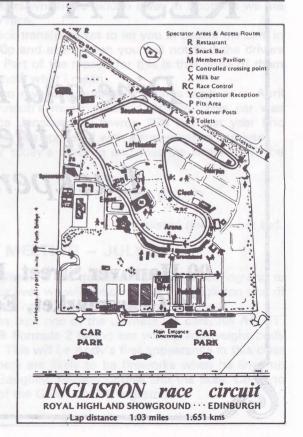

We hope you will enjoy today's meeting and that the weather will be warmer than last time.

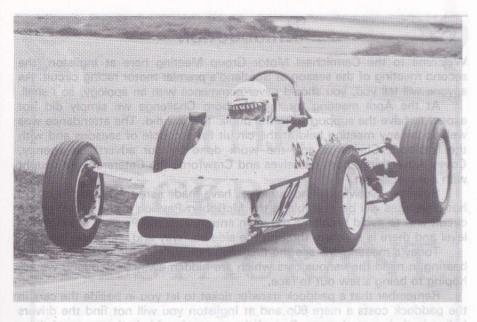

#### **NEXT MEETING — JULY 24**

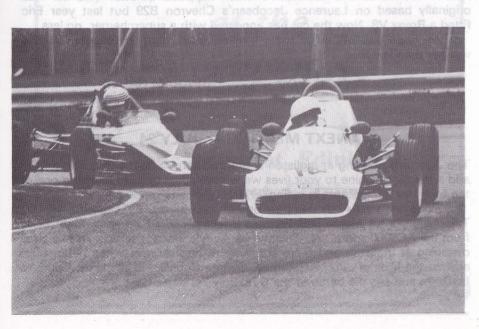
The July race meeting at Ingliston is the traditional Summer meeting and to add a ray of sunshine to your lives we will welcome back to Ingliston one of the toughest competitors in racing — Andy Barton from Newcastle.

Since last year Andy has built one of the ultimate GT cars, his AC-GT. This car uses his March 80B Formula 2 racing car with a lightweight body from the AC3000 sports car. This will be Andy's first appearance in this class of racing at Ingliston and there are likely to be fireworks when he lines up against the likes of Jim McGaughay, George Coghill and the likes. Come to Ingliston and see the battle of the GTs. July 24, Ingliston.

#### **TODAY'S MEETING**

Today's Carmichael Motor Group meeting is the second of the Ingliston season and with last month's race meeting setting everyone off on the right foot we are likely to see some fireworks today.

In the Formula Ford events, for instance, Tom Brown will be determined to maintain his reputation at Ingliston by winning the Marlboro Scottish Formula Ford Championship race, Event 4. It is quite surprising how here in Scotland the Formula Ford class has usually been dominated by one man. Before Tom Brown it was Stuart Lawson and Lawson won the Championship for a number of years.

The first event is a round in the Hubert Mitchell Scottish Junior Formula Ford Championship. Already after practice this morning the fourteen fastest drivers in the list here in the programme have qualified for race 4 and two of the drivers in this first race will go on to qualify for the same race. This means that there is a lot at stake for the competitors in this first race. Obviously it is difficult to speculate on those who will not qualify in the main race but for sure Ralph Halley will be in this race with his Crossle 50F as he happens to be sharing the car with lain Gardner and they can't both race in the same race. It is likely Ralph will step down and run in the first event.

The up to 1000 c.c. GT event which is a round in the Luckpenny Scottish GT Championship saw a surprise at the last meeting when Kenny Coleman with his R. J. Cross Peugeot Talbot Davrian whipped past lain Forrest with his Drambuie Davrian right in front of the stands. Kenny Coleman has always been a threat at Ingliston though in the past his enthusiasm has often led to the barriers. On this occasion he was on top form and when I noticed he was not wearing his glasses I casually asked if he was wearing contact lenses, "Oh no" he said, "I took my glasses off to save weight!"

In this race don't be surprised if Harry Simpson with his Edinburgh Aluminium Products Davrian doesn't steal a jump on the other two and lead everyone home. Also in there is the Aberdonian Ricky Gauld with his Mk 7 Davrian — the other three are the latest Mk 8 models — and he could also spring a surprise if his engine is right on song.

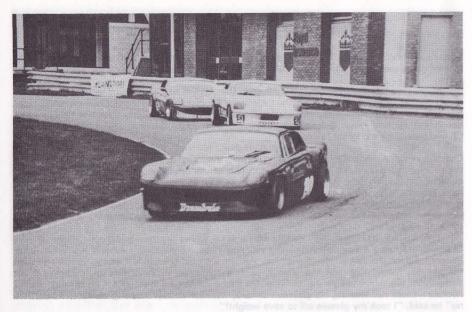
In the Royal Highland & Agricultural Society of Scotland Race for Sports and Clubmans Cars we are likely to see a three-part race because the A class and B class Clubmans cars are running with the Sports 2000 models. If John Fyda is headed in this race we can all be surprised but John Mackie, who has always been a successful driver at Ingliston is making a comeback driving Kenny Allan's Mallock Mk 21/24 and he could give Fyda a run for his money.

In the Sports 2000 class John Bothamley's Lola, given reliability, could give Brian Stevenson a surprise or two and John Clark who had such bad luck at the last meeting when a wheel came loose could also be well placed. The latter pair are driving Chevrons.

The Royal Highland & Agricultural Society are, of course, the owners of Ingliston and for 19 years they have acted as hosts to motor racing here at Ingliston. For them the highlight of their year is about to start in six weeks time, the Royal Highland Show and if you haven't come to a Highland Show well it is high time you did as it is much more than just sheep, cows and tractors, it is one of the most entertaining shows in Scotland. Mark the date in your diary.

Event 4, as mentioned earlier, will have all the quick Formula Ford men and keep an eye open for some of the newer names like Stuart Roden with his Van Diemen, Sandy McEwen with his Moore's Lemonade Crossle 32F and of course Chick Stenhouse with his Lee Cooper Van Diemen who won this race at the April meeting.

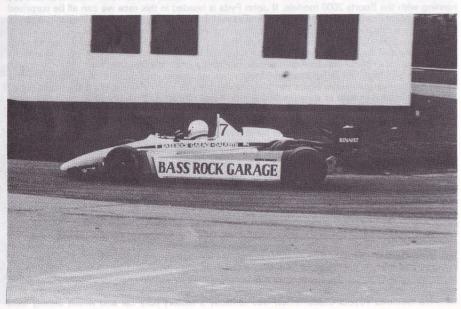
Event 5 is the Forth Electrical Services over 1000 c.c. GT race and there is a stranger in their midst in the shape of Andrew Fletcher. Fletcher was one of Scotland's most successful International sports car drivers in the early seventies. He raced Chevrons all over Europe with some success. He now farms in Pencaitland and has a collection of interesting racing cars one of which is his beautiful Chevron B16. This is one of the most stylish racing coupés ever designed and the car is thirteen years old. Andrew ran it for a laugh at the October meeting last year against the GT cars and surprised everyone by finishing second. Today he is out twice in this event and in the Historic Racing and Sports Car race which follows. Jim McGaughay is again out with his F.E.S. Renault and will be out to avenge his defeat by George Coghill in the Norfrost Lotus Esprit at the first meeting. Eric Munnoch's Rover V8 engined Chevron based Imp now has a supercharger added to it and it is a mighty handful. For fun watch Jimmy Fleming with his fabulous Toyota Celica which was formerly a factory rally car and which Jimmy uses

for the Scottish Rally Championship. The Historic race which is the first round of the McLaren Builders' Scottish Championship brings together the kind of mixture of cars we expected. There are a number of historic cars in Scotland and though the entry is small we hope that it will build up for the August and September meetings which also count in the Championship. Star of today has to be Roddy McPherson from Perth with his Cooper Bristol. Roddy is quite the most spectaular driver to be seen at Ingliston. His car is now over thirty years old and was originally driven by Ken Wharton the British Hill Climb Champion and Grand Prix driver. Just watch the odd angles the wheels adopt when cornering in front of the grandstand. For the record to add some interest a new class has been formed to accommodate post-Historic sports and GT cars which is why Andrew Fletcher's Chevron is running and the battle between Andrew and Roddy should be a good one. This new class also accommodates Geoff Todd with his rumbling Chevrolet Corvette which was built in 1965. Quite the most interesting car, however, is W. S. Gordon's Trice which is a real pre-war racing special.

In the Libre event David Duffield has to be the favoured runner as David broke the outright lap record for the circuit despite the cold icy winds of April. George McMillan in his Bass Rock Garages Ralt Hart should be his closest rival but there are likely to be some good battles further down the field.

Finally there is the road car class which had but four entries with two late entrants in April. It was so much fun that we now have nine entries and probably the odd late entry.

Douglas Niven will be worth watching as his former glory at Ingliston has left him with a knowledge of all the best lines through the corners. Tony Stubbs from Ripley deserves a warm welcome as he heard about the Road Car Class and has driven all the way from the south with his BMW 323i to take part. This car is finished to the same specification as the cars in the BMW County Challenge of two years ago. Jimmy Fleming will be out again with the Toyota but this time on road tyres and his handling of the car has to be seen to be believed.

We hope you will enjoy your racing today and look forward to seeing you on July 24 at the

next meeting which should be something special.

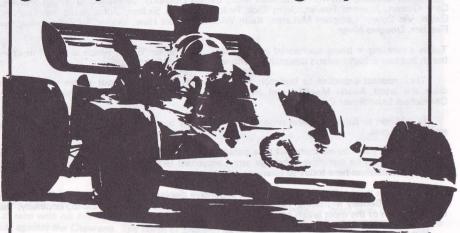
