For your Day's Enjoyment ...

There is promise of good racing once again from today's entry and this should be enriched by the struggle for points for the various Ingliston Championships. Foremost among these is, of course, the "Scotsman Trophy" Formula Libre Championship, sponsored by Scotland's premier newspaper group. The prize list for this championship, quite apart from the prestige of a win, makes it a most coveted award and competition will undoubtedly get fiercer and fiercer as the season goes on. The winner at the end of the season—the driver with the most points from four out of the six qualifying races—will receive a cheque for £250 in addition to the "Scotsman Trophy"; 2nd place driver's share of the prize fund is £150 and 3rd £100—a further £100 being distributed among 4th, 5th and 6th places.

The trophy itself was presented in 1965 to the winner of the first formula libre race at Ingliston and won handsomely by Bill Stein driving the Ecurie Ecosse single-seater on its first outing. It was designed by the Edinburgh School of Art and executed by Hamilton & Inches Ltd., the well-known jewellers and silversmiths. This year the sponsors have agreed to widen its scope and thus make it the principal award at Ingliston this year.

At the "Edinburgh Students' Charities Cup" Race Meeting last month, there was an exciting struggle for points between Bill Stein in the Ecosse-Climax, a car built specially by Ecurie Ecosse last year for this circuit and which now holds the outright lap record at an incredible 38.0 secs. round the twisting, undulating three-quarter-mile circuit, and Willie Forbes, the brilliant Aberdeen driver, giving his Lotus-B.M.W. its first outing. This is a most interesting car and is the only B.M.W.engined Lotus 35 in the country. Forbes had a most successful season at Ingliston in 1965 driving his Elva-B.M.W. sports car-a car which by no rights should have been winning places in a formula libre race where it was undoubtedly outclassed-and it is obvious that he was so pleased with the engine's performance that he was determined to fit the same type of engine in a more competitive chassis. Despite running on only three cylinders he gave Stein a very close race indeed in the second heat of the "Students' Cup" race in April after winning the first heat. On aggregate he conceded first place to Stein by 2 secs. Alan Rollinson, who won the Formula Libre Championship (sponsored by Lombank Ltd. in 1965) last year, was unfortunately hors-de-combat with an eye injury for the opening meeting but hopes to be back at the wheel today in one of the works-sponsored Formula Three Lola cars, entered by Frank Lythage. Although obviously outclassed by Stein and Forbes, we will be very surprised if he does not keep well in the running, for there is no doubt that Rollinson well-deserved his 1965 success at Ingliston and will be very keen to retain the championship. It would be particularly fitting if Rollinson were to win this race, for it is his team-mate, Adam Wyllie, that this meeting commemorates. Wyllie was killed in a most unfortunate racing accident in Ireland last year. One of the most popular Scottish drivers, and one of the neatest, he is sadly missed on the circuits. Many of his closest friends, led by Jock Russell, have contributed towards buying the magnificent trophy which the winner will receive for today's race. Russell himself will undoubtedly be keen to do well in today's race, and once again brings his Russell-Ford singleseater to the line, a 4.7 litre Vee-8 engine adding a magnificent sound to echo through the Ingliston grandstands.

At the April meeting this year a newcomer to Ingliston who showed considerable promise was the Nottingham driver, **Dave Preston**, with his Brabham. He is back again to try to wrest the honours

from the Scottish drivers and may well do so as he learns the circuit.

One driver who is particularly consistent, neat and successful at Ingliston is Andrew Fletcher with his Formula Three Brabham. Although there is no separate race for F3 cars at this meeting, we will be very surprised if Fletcher is not well up among the leaders and it will be particularly interesting to note how the F3 Brabham compares with the F3 Lola of Rollinson. A newcomer to single-seater racing is Jimmy Rae, a past Scottish Motorcycle Speed Champion, who drove Joe Potts' M.G.B. consistently neatly last season and will be seen at the wheel of an F3 Cooper this year. The Club's chairman, John Romanes, has a most interesting car in preparation which he hopes to have ready in time for today's meeting. This is a Lotus 35 (similar to Forbes' car), raced last year by the Willment team, and this year powered by a new Martin-Ford engine. This is a single o.h.c. conversion of the popular Ford Cortina engine, raised to 1875cc. Lighter and more powerful than the more popular Lotus-Cosworth twin-cam conversion of the same engine which powers, for instance, Preston's Brabham, it will be interesting to note the progress of this car during the season.

In the over 1200cc Sports and Special G.T. class, Bill Dryden will be out to repeat his win at the April meeting. but we are sure that this will not be to the liking of Richard Scott in Forbes' last-year's car, nor of Ernie Blackadder in the car in which Eric Liddell set up the G.T. lap record last year. Sandy McCracken will undoubtedly be out to upset the records at the same time and in the smaller sports car class his team-mate John Nicholson will be at the wheel of the Lotus 23B which he purchased from Norman Surtees at the end of last season. On form he should win this race, but in April John Corfield from Peterborough with his Diva, and the Edinburgh-built L.W.S. (Leith Walk Special) of Bill Turnbull both finished ahead.

As usual, much of the afternoon's fun will come from the saloon cars and, as usual, each race is fully oversubscribed. Although some of the drivers' tactics board on the doubtful, there is no doubt that the sight of the field nudging their wav through Bankers' after a mass start is something which no-one can easily forget. The fastest six in each of the two classes (there are two races for the class for cars under 1200cc) will compete in the "Hartley Whyte Championship" race (event 8) and there will be strong competition to earn these places. At the April meeting it was Tom Christie who, rather surprised, won this race by sheer consistency of driving after the two leaders, Phil de Banks and Harry Ratcliffe, had collided and pushed Dave Smith off the course in the course of their collision. But Tom is no mean driver, and holds the 1965 Scottish National Speed Championship after a series of brilliant drives at Indiston and other speed events in Scotland last year. Dave Smith, from Windermere, will be out to avenge his bad luck in April and the two Morrisons, Ronnie and Logan, will be determined to rejoin battle in the front line. Ronnie's car is ex-Bob Smith (seen today driving one of the Mini-Marcos in the up to 1200cc Special GT Race) and held, until Ratcliffe broke it, the saloon car record in 1965. Logan's has a works B.M.C.-tuned engine and he is, of course, one of the country's leading rally drivers (for Rovers at present). Duncan Fisher's Perdal Cortina should be worth watching, but it is really the Perdal Anglias which are most likely to steal the limelight in this class, driven by Graham Birrell, Alf Wright and Peter Dalkin. Altogether a most promising needlematch!

Among the smaller saloons, Bill Borrowman reigned supreme in April this year in the absence of Ronnie McCutcheon. The Wigtown driver will be out to make up for lost time but both will have to keep their eyes on their mirrors for the Singer Chamois of Gerry Birrell and the Hillman Imp of Tony Charnell. No Ingliston meeting would be complete without that incredible, tattered, veteran Morris 1000 of Andy Barton and he will almost certainly be up among the leaders once again!

The third Birrell brother, lain, will be giving his 850 Mini an outing in the first event of the day, in which are seeded the less powerful small saloons and he will be joining battle with Jimmy Fewell in a bored-out Mini and Bob Blaylock in his Ford Anglia among others. Also in this class will be the only lady driver, Corinne Charnell, upholding the Imphonours and not content to let her husband Tony have it all his own way.

We have an extra grandstand this year at Shepherds' Corner. Seats are 5/- each, un-numbered. First come, first choice of seat. Seats for this and the Highland Grandstand overlooking the start and finish, are one sale from 10.30 a.m. at the kiosk behind the main Grandstand.

* * *

No visit to a bleak airfield racing circuit could possibly give one the impression of motor racing that spectators have at Ingliston with its twists and turns, uphill and downhill. No circuit offers spectators so many amenities as does Ingliston. With the Herdsman's Restaurant (where one can obtain a three-course luncheon for as little as 6/6d.) and three snack bars there is the impressive MacRobert Pavilion for members of the Scottish Motor Racing Club—organising club at the circuit. There are almost 5000 seats under cover between the Highland Grandstand overlooking the start and finish (seats 10/-) and the new Shepherds' Grandstand at the top corner of the same name (seats 5/-). In addition there is standing room on timber terracing for a further 4000 around the circuit and plenty of space elsewhere for viewers who wish to enjoy the thrill and atmosphere of this most exciting of sports. For the benefit of those unable to come to Ingliston, Scottish Television have arranged to televise, live, part of the afternoon's racing.

* * *

Practice starts at 9.45 a.m. and should be almost as exciting as the racing. In practically every race 15 entries have been accepted but only the fastest 12 will qualify to race, so drivers will be trying their hardest to make sure of a place on the starting line. cars at Ingliston this year. "Special G.T. Cars" are Grand Touring Cars built specially for competition drives—such as the racing model Lotus Elan; Diva, Ginetta, etc. usually of limited production On the other hand "Marque" cars are basically Standard Production Sports Cars, such as M.G., Austin-Healey, Triumph and normal Jaguars.



Newcomers to Motor Racing may well be puzzled by some of the activities going on during the afternoon. Between every race the Course Car will be driven round by the Clerk of the Course or Chief Marshal, making an inspection of the condition of the surface and safety precautions. You will always know this car by the white flag it carries. Starting procedure has to be absolutely cut and dried, for it is not easy to keep a car running on the "grid"—as the starting line is called—without "creeping" forward, or without overheating line is called—without "creeping" forward, or without overheating the engine. Three minutes before the start a siren will be sounded and the cars will then move onto the track and complete a warming-up lap, forming up on a dummy grid at Merchants' Turn. The siren will again be sounded at 1 minute when the cars move forward onto the grid, and with 30 seconds to go the starter will walk to his rostrum. With 5 seconds to go he will slowly raise the saltire and drop it smartly for the "off."



At various points around the circuit there are teams of marshals whose duties are to signal by means of flags various information to the drivers. A blue flag held stationary means "there is a car close behind"; blue flag waved means "the car behind wishes to overtake." Yellow flag held stationary means "caution"; waved vigorously means "extreme danger, be prepared to stop." A yellow flag with red stripes signifies oil on the track, and a white flag means that there is a service vehicle (ambulance, fire engine, etc.) on the circuit. You may see an official z' the finishing line holding a black flag together with a black-board on which will be chalked a number. This means that the competitor whose number is on the board must immediately slow and drive gently to the pits. It may be that observers have reported some parts of his car loose or it may be that in the opinion of the Clerk of the Course he is driving in such a way as to cause danger to others.



Assisting in the organisation today and every other race day at Ingliston are some 300 marshals, all of whom work on a purely voluntary basis. Without them there would be no racing. Please do co-operate with us and them, because without your co-operation somebody's enjoyment will suffer. Your safety is in their hands; do not jeopardise yours and that of others by disregarding their instructions.

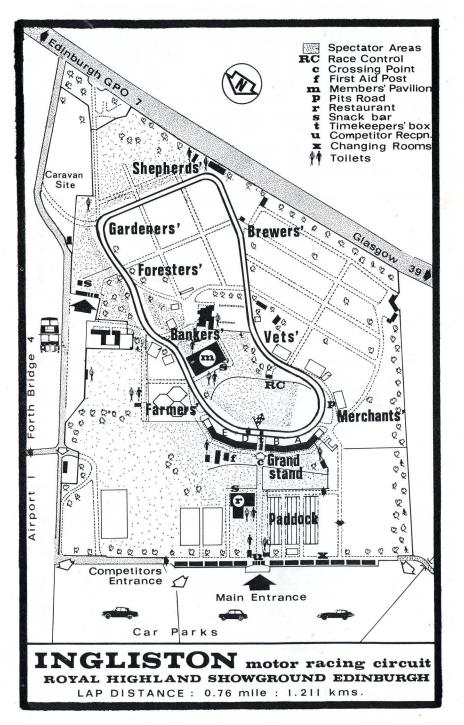

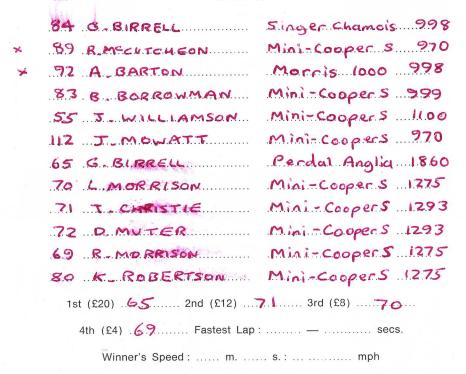
