Club, of course, may prefer to eat in their own Club premises on the first floor of the McRobert Pavilion and non-members who are envious of this privilege will find a Membership Application form later in the programme! Race-going and cameras go together. Edinburgh Camera Shop hold the concession at Ingliston on photographic equipment and they will be glad to see you at their mobile shop behind the stand to discuss or sell cameras or films.

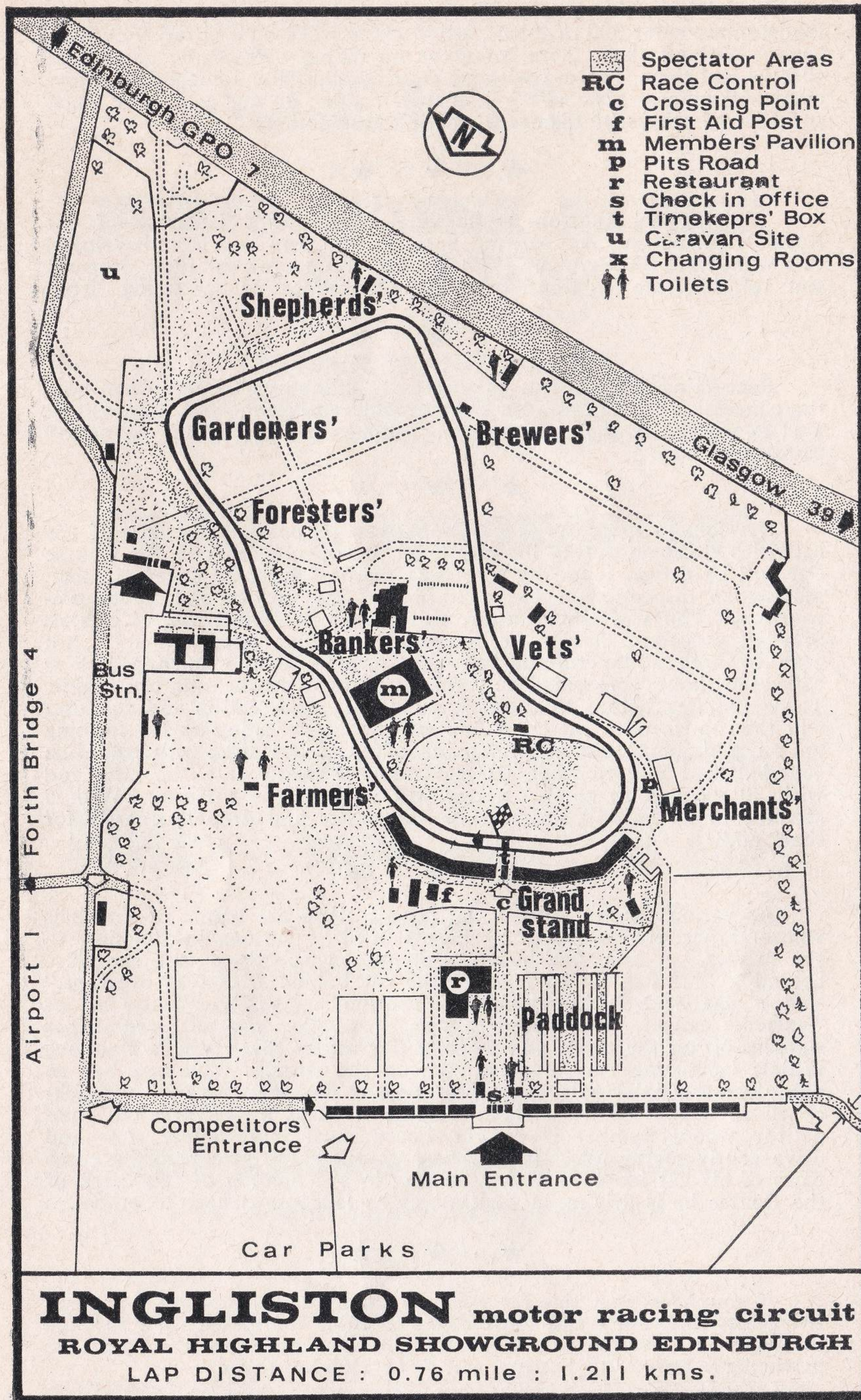
Newcomers to Motor Racing may well be puzzled by some of the activities going on during the afternoon. Between every race the Course Car will be driven round by the Clerk of the Course or Chief Marshal, making an inspection of the condition of the surface and safety precautions. You will always know this car by the white flag it carries. Starting procedure has to be absolutely cut and dried, for it is not easy to keep a car running on the "grid"—as the starting line is called—without "creeping" forward, or without overheating the engine. Three minutes before the start a siren will be sounded and the cars will then move onto the track and complete a warming-up lap forming up on a dummy grid at Merchants' Turn. The siren will again be sounded at 1 minute when the cars move forward onto the grid, and with 30 seconds to go the starter will walk to his rostrum. With 5 seconds to go he will slowly raise the saltire and drop it smartly for the "off."

★ ★ ★

At various points around the circuit there are teams of marshals whose duties are to signal by means of flags various information to the drivers. A blue flag held stationary means "there is a car close behind"; blue flag waved means "the car behind wishes to overtake." Yellow flag held stationary means "caution"; waved vigorously means "extreme danger, be prepared to stop." A yellow flag with red stripes signifies oil on the track, and a white flag means that there is a service vehicle (ambulance, fire engine, etc.) on the circuit. You may see an official at the finishing line holding a black flag together with a black-board on which will be chalked a number. This means that the competitor whose number is on the board must immediately slow and drive gently to the pits. It may be that observers have reported some parts of his car loose or it may be that in the opinion of the Clerk of the Course he is driving in such a way as to cause danger to others.

If you have read this far we feel you have read enough. So turn two pages to Event 1 and settle down to enjoy the racing right through to Event 11. On the way home tonight, remember that the roads are particularly busy with Festival and Bank Holiday traffic.

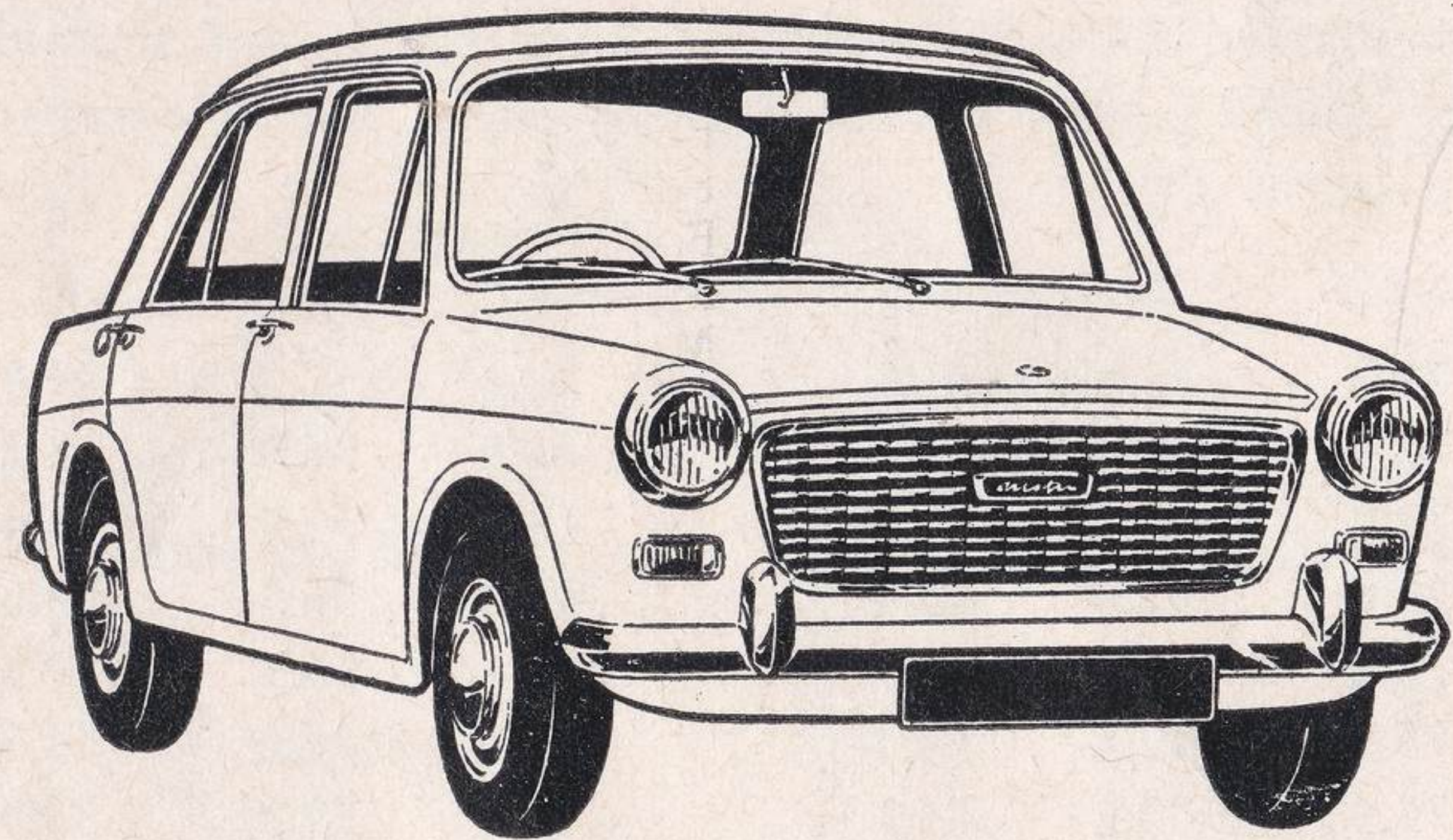
