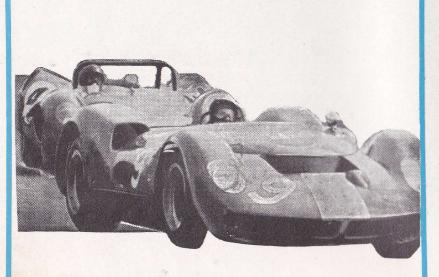

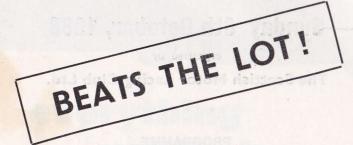

### For your Day's Enjoyment ...

For today's final meeting of the 1968 motor racing season at Ingliston the entry, in numbers, is lower than usual but we think most enthusiasts will agree that the quality is maintained. At today's meeting we are in for some interesting attacks on the lap records set at the last meeting when the new extension was added to the track. This was well received on the whole by all the competitors and most of them now know the direction the track takes.

The main event at today's meeting is the Lombank Trophy and the meeting has been sponsored by Lombank the well known finance company and the entry of racing cars has rarely been as good as it is today.

Probably the greatest interest will lie in the first appearance in Scotland of the very latest Lotus 4IX, the "wedge shaped" Formula III car which will be driven by Gold Leaf Team Lotus factory driver John Miles who last visited Ingliston at this meeing last year. Miles has had a successful year and in addition to driving the Lotus 4IX will drive a Lotus 47 along with the up and coming Australian Tim Schenken in the G.T. race.

Miles will not have his own way in the Formula Libre event, however, as a number of drivers from South of the Border are taking part as well as the most successful drivers at Ingliston, the Scots Wille Forbes, Richard Scott, Andrew Fletcher and Bill Dryden. Peter Gaydon makes his first appearance in the Special Motor Racing Team Formula III Titan. Then there is Peter Hanson the up and coming Yorkshire driver in a Brabham BT21, Simon Saye in the ex-Frank Williams Brabham BT21 and Kinny Lal who has entered a Brabham BT21 under the Banner of Team India. This must surely be the first time an Indian has taken part in racing at Ingliston and we welcome him here today.

Scotcircuits Chairman John Romanes has had a quiet year on the sidelines with his Lotus but the new Coventry Climax 2.5 litre engine arrived just a few days ago and he hopes to run the car for the first time today. This engine was specially built up from parts from the former Coventry Climax racing stock and it should be an interesting car to see in action. Another new car which is on the reserve list and might not appear due to tightness of development time is the new Fisher-Alfa built by Jack Fisher the well known Edinburgh Alfa-Romeo distributor. The car is a single seater which was designed by Jack last winter and has been awaiting its 1600cc Alfa-Romeo engine which was prepared by the famous Auto Delta group in Milan. If the car is ready for today's meeting Edward Labinjoh will drive it.

The main interest today will be, however, the cliff hanging finish to the Callands Trophy Formula Libre Championship in Scotland. Dramatically at the last meeting Richard Scott from Aberdeen took his Lotus 41 into first place in the 40 lap main race and so took a slender one point lead from Willie Forbes (Lotus B.M.W.). Forbes has the advantage today of being able to add any of his points scored directly to his total whereas Scott has already scored points in four events so can only add to his figures if he is in the leading positions. With two heats today each driver can score two starting points plus his placing points and so it will be a thrilling finish for the Championship. If ever anyone deserved the Championship it is Willie Forbes who has been so close in the past and he will be keeping his fingers crossed. Indeed the whole Forbes family is interested in the outcome for at the last meeting Willie's father telephoned the circuit every half hour to keep track of his son's progress; let's hope that today his patience is rewarded. One thing is for sure and that is the Championship will go to an Aberdonian!

Last year's Champion, Andrew Fletcher, has had cruel luck this year with his Chris Steele engine and its sundry components and no doubt he will be out to right all these wrongs at today's meeting.

Probably the most interesting cars running in the Formula Libre races are the two works Vixen Formula 4 cars for since being fitted with Hillman Imp engines and the blessing of Alan Fraser, the man who made the Imps go so well in saloon car racing, these cars have been surprising many people. Ingliston should be well suited to them and their works drivers Bernard Unett—a development engineer with Rootes incidentally—and Keith Norman should be worth watching, particularly as they compete with the two Imp-engined Ecurie Ecosse cars which have been strengthened up in the suspension department

with Cooper bits since the last meeting they raced here.

The saloon car events should be filled with the usual amount of excitement and what with the cars' antics on the new circuit at the last meeting we could well see some surprises. Added to the usual brew of Logan Morrison (Singer Chamois), Jim Dryden (Mini-Cooper), Bill Borrowman in the Moir & Baxter Sportstune Mini-Coopers, and Graham Birrell in the Perdal-Escort entered by Wyllies there is John Handley with his Mini-Cooper, the Don Moore tuned car. Handley holds the lap record on the new circuit for saloon cars and he will be hard pushed this meeting. Amongst the newcomers to the circuit are Ken Costello, the 1967 Redex 1300cc saloon champion with his Crippspeed Mini. Ken will also drive the local Thistle Mini prepared by Thistle Tune. Last year the sensation at this meeting was the driving of Alec Poole and we welcome him back in a fuel-injected Mini-Cooper S.

An interesting entry is that of the Italian driver Paolo Giannini who has driven for the Abarth concern but is entered in a 5.3 litre Chevrolet engined Ford Anglia which must have the General Motors executives spinning round and round; a GM engine in a Ford! Giannini will have good company, however, as Roy Pierpoint, who thrilled everyone last October, is bringing along his 4.7 litre Ford Falcon once again. This car is quite a handful at Ingliston but Pierpoint knows what he is doing and drives it brilliantly. He is one of the few people to have spun his way through the Esses without hitting anything; a record of

which he is not proud but possibly thankful.

It will also be interesting to see how Ronnie Morrison's Mini-Cooper is developing as his experiments into fitting an aerofoil wing to his car were quite precise and he hopes to have a modified version at this meeting where he can check the degree of downward pressure

from the driving seat.

The G.T. race should also be something of a whizz-bang as in addition to sixth round of the John Nicholson (Jaynick G.T.) and George Silverwood (Mercury G.T.) battle there is the arrival of not one but two of the beautifully prepared Gold Leaf Team Lotus Lotus 47's to be driven by John Miles and Tim Schenken. Schenken is the Australian who has had a brilliant season in Formula Ford and Formula III and who is certainly one of the up and coming drivers and seems set on a possible Formula II career in 1969. Schenken was at Ingliston in his ageing FIII Brabham last year but it will be interesting to see his performance in a competitive car on this tricky track. John Blades will have his FVA-Ford engined Chevron and, both John Lepp and Geoff Breakell in their Chevron-BMW's. In the same race, Breakell, by the way, will also be driving Tommy Clapham's 1600cc Alfa-Romeo in the Saloon car race and remembers the speed at which Clapham got round the track on his last visit with an Alfa-Romeo. Lepp won the Special G.T. Race at the S.M.T. Trophy Meeting in July. In the G.T. race John Milne (M.G. Midget) will renew his duel with Arnle Poole (M.G. Midget) the well known Irish driver whilst Ernie Blackadder from Falkirk makes a welcome return with a Lotus Elan and Mini-Cooper S.

Then there is the Formula Ford race which looks like being a crowning point to the season. At this stage in proceedings Harry Gilbert the Aberdeen hotel man is not only leading in the Kings Trophy for Formula Ford in Scotland but in the National Lotus FF Championship. This meeting is a further counter in the Lotus Championship so Harry's leading rivals are coming up from England to compete. Bob Eilice came to the first meeting at Ingliston this year and bent the car in practice but he has come back looking for revenge and the man in third place in the Lotus FF Championship, Tony Roberts is also taking part. Add to this Brian "Initials" Smith with his brand-new Royale built by Racing Preparations from London. Phil Kimberley and Dave Walker in their Russell-Alexis cars and Dick Barker with a Lotus 51 it should be quite a race. The local Scots are well represented too with Brian Squires, Tom Walkinshaw, Jeff Schonberg and Ted Clark with their Lotus 51's and Gerry Birrell in the Centro-Scot Lotus-based car.

Racing today should be amongst the best ever seen at Ingliston and for the visitors let's hope the weather stays dry.

#### \* \* \*

Special attraction at today's meeting is the flying display by a single Lightning fighter from the R.A.F. Station at Leuchars. It will zoom across the skies above you around 2.10 p.m. this afternoon just prior to the first race of the day.

#### \* \* \*

The new lap records set at the last meeting are interesting as the new extension has slowed down the general lap speeds but once the competitors are used to the corners the times should begin to tumble. Outright fastest is Willie Forbes with his Lotus-BMW in 52.4 seconds.

#### \* \* \*

Logan Morrison and John Nicholson will be out to set the heather afire as the B.M.R.C. Trophy, for S.M.R.C. Members is likely to be decided between at this meeting. Both will be up against stiffer opposition in their respective races.

As this is the last meeting of the season we hope you will join us in giving a big hand to the various marshals and officials who have waved flags at competitors, checked your tickets and generally kept everything in running order. They do their job of work no matter what the conditions and some of the weather we have had has been foul to say the least.

#### \* \* \*

It is also opportune for us to thank the various members of the press who have come along faithfully to the meetings and reported on the events. By their interest you are kept informed and we hope that they will continue to support racing here at Ingliston; the circuit where you get all the action.

#### \* \* \*

Eagle-eyed Ingliston veterans will immediately notice one basic difference about today's programme. There are more accepted entries for each race. This is the first meeting at which the R.A.C.'s new ruling will allow fifteen cars on the grid at Ingliston. With the track lengthened there should be room for all although it will undoubtedly be a mad scramble for Bankers' on the first lap of each race. Just who will make the grade in each event is guestionable but Ingliston

regulars like Willie Forbes, Logan Morrison, John Nicholson and Harry Gilbert will be hard to beat. If Roy Pierpoint makes it in Event 5 he could well provide some real excitement for it won't be so easy for the hordes of Mini-Coopers to get past him once ahead!



One interesting point became apparent at the Edinburgh Festival Meeting and that was just how much one could see of the new extension from the main grandstand: in particular from the Eastern Blocks of the stand—D, E and the East Wing. We are sorry the new spectator area is not yet in being, but we doubt whether the grandstand ticketholders will be so sorry for its existence will bring matters back to what they were before.



If you are a newcomer to Ingliston, you should first look at the map on page 24. Doubtless you will feel in need of some refreshment during the day, and there are snack bars in the Herdsman's Restaurant to the North of the main grandstand, on the ground floor of the MacRobert Pavilion in the Central Enclosure, in the East Gate Courtyard and in the area between Gardeners' and Shepherds' Corners. Here you can find snacks served throughout the day but if you wish a full meal this is available to the general public in the Herdsman's Restaurant, to officials in a hurry in the hut behind the MacRobert Pavilian, and to members of the Scottish Motor Racing Club in the beautiful MacRobert Pavilion in the central enclosure. Members should remember that the Club has also a Licensed Bar open during normal opening hours (Scottish licensing hours prohibit special licences on Sundays!) from 12.30 to 2.30 and from 6.30 to 9.30. High teas are served from 5.30 p.m, Lunches cost about 8/6 in the Herdman's and 10/- in the MacRobert. Finally, the Scottish Milk Marketing Board sell milk drinks of all types in their Milk Bar at the East end of the Grandstand.



You may be surprised to know that something like 400 voluntary officials are required to run a race meeting at Ingliston. Without their assistance there just would not be any racing and we would ask you to co-operate with them so as to ensure the enjoyment of every person, whether they be spectator, competitor or official. Your safety depends on them and we do ask you not to jeopardise theirs' or others by disregarding their instructions.

Many racegoers are enthusiastic photographers or cine-photographers and it could be that you will run out of film if it is a sunny day with the usual amount of excitement. Reg Forester-Smith will be pleased to sell you photographic goods from his shop behind the Highland Grandstand. He also takes photographs at every meeting and you may wish to purchase photographs of your favourite drivers or cars.

There is always a fascination for motor accessories and a demand for the necessities of racing — goggles, racing overalls, stopwatches, etc. These can be obtained from Graham Birrell's mobile shop just opposite the Forester-Smith shop behind the grandstand.

Quite a lot of activity happens throughout the day and some of this may seem strange to the newcomer. All motor sport in Britain is strictly controlled by the Motor Sport Division of the R.A.C. and the controls are aimed at making the sport just as safe as is possible. Responsible for making sure that the meeting runs to schedule and runs according to the regulations is the Clerk of Course, whom you will see driving round the circuit between races in a car carrying a white flag, checking that everything is in order for the next event.. His "nerve-centre" is the Race Control Building in the Central Enclosure (the rather splendid glass box below the clock-mast), where he keeps in touch by telephone throughout the day with all the points around the circuit. The track is divided into sectors, each under the control of an Observer, and each equipped with a telephone. The observer has with him a number of different marshals; some of these are responsible for keeping the track clear for racing and for undertaking rescue operations in the event of an accident, others for signalling to drivers by means of recognised flags to warn them of dangers or let them know that a car behind wishes to overtake. The Yellow Flag is used as a warning in the event of an incident ahead; the yellow and red striped flag indicates the presence of oil on the circuit's surface; the blue flag is used to indicate-when held stationary-the presence of a car close behind, and when waved the fact that a car is attempting to overtake. If you are in the main grandstand you may also see a black flag displayed with a number on a board; this is a signal to the car bearing that number that he must return to the pits on his next lap and it usually indicates either a fault in the car which is visible to the observers but perhaps not apparent to the driver or that the driver has committed some infringement of regulations.

#### \* \* \*

You may wonder where to get grandstand seats. These are available—or at least all those which have not been sold in advance—from a kiosk immediately behind the Crossing Point to the Central Enclosure in the centre of the main grandstand, with the exception of those for the Shepherds' Grandstand, which are available from a kiosk in the East Gate Courtyard. Prices for all tickets are 10/-, except for those in the East Wing of the Highland Stand which are 5/-.

Programmes are available from three different kiosks. One at the Main North Gate, one behind the main grandstand and one in the East Gate Courtyard (where the Shepherds' Grandstand tickets are sold).

Racing at Ingliston has been made possible by the courtesy of the Royal Highland and Agricultural Society, whose wonderful Showground this is. Can we ask you to respect their property and refrain from climbing on buildings or scattering litter? Thank-you!

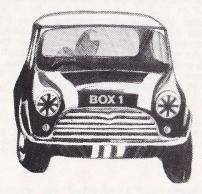

### Come for a drive

What is the new circuit like to drive on? At the Edinburgh Festival meeting the surface was very new-it was completed only three days before the event. Consequently it was very, very slippery as many drivers found to their cost. "Almost like driving on ball bearings" was one description but by mid-September things were much improved and a few fast laps proved most instructive. Driving a Lotus Elan+2 around the old circuit fast Shepherds always seemed the most difficult corner to master with its slightly downhill approach and the fact that it was slightly more acute than a 90° bend and this is probably why so many cars came adrift here. Now Shepherds is flat-out - a really vicious fast bend with a slight dip half-way through where the old circuit turned right. Doing about 5000 in 3rd here — 65 m.p.h.—accelerating hard to about 80 m.p.h. and quickly into top gear. What a revelation! Top gear at Ingliston! Wonder if I can hold it to the West Gate bend-marker before braking—Chicken!—down to 3rd, down to 2nd almost simultaneously, heel-and-toeing urgently, hold it in close to the inside verge and let it drift wide on the exit; one can't help but be surprised by its tightness but with the comparative ease with which it can be taken assisted by a generous cross-fall (super-elevation to the technical). There's a suspiciously large tree close to the outside verge as one straightens up, well-wrapped in tractor tyres to act as buffers for those unfortunate enough to contact it. Then up through 2nd to 3rd-doing about 65 or so here for a few yards before it's back again to 2nd and-boy oh boy !- this is a real man's corner, Ploughmans, It's a tight left-hander which goes on round and round but after a few laps it seems to get easier as one finds the thing to do is take it fairly "late" (as they say) correcting a bit of oversteer as one boots it in 2nd and clipping the verge on the outside (hope Robin Traill, the Chief Observer, wasn't looking!) and one's up into 3rd almost before one's straightened up, nicely placed for the left-handed Vets. Surprise, surprise, we're going almost as fast into this bend as we were on the old circuit but it's flat out and anchors hard on past the back of Race Control to line up for Merchants. This seems easier because we were better placed coming out of Vets but it's still a terror of bend until one discovers the secret is to start taking the corner much earlier than one would expect and hold close into the kerbing drifting across on the exit to the cobbles in front of the timekeepers' box. (Thinks: How does Graham Birrell or Logan Morrison get round this one alongside someone else?) Farmers' is flat out; don't need to brake for Bankers, just lift off momentarily to steady the car up and a quick flick left then right without touching the kerbs (imagine Gerald Storey, Chief Track Marshal, or Nigel Kennedy the Bankers Observer is watching) and one's just in time to line the car through Foresters-that's better, with the apex straightened out, for it's much easier to line up for Gardeners before braking on the patch across what used to be a bad bump and hurriedly select 2nd gear. Watch it for locking up the brakes and hold it as it drifts wide on opposite lock coming out of the bend and we're back on the top straight again.

That was great fun; more please! Incidentally, you, too, can enjoy the thrill of driving at Ingliston if you join the Scottish Motor Racing Club and come along to one of their Practice Days. Ten shillings and the loan of a crash helmet is all one needs for ten or fifteen laps of pure excitement. They tell me a subscription paid now will last for all next year. (There's a form on page 48).

When you consider the Mark VI Lightning weighs 16 tons, the weight of two double-decker buses, you can see that it produces tremendous horsepower and the 'planes armour includes Red Top missiles.

Flight Lieutenant Laughlin is 27 years of age and has two children, a girl of two and a boy of a year and before he joined the R.A.F. as a pilot of these jet interceptors he was a graduate engineer.

## LOTHIAN CHEMICAL CO. LTD TROPHY RACE

It may seem odd for a chemical company to be sponsoring this afternoons G.T. race—which looks like being a classic—but Lothian Chemical Co. Ltd., have many links with Ingliston.

The company was formed many years ago and during the first World War produced a valuable supply of T.N.T. and today they produce such things as Formaldehyde, Sodium Tungstate and Ferric Nitrate and engage in solvent recovery. The man behind the company is well known to everyone who comes to Ingliston, however, John Romanes.

John has been involved in motor sport since 1946 and is Managing Director of Lothian Chemical Co. Ltd., as well as being one of the leading lights behind the whole Ingliston project being Chairman of Scotcircuits and Chairman of the race organising committee. John has raced a variety of cars through the years; mostly Lotus but he did have a Brabham at one time. Today he has a Lotus-Climax and in addition to preparing everything for this meeting was working hard on his car to get it ready to race today. One of his fellow directors at Lothian Chemicals is Jim Brailsford who is also well known at Ingliston as he is involved as one of the senior observers on the circuit. Behind the scenes too are the members of the Lothian staff who have worked long and hard, mostly in their own time, on various special jobs. For instance they are responsible for repairs to the equipment and in recent weeks they were to be seen hard at work fabricating the solid metal posts which hold the sections of barrier on the new stretch of the circuit. All this was done in their spare time so everyone in the company has had some say in the running or handling of Ingliston.

Whenever there is an incident on the track involving oil, such as when Willie Forbes broke his gearbox and spilled oil on the circuit, out came the marshals' spreading machines which contain a chemical called Keiselghur which is produced by Lothian Chemical Co. to absorb the oil completely and literally soak it out of the track.

So our G.T. race sponsors at this meeting may appear to have little connection with Ingliston but in fact are an integral part of the meeting. 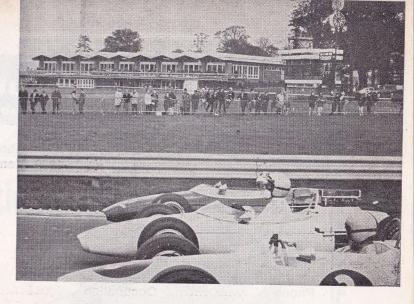
